Council hears golf course annex request

The Friona city council met in regular session Monday October 7. Mayor Rick White presided and all council members were present, as were city manager Patricia Phipps and city attorney Slater Elza. About 15 citizens attended the meeting.

Council approved previous minutes and approved the Friona Star as the official newspaper for the city. Loraine Anthony and Mitchell Wiseman were appointed to represent the city on the Parmer County Appraisal District board.

Police Chief Frank Mooney reported that a local recruit had been hired to attend the police academy for certification and will attend the academy and assist with dispatch and other duties in the department until being certified as an officer by next August. He

said there is also an opening for a dispatcher. The grant funding for a school resource officer has been approved. The city and Friona ISD will share the cost of the officer that will be assigned to work in the school campuses.

Chief Mooney suggested that a carport awning be built onto the west side of the police department to protect patrol units in event of hail storms. During the last hail storm, police vehicles sustained almost \$30,000 in damages and were out of service during repairs. Police will be stepping up patrol activity on Halloween and will participate with schools during Red Ribbon Week October 21-25.

The council approved accounts payable and financial statements for September and the third quarter.

They approved a carport variance at 510 W. 5th, and held off on a request from the Arellano family to annex their home on CR19 to the city for more information. A request to install a mobile home on East 3rd Street was delayed again until next meeting awaiting approval of neighbors in the area.

Jerry Marquez and Ricky Cantu appeared before the council to request that the city annex the 80 acres that is the Friona Golf Course into the city. Golf club owner Dee King was also present. Mr. Marquez and Mr. Cantu said they planned to close the golf course and develop the property with modular homes.

City attorney Slater Elza advised Mr. Marquez and Mr. Cantu that only a property owner can request annexation into the city

limits. Mr. Elza asked if they planned to rent or sell the modular homes and they said they planned to sell lots/homes. The two gentlemen said they were already working with an architect on plans for the property and would like to begin within the next 60-90 days.

Mr. King stated he was given the property by the golf club's board but had put a lot of money into the property and operation of the golf course over the past three years. It was not clear if sale of the property to Mr. Marquez and Mr. Cantu depended on whether

the city agreed to the annexation. No action was taken on the request.

Cargill has hired Global Environmental and Technical Foundation from Arlington, Virginia to conduct a future water availability survey in Friona and the surrounding area. The council voted to pay \$4,000 toward the cost of the survey. Mayor Rick White and councilman Charlie Pope, both Cargill employees, abstained from voting on the issue.

Before adjournment, councilman Charlie Pope advised the council that he planned to resign his coun-

cil seat. The council said they would solicit applications from anyone interested in filling Mr. Pope's council seat. The council can appoint a replacement to serve until the May 2014 election. The seat will then be up for election in May 2014 to fill the one-year unexpired term of Mr. Pope.

Since the second Monday of November is Veteran's Day holiday, the council voted to hold the November meeting on Monday, November 4 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers, 619 Main St. All council meetings are open to the public.

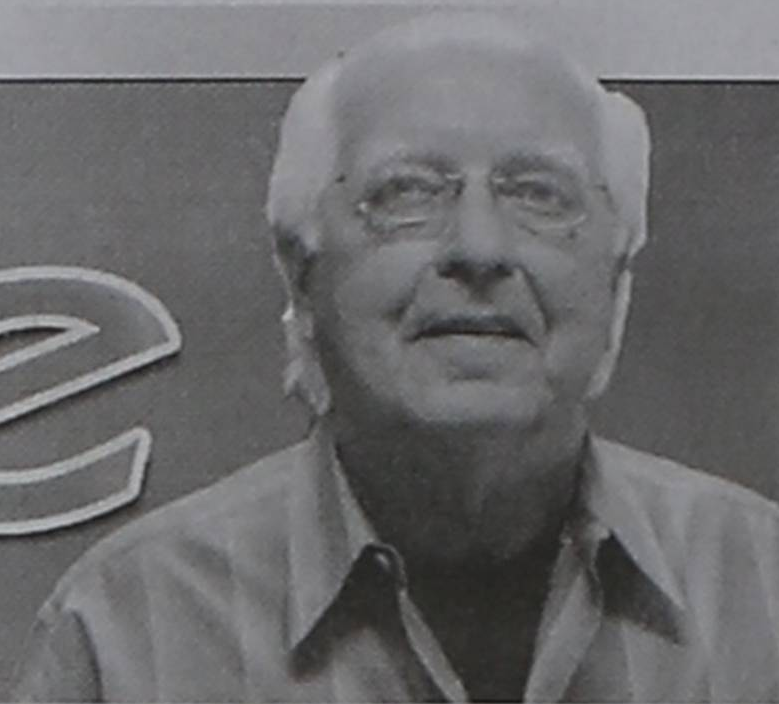

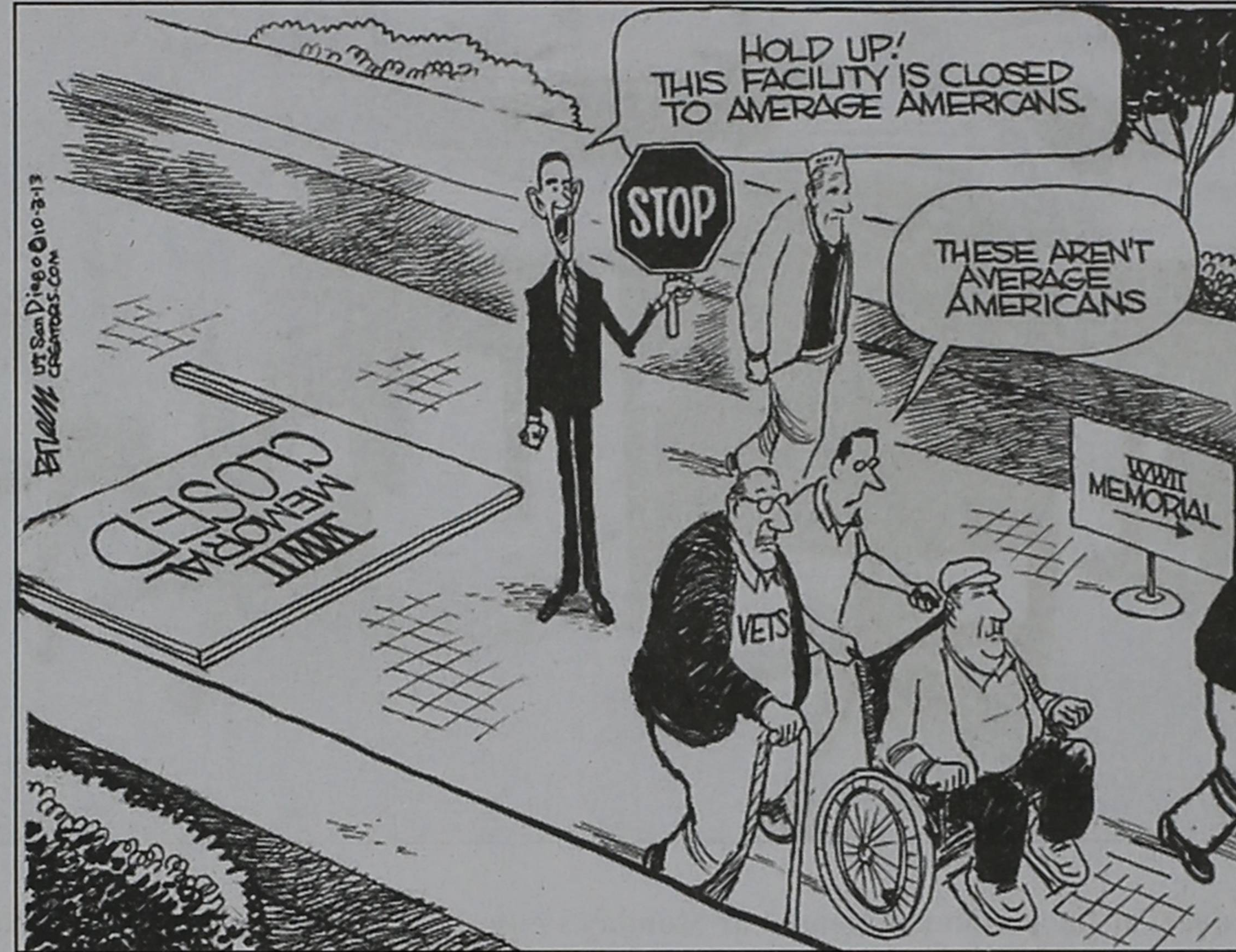
chelle's home the "Spite House."

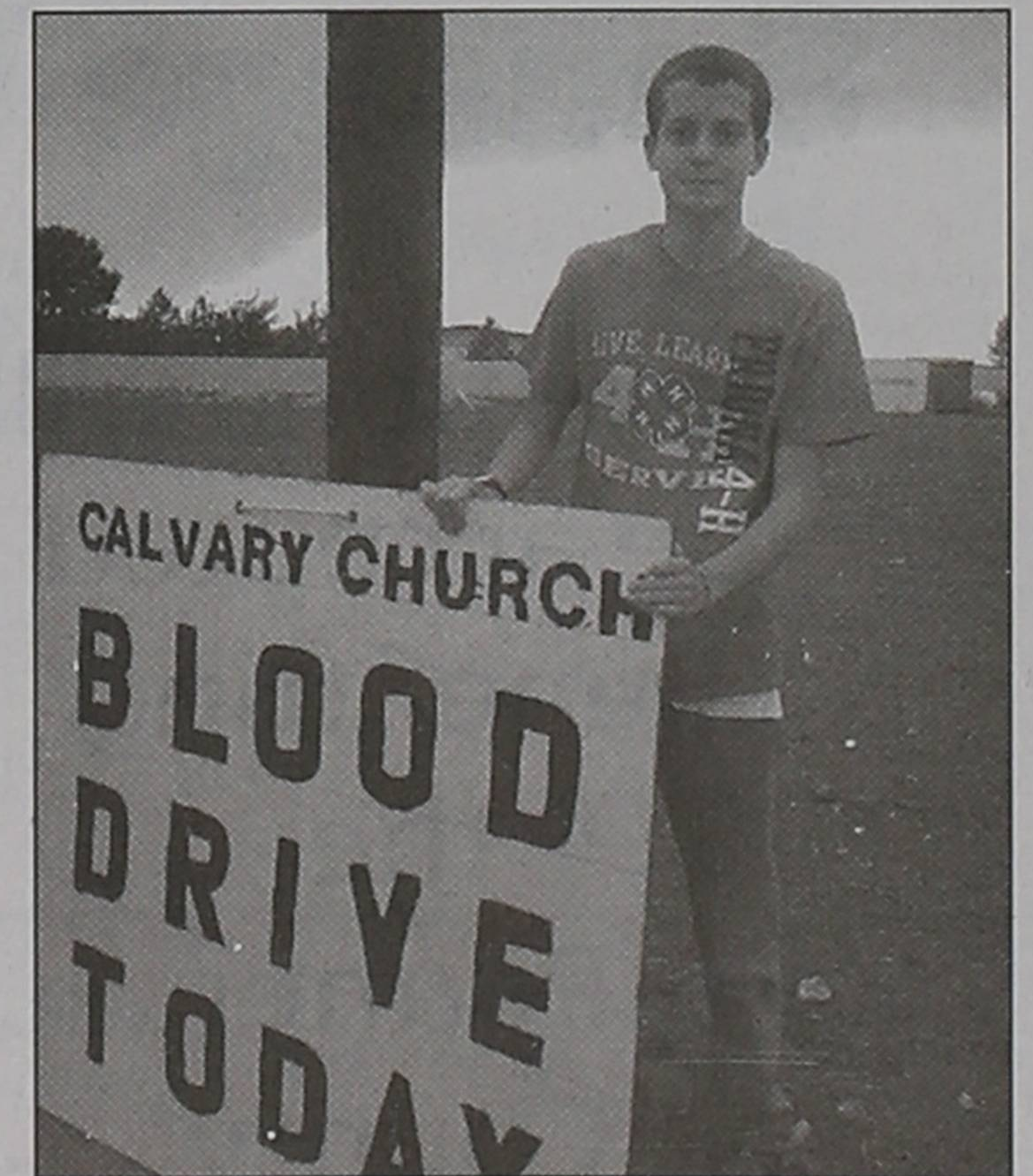

Imagine if you will a beautiful fall afternoon. The leaves are still green, the birds still sing and life is pretty much normal other than the cooler nights. Depending which side of the fence you may be on, you may look forward to the frost if this time of year brings out the best in your allergies.

On the other hand, if you have cotton and need just another week you probably could do without a frost for a while. The one thing for certain when it comes life changes. I am not talking about a cool evening at 32 degrees. I am talking about a hard freeze. The one that makes nature change its course. After one of these types of frosts everything looks as though it has been sucker punched in the stomach. The leaves begin to drop from the trees, the last bits of the garden are gone, and the grass turns yellow as if dead. What does the frost do for nature? It prepares it for winter.

There are times we have events come about in our lives that are like a killing frost. Life is changed. We feel sucker punched in the stomach. Wilted and losing our leaves as if we were dying. Now whatever the event may be, you cannot just simply block it out. You must face it. Think of a tree as it is hit with a frost. On the outside the leaves fall off, branches become bare and even the birds don't particularly care to roost in it unprotected. What is happening on the inside? Here is the point: whatever knocks your leaves off, do not worry, focus on your root system. Deeply root your faith in sound doctrine, so that when spring comes you will have a better foundation to support your new growth. Every year there is a frost, every year someone's life encounters a life-changing event, the outcome depends upon what you do on the inside.

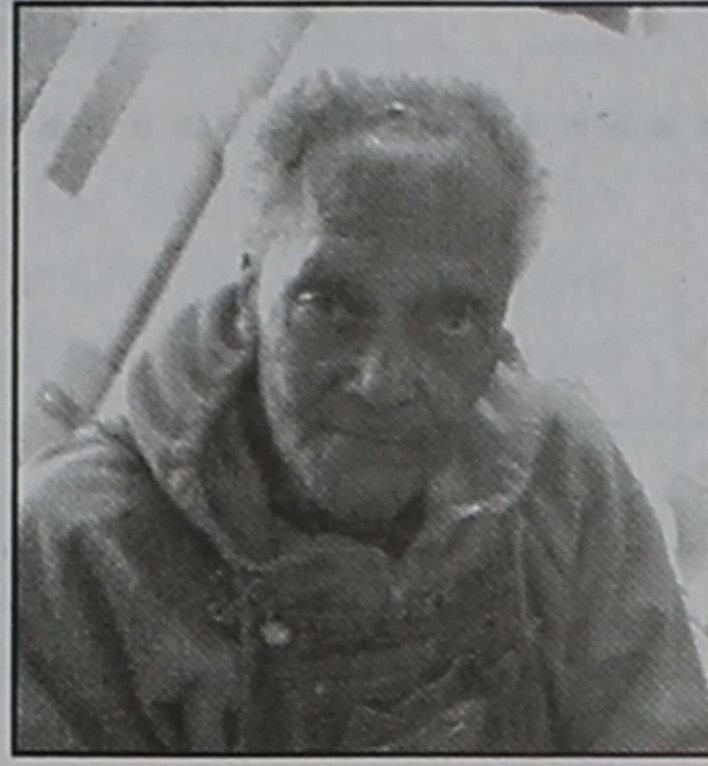

BRETT HOYLE, Pastor, First Baptist Church

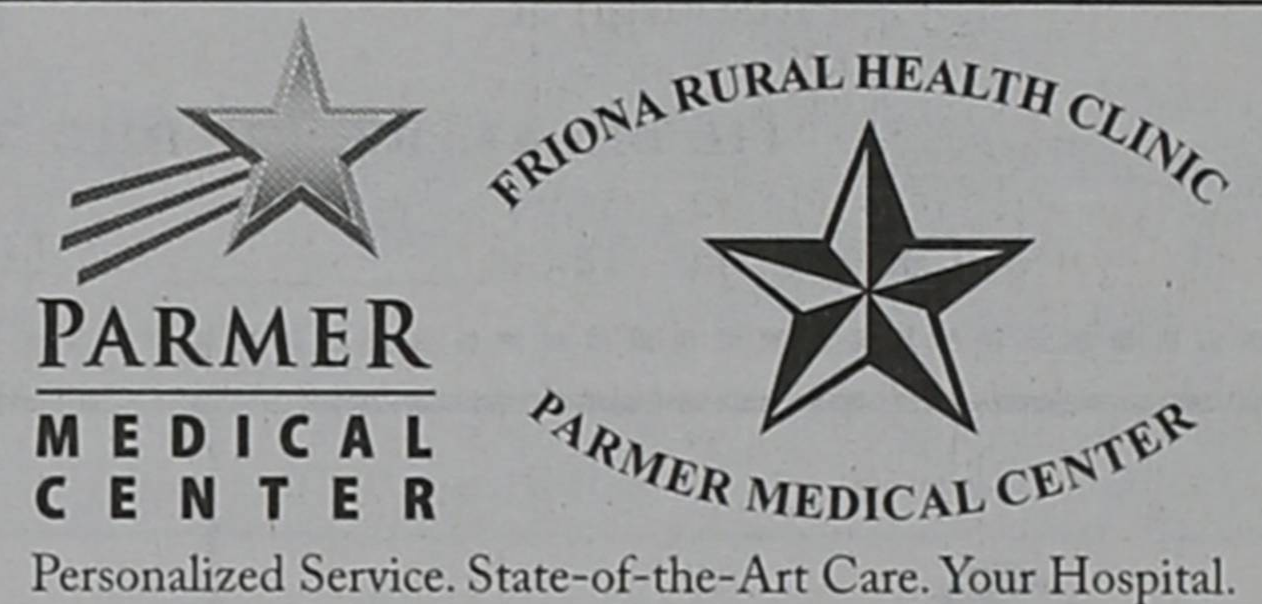

What is Tabata?

by Melanie Gallman Braun

A) a type of relaxing massage; B) an ancient martial art; C) an energy drink; or D) a type of high intensity interval training?

Yes, Tabata is a type of high intensity interval training. After a Tabata workout you will feel like you got "karate-ed" and will want to top it off with a massage and an energy drink! No, not really. It is an intense, sweaty workout, but the good news is it typically lasts only 20 minutes. A great workout to do when you are pressed for time.

Dr. Izumi Tabata developed the training method, and his research showed that short bursts of high intensity training had superior aerobic and anaerobic training effects compared to longer moderate intensity training. So with Tabata training, you can get the same amount of work done in 20 minutes as compared to 60 minutes of moderate intensity training. But, fair warning, Tabata "feels" harder because you are going all out during each exercise interval.

Here's how it works. You perform a particular exercise(s) at high intensity for 20 seconds followed by 10 seconds of rest. This is repeated 8 times for a total training time of 4 minutes. You can perform the same exercise for each of the eight 20-second intervals or you can do series of different exercises to create a 4-minute circuit type of workout. That 4-minute circuit equals one "Tabata" or Round." Typically, four "Rounds" are recommended with one minute of rest time in between each set for a total of a 20-minute workout.

Uh? I don't get it, Melanie... Ok, it's easier to explain with an example. This is an example of a circuit type Tabata workout:

Round 1

High Knees for 20 secs/Rest for 10 secs
Jump Squats for 20 secs/Rest for 10 secs
 Repeat 4 times. Rest one minute before moving to Round 2.

Round 2

Biceps Curls for 20 sec/Rest for 10 secs
Triceps Dips for 20 secs/Rest for 10 secs
 Repeat 4 times. Rest one minute before moving to Round 3.

Round 3

Squats for 20 secs/Rest for 10 secs
Burpees for 20 sec/Rest for 10 secs
 Repeat 4 times. Rest one minute before moving to Round 4.

Round 4

Plank-hold for 20 secs/Rest for 10 secs
Jump Rope for 20 secs/Rest for 10 secs
 Repeat 4 times.

The cool thing about Tabata is you can use any kind of exercise whether it is strength training (with or without weights), cardio (any kind from walking to jump rope) or a combo of the two. You design your workout with your goals in mind. Just remember that during those 20 seconds you are going as hard as you can. ALWAYS, ALWAYS consult with your physician before beginning an exercise program. If you feel faint, dizzy, have pain or are short of breath, STOP.

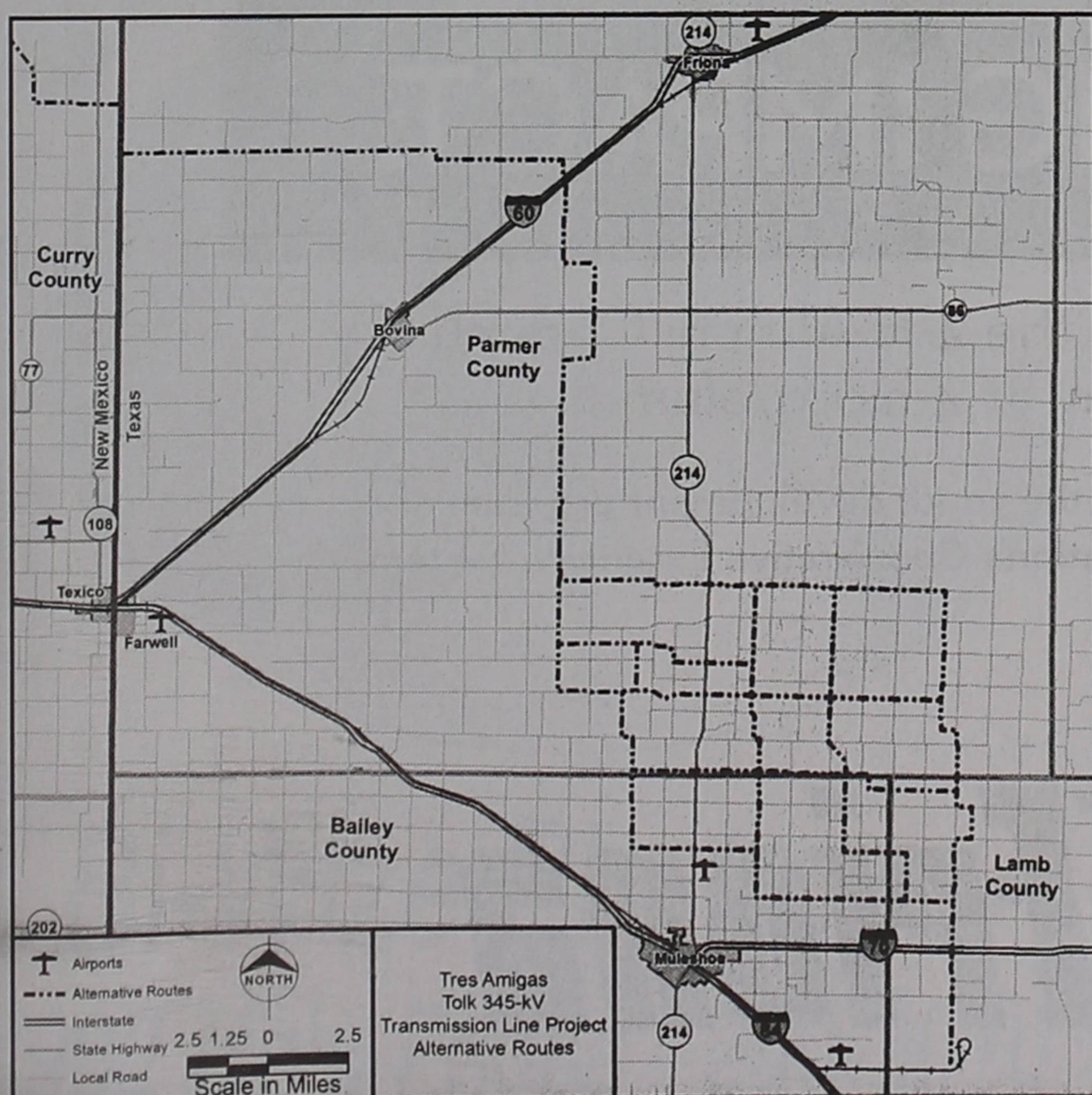





to play Hobbs JV. They fought hard and had a lead in the third and deciding game but could not pull out the victory.

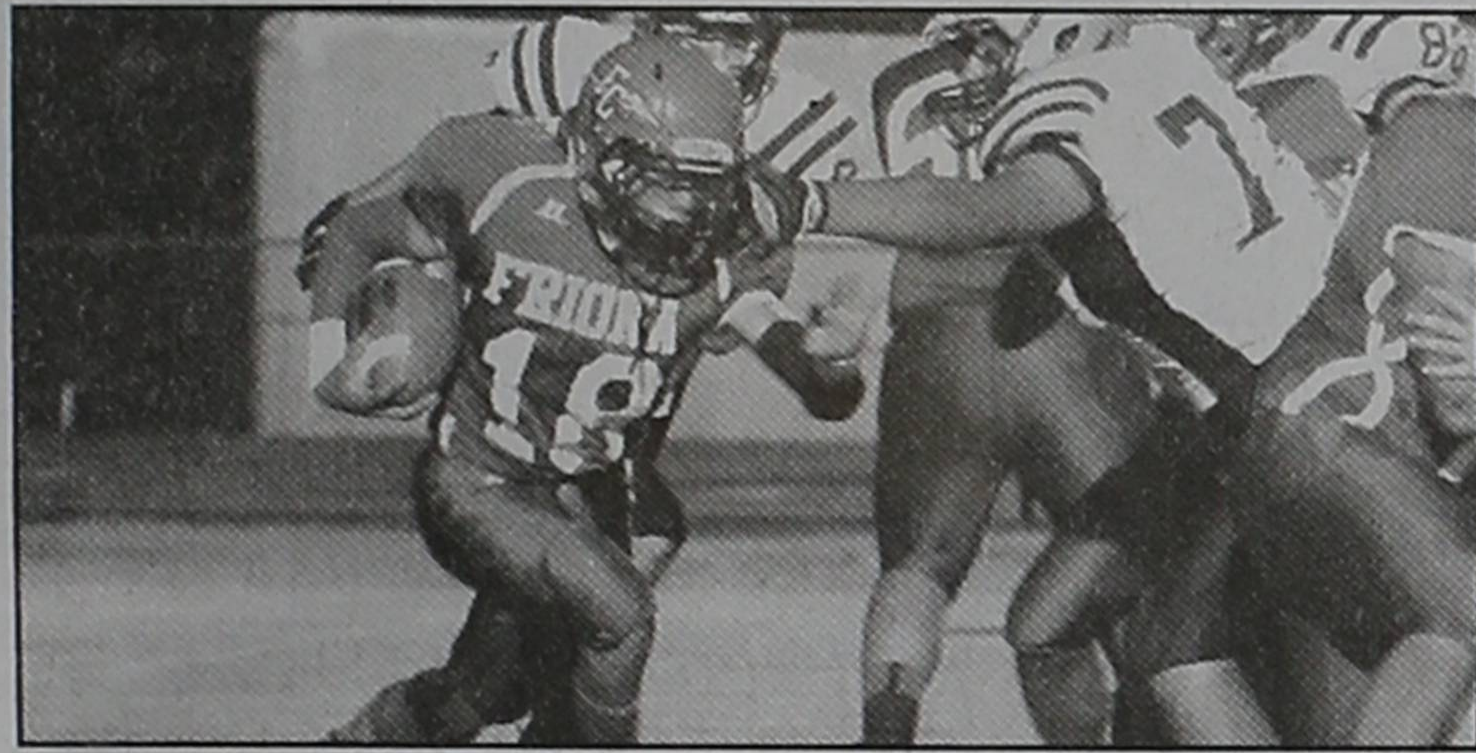

The varsity girls wasted little time in getting started with a victory in a three game sweep of Olton. The team started off the district season right and just need to keep playing their game.

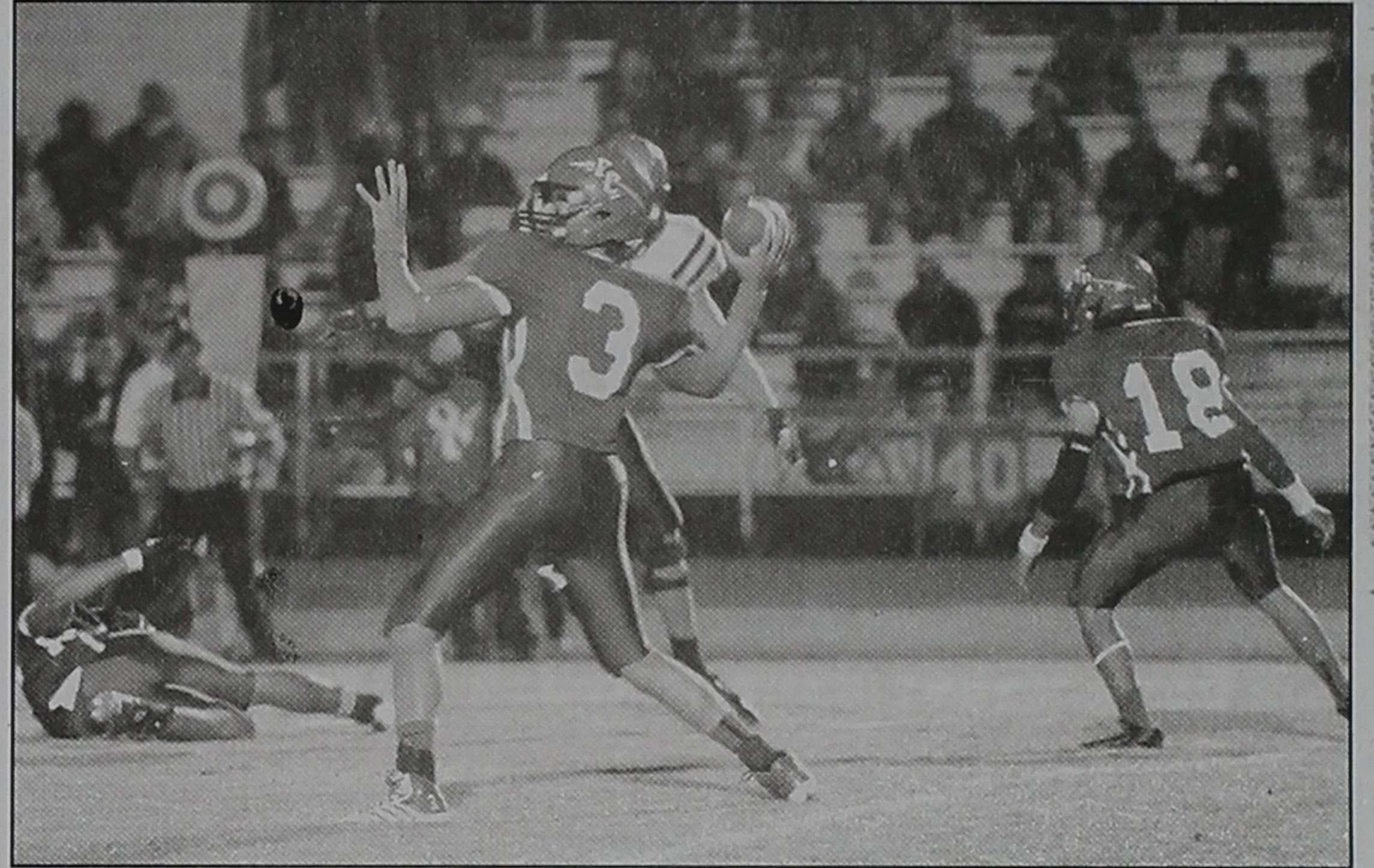

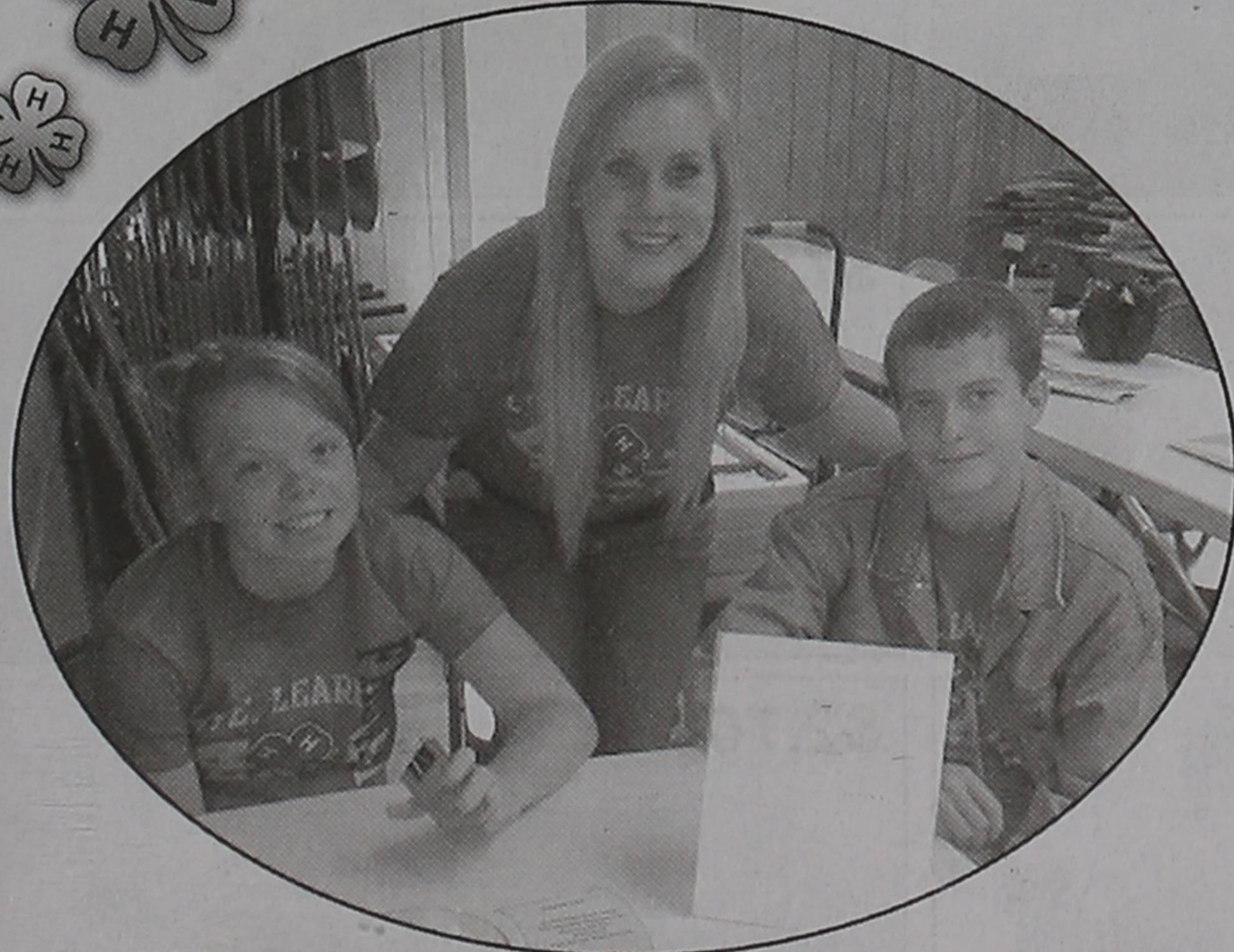
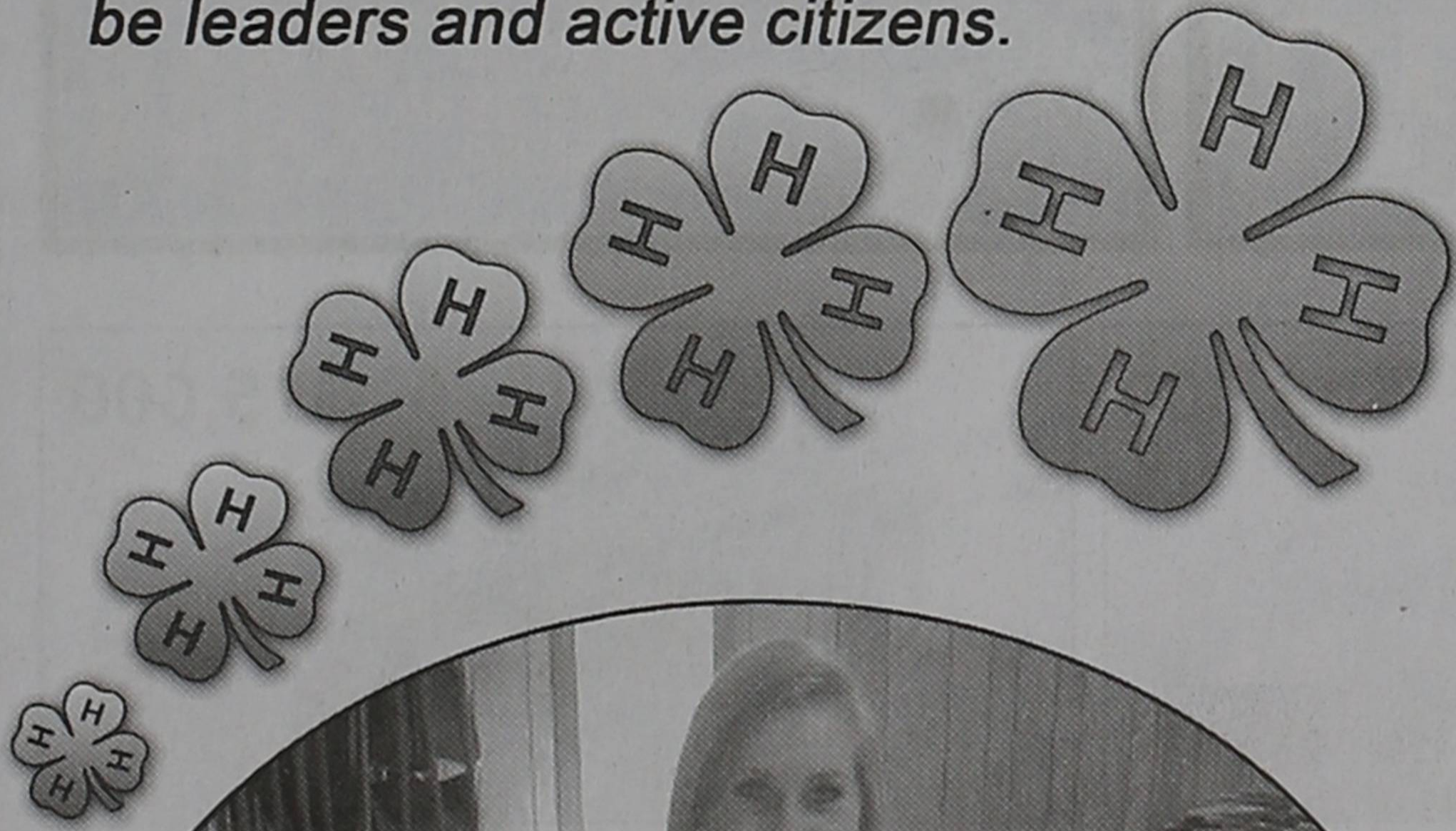
