During 2013 with the United Way funds we were able to help eleven families in need of gap funds, either families were over income for a service and/or the service could not be located in the community, and we were able to provide those services. Of the families assisted, seven were assisted with utilities and four were assisted with rent. Only two families received funding twice during the year.

While PCS will continue to provide emergency assistance to families for rent, reconnectin of utilities, medication and food, priority in 2014 will be placed on assisting families with work related expenses. These will include small car repairs, gas for employment, uniforms, licenses, permits and any other needs that will help the family obtain an maintain employment. The Friona United Way funds will be used for families or individuals that are referred to PCS or who are currently clients that have no other resources available. We encourage our communities to support the Friona United Way so we can make a difference." Mary Twitty
