## Publications: Livestock impact on the aquifer

Three publications analyzing the water use of the livestock industry in the southern Ogallala Aquifer region ave been completed by Texas A\&M AgriL
Water use in the Southern Ogallala Region has greatly exceeded the recharge rate for the past several deades, leading to a steady decline in he aquifer, said Dr. Steve Amosson, Regents Fellow and AgriLife Extenion economist in Amarillo.
This decline and water use in the ag ricultural sector had many stakeholders questioning whether the economic
benefits to the regional economy justified the agricultural economy justi use, Amosson said
"Our studies of
in the region are outlivestock sector publications covering beef, swine and
dairy," he said. "Our findings indicate the direct water use - consumption and cleaning - of these industries have minimal impact on regional water re sources, but the indirect water use via the feed consumed is or can be sub antial.
"On the other hand, these industrie are providing billions of dollars of economic activity and tens of thousands of employment opportunities in he region," Amosson said.
The objectives of the study, support ed by the federally funded Ogallala Aquifer Program, is to evaluate the impacts the various agricultural sec ors are having on the Ogallala Aqui-
fer, both in water use and economi impact, he said.

Dest is to walk do one mile as fast as you can. Ideally it is done goulside the indoor facility is fine; too, you just have to know how many laps make a mile). The treadmill is ok, but it may skew the results a little because the belt keeps you at a constant speed-it doesn't adjust to your natural inclination to speed up and slow down. If you haven't been active in a while (routinely exercising or walking 15-20 minutes several times a week) or are under a doctor's care, get an ok before doing the test. Are you satisfied with your score? Surprised? Wanting a do-over If you aren't where you want to be, no worries! You can easily get there. It won't happen in a week, but if you choose a cardio program and stick with it, you II be surprised at how quickly you can progress. Yeah, he stick-win-it part is ne most challenging and . Walking jog ping, running, aerobics, biking, spinning, elliptical work-any activity that involves the large muscles of your body moving rhythmically and elevates your heart rate counts as cardio. If you choose something you elevates your heart rate counts as cardio. If you chiose some. ling you in at least 30 minutes a day three times a week and optimally, on most days of the week.
If you are just starting out, go slow and work up. Three ten minute sessions give you about the same benefits as one 30 -minute session. Not sure what to do? Feel free to give me a call-I can help you get started. Sometimes all you need is to ask a few questions and to get some suggestions.

Around sixth grade, I lived at 911 Cleveland across from the Jr. High. The kids in our neighborhood loved to ride bikes together and with the miles of concrete just across the street we rode and rode hard. On one occasion (before there was a lot of grass) we found that if you got enough speed you could jump off the sidewalk at the oversized motorcycle helmets we set out to clear the Snake River unlike Evel Knevel.
