are weaker and smaller today than ever before. But what's the use of dwelling on the possibility of their complete disappearance? That is the future. If we confine our attention to the present we shall find conditions bad enough.

"All you have to do is to go and walk on Fifth avenue if you have any doubts as to the way women maltreat their feet—and the results. Any woman knows the shape of her unconfined foot. What a difference there is between that and the expensively shod result tripping down the avenue! But one need not confine oneself to the fashionable quarter of the city. Go to a public bath-house and see if you can find one perfect, undistorted pair of feet. If you are lucky, you may find one pair; I am sure you will not discover more."

"Do you think woman should go barefoot?" was suggested. "Or wear sandals?"

"Neither violent innovation is at all necessary," the doctor protested, rather impatiently. "Who would think of going barefoot on our snowy sidewalks? Absurd! But why should not women wear shoes exactly like those worn by men?"

"A woman's foot and a man's foot are exactly the same shape, unless, indeed, the woman's has been artificially deformed. The only difference is that a man's foot, like the rest of him, is on a larger scale. But he wears sensible, and well shaped shoes, with heels high enough to give a proper support to the arch and low enough not to destroy balance."

"A woman's shoe should be modeled on the same plan. Instead of curving aimlessly and arbitrarily, as they do, I want to make this clear—a woman who refuses to buy shoes too small for her is yet likely to deform her feet, because nearly every model offered her is utterly wrong in shape."

"Flat foot, the painful deformity which is so rapidly increasing among us, is made worse, if it is not originally caused by improper shoes. The broken arches, instead of being supported, are thrust still further out of position. Women's shoes are simply impossible."

And yet the head of a big shoe store rebels against the medical verdict. This man carries in his stock both expensive and low priced footwear. That is to say that both wealthy women and working women are his customers.

"Every one connected with the shoe business knows that women's feet are growing larger," he declared. Fifteen years ago the size of which we sold the most was No. 3. Today it is No. 5. That is, the average woman's foot is full two sizes larger than it was formerly."

"One reason for this change is the fact that women have gone into

business. The woman who is on her feet all day behind the counter or in the factory must be comfortably shod. And she cannot wear the old worn out slippers by means of which the houseworker used to comfort her aching feet. The business woman must wear neat, new shoes, but they must also be comfortable.

"The well to do woman has taken up sensible shoes for still another reason. She cannot go in for athletics wearing narrow-toed boots a size too small for her. She cannot play golf or tennis, she cannot even go for a long walk if her feet are cramped and pinched. So she makes a virtue of necessity, and the broad, button-toed shoe becomes the latest fashion."

Of course, too, if a woman is on her feet a good deal they are apt to spread. If she continues to buy shoes which fit she must choose a larger size, or at least a broader model.

"While we are not yet selling sandals for a general wear—they would be rather impractical in this climate during the winter—the shoe of today is modeled more and more closely on the lines of natural foot." —New York World.

Crowds Jeered Couple.
Carrollton, Ill., Aug. 19.—Handcuffed together, Wm. Burley, a mechanic, and Mrs. Wm. Evans, another man's wife, with whom he eloped, were paraded through the main street last night while jeering crowds looked on. The line of march led from the railroad station to the Green county jail. Burley is 53 and the woman is 27.

Like captives chained to a Roman chariot, the pair marched through a double file of men and women, their humiliation being all the greater because they were personally acquainted with most of the on-lookers. The couple were brought from Lynn, Mo., a little town opposite Grafton.

Burley is still in jail. The money has not been recovered.

Is Human Race to Become Toeless?

Are we going to lose our toes?

That's what they said at the Chiropractors' convention out in Chicago. Dr. Ernest Graf of New York voiced the alarm over the wearing of tight shoes, and declared that if women did not change their footgear the sex would some day be toeless. Dr. I. J. Reis, vice president of the Illinois Association of Chiropractors, asserted that shoes are responsible for the bad condition of most women's feet. "The pump is the worst," he added. "The woman is balanced on her toes' ends, and her toes are all cramped up like little dogs in a basket." And some body else made the startling assertion that 98 per cent of American women are affected with various ills of the feet through wearing shoes that are too small.

All of which sounds exceedingly dismal. And unfortunately it is confirmed on solid local authority. The Chicago dispatch was shown to one of the most eminent surgeons connected with the Orthopedic department at the New York Hospital for the Ruptured and Crippled. This gentleman, who did not wish his name to be used, nevertheless based his statements on a wide professional knowledge and experience. He declared:

"Practically all the women in New York have deformed feet, and the only reason for their condition is the unnaturally shaped shoes which they wear."

"And do you really believe, therefore, that 98 per cent of American women are affected with various ills of the feet through wearing shoes that are too small?"
