New Buildings Now Going Up Will Cost Half a Million

Five hundred thousand dollars is a conservative estimate of the value of miscellaneous buildings now under course of construction here, including residences, factories and mercantile houses.
This sum may be divided as follows: \$200,000 in factories; \$250 in mercantile houses; \$60,000 Federal building; and the balance in residences, including the J. A. Kemp home costing about \$40,000 which is completed and will be occupied as soon as Mr. and Mrs. Kemp return from Colorado Springs. This leaves \$175,000 worth of miscellaneous residence structures of smaller size ranging in value from \$1000 to \$10,000. This list includes fifty-six cottages now being constructed near the factory addition, fifteen having just been completed, and not being figured in this estimate. The fifty-six mentioned are being built by Kemp and Kell, Marlow and Stone and Stampff and Roberts. One firm of architects who are designers of these cottages, Jones and Orloff, state that they have \$75,000 worth of other residence property either under construction or ready for ground breaking within the next two weeks. This leaves only \$44,000 for all other architects in the city combined and so the half million mark is extremely conservative.
The foregoing does not include \$150,000 worth of factory property and at least \$200,000 worth of residence property completed within the past four months. Indeed, a trip over the city makes it apparent judging by fresh paint in evidence, that a large part of the present Wichita Falls has been constructed since the beginning of the present year.
The factories referred to as being now under construction include the Wichita Glass Factory and the Texas Bottle Company plants, the one to employ 200 and the other 150 skilled

artisans, these two institutions alone increasing the city's population by hundreds of people. There is only one other glass factory in the entire State and no other bottle factory. A pottery plant employing some twenty skilled men is another institution just beginning to make its goods.
A moving picture film reproduction of the building activity here would hold its own with a film made in the cities of 100,000 anywhere in the country.
Wichita Falls is being built on a broad plan. The same citizenship that has brought her to her present splendid status is still exerting its energies to make the record even greater in the future than the wonders that have been chronicled during the past four or five years.
Two other railroads for this city are included in the greater Wichita Falls propaganda for the fall and coming year, and if they are not secured it will not be because of the lack of proper effort or cooperation on the part of the citizens here.
And the one best and biggest thing of all, the oil industry has not been touched in this treatise. The strikes at Iowa Park and Birkburnett combined with the earlier discoveries at Electra and Petrolia, all of these fields within a radius of twenty-five miles of this city in several different directions, make this city one of the biggest oil centers in the country with probably three hundred new derricks rearing their shining timbers above almost every section in the county.
Every big oil company operating in the South maintains headquarters here and the hotels nightly turn away the newest arrivals.
To inspect Wichita Falls at the present high tide of progress makes one feel glad that he resides in Wichita Falls and Wichita county.
