## Black Community school site for sale

Black Community school site at FM1172 and Highway 60 The FISD board recently held discussions related to the disposiion of the site. According to officials the structure is an eyesore and safety hazard and was the topic of a discussion by the

Representatives of Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF) rail oad have inquired about the possibility of purchasing the site, or an easement, to allow for the relocation of existing railroad signal controls at the grade crossing.
In researching the purchase, BNSF officials found the original documents at the county courthouse dated September 7, 1953 detailing the sale of the building and improvements. The building is located on approximately 4 acres and was sold to the Black

The document specified that "whenever such property shal cease to be used for religious or social community activities"
would revert to the grantor which was the Friona ISD. Schoo district officials said it appears the district now has the responsidistrict officials said it appears the district now has the responsi-
bility for the property. No final decisions have been made by the school board.
