OIL FIELD NEWS

Texas Gas Supply Washington, Dec. 6.—According to the latest report issued by the United States Geological Survey the event of chief interest in Texas in 1911 was the report on the natural gas industry.

The total production of gas in Texas in 1911 is estimated at 5,603,383,000 cubic feet, valued at \$1,014,945, the average price being 18.44 cents per thousand cubic feet.

Gas from wells in Shackelford county is being supplied to domestic and industrial consumers in the towns of Moran and Albany yet work in this county is still in the development stage.

Clint Wood & Company is erecting a derrick on the Walker & Horton farm, northwest of town, and east of the Eeds community, drilling to star soon.—Iowa Park Herald.

Everything is going nicely at the Joe Smith well, being drilled by the Gaffey Company. They are drilling at about 1000 feet and have had three small showings, one a few days ago.—Iowa Park Herald.

After a month's hard work of trying to raise the pipe at the Buffalo Oil Company well, on the Roberts farm, drilling has begun again at over 1000 feet.—Iowa Park Herald.

Land continues to be leased at good prices and being paid. Home Crites leased 120 acres to Fisher & Allen for \$25 per acre cash and \$10 additional out of oil developments.

Work has not yet started on Mr. Dale Brown's land, but will in a short time. The derrick, machinery, etc., is in Electric awaiting transportation.

MERIDIAN ROAD MAN WILL REACH SAN ANTONIO WED San Antonio, Dec. 6.—Secretary D. E. Colp of the Highway League of the Chamber of Commerce, has just completed the itinerary for the southern end of the John C. Nicholson automobile trip in the interest of the Meridian highway from Winnipeg to Mexico.

The Nicholson party will leave Fort Worth next Monday morning and arrive in San Antonio late Thursday afternoon, spending the night here. It was originally intended to reach this city Wednesday and meet with the San Antonio Automobile Club that night, but notice of a further change in the programme giving the party one day in Waco, was received by Secretary Colp yesterday.

The Nicholson party, accompanied by local good roads enthusiasts, will leave San Antonio Friday morning, December 13, at 8:30 o'clock. One car will be in charge of Secretary Colp and another will be furnished for the accommodation of Mr. Nicholson, his press agent and photographer.

LEAVES REVISION TO MR. WILSON

This country should not consent to grant independence at this time. If the task we have undertaken is higher than that assumed by other nations," continued the President, "its accomplishments must demand even more patience.

In addition to his opposition to pending measures, the President discussed the prosperity of the nation, its financial condition and the proposed system of a national budget showing proposed expenditures and revenues, and called attention to the balance in the general fund of the treasury, of almost \$170,000,000.

ORDINANCE NO. 178

An ordinance granting the Wichita Falls Traction Company, its successors, assigns, the right to construct and operate a standard gauge street car track in Ohio Avenue and Tenth Street in the City of Wichita Falls, Texas.

Section One. Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Wichita Falls, Texas, that the right and permission is hereby granted the Wichita Falls Traction Company, its successors, assigns, and lessees to enter upon Ohio Avenue at the point of intersection of the curve of the present street car tracks in Ohio Avenue and there construct and lay a standard gauge street car track on the curve in Ohio Avenue and Tenth Street, the proposed track to be constructed being shown in red ink upon the blue print hereto attached marked Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof.

Section Two. The right and permission is hereby further granted to the said Wichita Falls Traction Company, its successors, assigns, and lessees, to operate street cars upon said track so constructed and to use same as said Company now uses the street car tracks in the City of Wichita Falls, Texas.

Section Three. Be it further Ordained that this track, the permission to lay and construct which is hereby granted, be constructed under the same terms and conditions as the street car line in the City of Wichita Falls, Texas, was constructed and that the ordinance granting the Wichita Falls Traction Company the right to construct said street tracks in the City of Wichita Falls, be and the same is here referred to and this ordinance shall become a part of the original ordinance granting the said Wichita Falls Traction Company, its successors, assigns, and lessees, the right to lay and construct the street car tracks in the City of Wichita Falls, Texas.

Section Four. Be it further Ordained, that an emergency is hereby declared requiring that the Constitutional Rule to the effect that Ordinances be read on three separate days be and the same is hereby suspended and this Ordinance is put upon its third reading and final passage and shall be effective from and after date of its passage.

JEWISH FESTIVAL OF THE DEDICATION BEGINS

Yesterday marked the beginning of one of the most interesting minor festivals of the Jewish calendar. It is known by the name of Hanukkah, or the Festival of Dedication and carries us back to the time of the Maccabean heroes in the second century before the Christian Era. This small band of dauntless warriors, whom conscience and religion had incited with desperate courage, after having completely routed the overwhelming army of the Greco-Syrians at the decisive battle of Mithras, 65 B. C., re-entered the temple that had been polluted by the heathens, and consecrated and dedicated it anew to the worship of God.

The kindling of lights in the house and synagogue has become a characteristic rite of the festival, reminiscent of solemn rolighting of the Holy candlestick, which formed part of the reconsecration of the temple by the Maccabees.

Shelled Nuts Save Time and Money

It is difficult for some people to get used to the idea of paying 75c and 85c per pound for shelled nuts, when they can get the unshelled nuts for perhaps a third of the same price.

While it is true that you won't get three times as many nuts in the shelled nuts as you would in the unshelled, nevertheless counting the time that it takes to shell even almonds or walnuts to say nothing of pecans and the loss of nut meats where you do the shelling yourself you will find enough difference in favor of the shelled nuts to warrant their use almost exclusively especially for cooking and also for table use. A pound or two unshelled kept in the house for winter evenings around the fire when cracking nuts is half of the evening sport is all well and good but for general use, (and nuts should form a larger part of the regular menus than they do) shelled nuts will be much more economical.

Higher Prices For Cotton By Texas-Owned Spindles

Fort Worth, Texas, Dec. 6.—Mr. Peter Radford, manager of the Farm Life Commission, has invited public discussion of the problems confronting the Commission and Mora C. Clark of Gainesville has addressed an open letter to Mr. Radford on cotton factories outlining a co-operative plan for building cotton mills. Mr. Clark would solve the cotton marketing problem by bringing the cotton mills to Texas.

"Dear Sir: In addressing this open letter to you, I am acting upon the urgent request of a number of people that I give publicity to my ideas here. The other to pay as little as possible for the crop. Why not do away with this conflict? I submit that it is unnecessary and unprofitable. The amount lost to Texas during the past 25 years, in this contest, is enough to stagger the imagination.

"There is a remedy. If it is applied vigorously and earnestly for a few short years, the result will be a record of industrial development that will be the marvel of the age.

"It is well and good to store cotton in warehouses and bring it out a few months later and put it on the market. It is far better to put it in cotton mills and bring it out in manufactured goods and put these on the market. If the first plan leaves \$300,000,000 in Texas for one crop, the latter plan will leave \$900,000,000 among our citizens.

"Again it is well to influence foreign capital to come to Texas and build these cotton mills to manufacture the crop. It is far better for our farmers to build and own them. The first plan continues the struggle between the farmer and spinner; and the profits of the mills will go to the capitalists outside the State who build them. The second plan solves the entire problem keeps all the profits in Texas and with the people who are entitled to them.

"How are these much desired results to be accomplished? The process is simple enough.

Let the Farmer's Union take the lead in organizing a company to build these factories. Make the shares one dollar each. Call on each cotton producer in the State to invest at least one dollar in stock for each bale of cotton he produces and continue to do so each year. The capital stock can be increased yearly for this purpose.

Make the stock non-transferable for a period of five years after issuance. This is imperative in order to assure the continuous progress of the original plan and also for other reasons to be evident to a thinking mind to need mentioning here.

Make every factory a part of the same Corporation and locate them one at a place, throughout the State

"Cotton picking will be finished very early this year and I hope the farmers will avail themselves of the opportunity to break their land and thereby destroy many destructive insects and store all the moisture that falls through the winter for the use of the growing crop next summer. Early breaking also affords a fine seed bed, which is very essential to thrifty plant growth and which is not to be had where breaking is put off till just before planting time.

"I have great faith in the tight land and full believe that if the tight land farmers will break their land before Jan. 1st, then in the spring keep the crust broken by harrowing after every rain to conserve the moisture that has been stored here through the winter. Select the best seed for planting and then to one-half the plants that are usually left standing to cultivate shallow and frequently they will gather as much cotton, maize and kaffir corn, sorghum or acre, as the sandy land farmers. The cotton will mature earlier and can be gathered earlier than that on the sand."

Receipts at local yards and gins continue to climb, though not so fast as during the first weeks of November. Men whose business it is to keep in touch with the cotton crop situation estimate that from ninety to ninety-five per cent of the crop in this county has been ginned and that by Christmas it will be all in.
