



## KONE ASKS FOR SMALL ACREAGE

EXAS COMMISSIONER OF AGRI-CULTURE WANTS LESS COT-TON PLANTED

#### 1912 CROP LARGE ENOUGH

This Amount Should be Raised on Less Ground by Intensive Cultivation, Leaving More to Other Grops

Austin, Texas, March 13.-With cotton planting season at hand, Commissioner Ed R. Kone of the Texas department of agriculture, has addressed the following to Texas farm

"To the Cotton Farmers of Texas: The time being opportune for such suggestions and it being in the line of my duty to you and the state, I respectfully offer, the following advice:

"1, Plan, with all exactitude possi ble, not to raise a single bale of cot ton more in 1913 than you did in 1912 and to accomplish this result on less acreage by intelligent, up to date seed selection and cultivation.


"2. Adopt a three or four years crop rotations, including growing and plowing under legumes, that will build up the fertility of your soil Also save all barnyard, manure and out it on and work it into your fields

"3. Now is the accepted momen to begin, if you have not already be gun, and to extend, if you have be gun, diversification. Raise as nearly as your circumstances will permit, ev ery agricultural product that you can utilize for home consumption or that you can sell at a profit, paying espec ial attention to growing forage crop and providing abundant pasturage.

Raise Livestock. Raise all the livestock you possibly can and market your forage crops and grass through it-particularly through hogs, cattle and sheep but, wherever possible, not neglecting horses and mules, dairy products and

"5.. Put in orchards, berry patched and kitchen gardens mostly for sup-

FOOD AND DRUG COMMISSIONER POINTS OUT DANGERS OF DRUG

#### SAYS FIGHT DISCOURAGING

Given Very Little Support. He De clares, in Efforts to Prevent Sale in Texas

Austin, Texas, March 13,-In a re ent address here J. B. Abbott, food and drug commissioner, gave the folowing address. Dr. Abbott has, had wo bills introduced before the present legislature, to curb the evil of soft drinks containing caffeine and his address goes into details regarding the need of such legislation. The ad-

"Soft drinks, carbonated, non-alcopolic beverages are consumed in the southern countries in marvelous quanthat uses a car load of sugar a day n the preparation of such beverages the combined quantity used by the ther 2500 concerns manufacturing uch beverages goes way into the dillions of dollars in value. The proit to each of the 7000 druggists in Texas from the sale of such beverages s sufficient in most instances to pay all running expenses of the store Hence this is a subject worthy of the careful study of your food and drug

What has and what has not been ccomplished by the food and drug tepartment, which I have had the honor to represent since the passage of the food and drug law six years Notwithstanding the fact that nany states have had such laws for wenty years, this was the first deartment to find, prosecute and con vict such manufacturers for putting nto such preparations. . You may think you can prove by statistics that ine-tenths of all crime and trouble produced by alcoholics. 1 think 1 an prove that more trouble and more rime is caused by the consumption of dope as drugs and as beverage than you ever dreamed of in all you

"This department has convicted our such manufacturers for using accharin, a coal tar sweetening agent -a drug pure and simple-in place of sugar. Dulein and glucin are prohibit

"The department had a bill introluced in the legislature four years igo intended to prohibit the use of affein and saccharin in such beveriges. The house passed the bill by vote of nearly two to one. The senite killed it by a vote of only eight n favor of it. Hence this is not a pro and anti question. I took samples of one caffine beverage-there are about 300 such beverages sold in the south-with a view of testing it out upon its merits in court, but was nmediately enjoined by a federa judge from prosecuting the case.

"A pro lawyer and ex-attorney general, General Crane, represented the The federal judge is a democrat who signed the minority report in congress against the passage of the federal food and drug law. Refers to Merits.

"Of all the organizations in Texas whose motto is "Pro bono publico." not one has stood by me in this fight against caffeine beverages. The religious press has encouraged the consumption of such beverages by mak ing advertising contracts with such manufacturers. Semi-religious papers with emphasis upon the semi-have advertised them. Now as to the merits of this fight, I refer you to all the scientific literature of all ages of all civilized countries as to the poisonous effect of-caffeine upon the human system. 
