# PROTEST AGAINST SAN ANTONIO OUT **ANOTHER NAME**

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE WANTS ADDITION'S NAME ASSOCI-ATED WITH WICHITA

### DIRECTORS MET

Resolutions Adopted Against Separate Name For Proposed New Postoffice

A vigorous protest against stripping Wichita Falls of either credit or publicity for the factory addition by giving it another name, wth the dignity of a separate postoffice, was voiced this morning at a meeting of the Chamber of Commerce directors, when a resolution was adopted asking that if another postoffice was deemed necessary, it at least be given the name "West Wichita" or "South Wichita" so that the credit might be properly placed.

Text of Resolution The resolution was offered by N. Henderson and follows:

"Whereas, Many citizens of Wichita Falls, not directly owning any interest in the factories or in real estate surrounding the factory sites southwest of the city have contributita Falls, and

"Whereas, Said factory sites have been created with a distinct railroad station bearing a different name from that of this city and it is now proposed to apply for an entirely separate postoffice, and

"Whereas, the direct result of such action would be that Wichita Falls cease thereafter to be connected, in the public eye, with said factories and receive no benefits in an advertising way from the upbuilding of said factories, now there-

"Be it's resolved, That it is the opinion of this body that if it is deemed desirable that a separate railroad station and a separate United States postoffice should be maintained they should both bear the name of West Wichita or South Wichita, and be it

"Resolved further, that the officers of all the corporations doing business at said factories, the offiets of the Wichita Valley Railway Canpany, Wichita Falls & South ern Railway Company, Wichita Falls Traction Company and resident citizens at said sites be requested to have said postoffice and station named as indicated herein, and that the officers and directors of the Chamber of Commerce assist them

in this request." Proposals For New Industries. At the meeting of the directors, propositions from a plumbing supply factory and a well drilling machinery concern, to establish branches in this city, were considered, both being referred to the manufacturing com-

W. G. Long, speaking for the Federation of Women's Clubs, asked the support of the directors in the industrial peace movement, it being proposed to offer prizes for the best high school essays on this subject. After considerable discussion, in the course of which the directors nearly all indorsed the idea, it was decided to raise the money by outside subscription and not to establish a prefor it out of the funds of the organization. -

> MORGAN JONES WINS MILLION DOLLAR SUIT.

Fort Worth, Texas, April 29 .- Mor gan Jones of Abilene, formerly of Fort Worth, represented by Attorney D. T. Bomar, and others, has won his case against the Missouri Edison Electric Company of St. Louis, according to a telegram received by Mr. Bomar from the clerk of the supreme court at Washington. The case involves more than \$1,000,000

In 1904 Mr. Jones, as a minority stockholder in the Missouri Edison company, filed suit in the United States court at St. Louis, claiming the consolidation of that company with the Union Electric & Power Company of St. Louis was, as against the minority stockholders, fraudulent.

The case was appealed twice. The second appeal in the United States circuit court of appeals for the Eighth circuit resulted in a judgment establishing Jones's contention by which the stockholders were awarded · more than ' double the amount awarded by contract of consolidation. The judgment was for more than \$1,000,000.

Washington, April 29.—The demo cratic tariff revision was advanced another stage in the House today when the reading of the measure paragraph by pargraph was taken up. Amendments to each clause of the bill are being offered by the minority memwhile the bill progresses on its egislative journey.

While the minority will make fight on some of the provisions of the bill they realize that with the im nense majority the democrats have the bill may go through the House unaltered.

House Leader Underwood said to day he expected the bill would be passed in the House this week. He added that unless currency legislation was taken up the tariff billwould be passed by both Houses and signed by the president so that Congress could adjourn in July.

Eagle Pass, Texas, April 29.-Reorts of negotiations for an alliance between Felix Diaz and Governor Carranza were spread here by the arrival last night of four alleged commissioners from Diaz and Car-

The cessation of hostilities against the federal forces in the zone controlled by Carranza seems to have ceased, according to reports received here. Another report says that Generals Aubert and Lopez have joined the Constitutionalist cause.

Two of the alleged commisioners are Elisco Arredondo and Francisco Queverto, Carranza's confidential agents. The two others are Miguel Gonzoles and Leoplodo Martini, said to be fepresentatives of Felix Diaz.

Scanty Force Remains With Salzar. By Associated Press. El Paso, Texas, April 29.—General

Jose Ninez Salazar re-organized a part of the ex-rebel troops who mutinied at Casas Grandes yesterday when ordered to attack the Constitutionalists, according to an official report reaching Juarez today, but left with less than 200 soldlers.

Led by Colonel Castillo, 300 of the rebels left yesterday to join Franz Zillars insurgents near Minaca. They took with them most of Salarz's ammunition and supplies. Even those who remained with Salazar are said to have refused to proceed further against the Constitutionalists.

Washington, April 29 .- An embarrassing situation has arisen in regard to the disposal of the Mexican refugees held along the Mexican bound ary by United States Troops. There were originally 1,200 of them held as prisoners by United States troops. Two weeks ago the Secretary of War

gave orders to release them graduat-

ly. Some were federals and some

Constitutionalists or revolutionists. The order was to let fedearls cross the boundary where federals were in control and the Constitutionalists where men of their political faith were strong. This worked well until 1.000 prisoners were released and it was proposed to send 216 Constitutionalists over the line at B Paso. The Constitutionalists are in control of juarez, across from El Paso. That is the only point on the boundary wheer they could be allowed to cross into Mexican terro

The plan for releasing the refugees net with no obstacle until the Mexi can federal authorities made an objection to allow any considerable number of such refugees to cross over where their friends' were in strength as the refugees would immediately be used as reinforcements. The United States authorities at. once decided that to release refugees under such circumstances would be in violation of the neutrality laws and Secretary Garrison promptly issued orders that no refugees should be allowed to cross the boundary where an engagement was imminent or pending.

All refugees have been disarmed and their horsest and side arms take en from them. They can not be allowed to remain in the United States because of the mmigration laws and the United States government can not as a matter of humanity send them across the boundary at points where they would meet with summary execution. They will therefore be held indefinitely until the conditions

permit their reelase. The State Department is trying to effect an arrangement with the command of Fifth Brigade. Second Di Huerta government by which the refugees remaining at El Paso may be of his duties today after nearly forty sent across the line without fear of death and under a stipulation that where he will be formally retired early they shall not be subject to summary execution.


