## Rep. Scott Bailey Introduces Bill

Rep. Scott Bailey of Cisco, introduced his Budget Balance School Bill shortly after the convening of the first called session. The Budget Balanced Bill, Bailey stated, is an economy measure and in keeping with the Governor's call for the first called session.

The Budget Balanced Bill was explained as follows:

Under the present laws, the evenues are placed in the State Available School Fund by both Constitutional and Statutory provisions. These funds are distributed to the schools of the state as the per capita apportionment provided by law. The tion School Program calls for charging the Foundation School Program cost in each District with the amount of the Avail-able School Fund that has been allocated to the District. In this process, approximately \$1,475,000 from the Avaiable School Fund is paid annually to districts that show a budget balance, which, because of adequacy of local revenues, have no need to partribute to the financing of the Foundation School Program




