### STATE TROOPS ON SCENE LOUISIANA -MAKES FIGHT

Regulation of Intrastate Rates By Fed eral Government Causes Lively Debate at Meeting

Washington, Oct. 29.—A state's rights discussion as retating to the powers of the States to regulate railroad rates and bearing on the Shreveport case was precipitated today a the convention of the National Association of Railway Commissioners.

Commissioner L. B. Fimf of Kentucky, after reading a paper on Should Congress Extend the Power of the Federal Government to the Regulation of Intrastate Rates?" in which he opposed such extension, of fered a resolution, "that it was the sense of the association that the grant in the federal Constitution to Congress to regulate commerce among the States is complete, and that said authority should be exercised by the federal government without hindrance from the several States, and that the reservation of power not delegated to the federal government. but reserved to the States, authorizes each of the several states to as fully and completely regulate commerce carried on wholly within each State and that said authority should be exfederal government."

The resolution was about to adopted unanimously when Commis sioner John H. Marble objected to its adoption without consideration. He was seconded by Counsel Barow of the Louisiana Commission, who de clared that on account of the Texas railroad commission, which developed the Shreveport case, "ruin is starin the people of Louisiana in the face. Mr. Barrow insisted if the power of the Interstate Commerce Commission to remove discrimination of this kind were not sustained, the Texas state "soon will be making rates for the whole Southwestern ter ritory.

After lively debate the resolution was tabled by a vote of twenty to nineteen.



# **RESCUE WORK AT** FREDERICK WELL

PUPMS SENT FROM THIS CITY IN EFFORT TO CHECK FLOW OF WATER

Both the Men Saved Are in Serious Condition-Five Buried Underneath Mass of Earth

Pumps are being sent from this ity to Frederick to draw the water from the big city well there where the five workmen crushed to death in a cave-in yesterday are still buried. L. G. Harrison, city electrician at Frederick, was here this morning to get the pumps. He borrowed one from the Wichita Fails & Northwest-Mr. Lawton, manager for the Wichita Falls Water Company went up to assist in installing the pump and getting it into operation.

The five men are buried under eight or ten feet of crumbled wall, dirt and water at the bottom of a hole forty feet deep and twenty feet in diameter, and it is improbable that their bodies can be recovered within the next three or four days even with the hardest labor. Water is pouring into the well and is adding to the difficulties of the rescue work. only pump at Frederick of sufficient capacity to keep the water down is buried at the bottom of the hole with the men.

The well is located two and a quar ter miles northwest of Frederick When down about thirty-two feet the wall began to crumble more than week ago and it was necessary to start another wall inside of this one to go down to the hardpan about eight feet below. This wall was built up from what was then the bottom of the hole and was lowered as the excavation was made by digging from beneath it. It was while the five men were at the bottom digging beneath this wall that the outer wall above without warning crumbled and let a

In the center of the hole the pump which was used in keeping the water out of the hole was erected on a platform and a scaffold built over it to the top. The two men who escappletely covered byer with dirt, and the One of these men, O. H. Brewer was taken out two hours af ter the accident. His recovery is doubtful. Alvah Dean was rescued last night after having been pinned inside the scaffolding twelve hours. His legs are badly crushed but it is believed he will recover.

# UNITED STATES MAYINSIST ELIMINATION OF HUERTA

Will Also Ask Foreign Powers To Await Developments-New Battleships are Sent to Mexican Waters

By Associated Press. Washington, Oct. 29.—Secretary Bryan said today that a formal note had been sent to all European governments, asking them to suspend formulation of a Mexican-policy until the United States has defined its attitude.

England, France and Germany, he said, already had been heard from and it was expected that the other governments would follow the three great powers in awaiting the decision of the United States as to its next step in bringing about peace.

It is expected that United States will first make formal demand for the elimination of Huerta and the conduct of fair and free elections with some safeguards for the election machinery. Steps to secure a new election would involve negotiations with the constitutionalists, and there is confidence among officials that if guarantees for a free campaign can be arranged, the latter are likely to fall into line.

The state department has not decided yet what disposition to make of Felix Diaz, a refugee, now aboard the battleship Louisiana. The sailing today of four American battleships from Hampton Roads to relieve those at Vera Cruz marks the first step on the part of the United States toward complying with the recent declaration of Huerta that foreign ships had been too long in Mexican waters. The battleships Rhode Island, Virginia, Nebraska and New Jersey will relieve the four vessels now there.

Only meager reports have reached the state department of the recent elections. Consular dispatches report Monterey still in the hands of the federals. Small groups of federals who arrived at Mazatalan reported their disastrous defeat after four days' fighting near that city.


