GOVERNMENT WAR REVENUE MEASURE IN EFFECT

Nearly Everyone Will Have To Contribute In Some Way To Federal Revenue

Wichitans who make notes at bank, put in long distance calls, freight and express, sign checks, similar instruments or take on insurance policies are today contributing to the expenses of the government by means of revenue stamps. Dealers in tobacco, perfumes, cosmetics and chewing gum are having to pay, as are theatre owners, banks, breweries and others. The revenue law became effective today.

Tobacco—Dealers in tobacco whose annual receipts from the sale of tobacco exceed \$200 shall pay \$4.00 per annum for each place in which tobacco is any form is sold. The first payment of this tax is for eight months and is \$2.20. Form No. 11-1 on which to render this tax can be secured from A. S. Walker, collector internal revenue, Austin, Texas.

Perfumes and Cosmetics—Each individual package of perfume and cosmetics and other similar article shall bear the following revenue stamps based on retail value: 5c or less a 1-8c revenue stamp; 5c to 10c a 2-8c revenue stamp; 10c and 15c a 3-8c revenue stamp; 15c to 25c, a 5-8c revenue stamp; each additional 25c or fraction thereof, a 5-8c revenue stamp.

Chewing Gum—Each box, carton or package where the retail price does not exceed \$1 shall bear a revenue stamp for 4c. If the retail value exceeds \$1 it must bear a 4c revenue stamp for each additional \$1 or fraction thereof.

Notes—A promissory note or a renewal of a promissory note for a sum not exceeding \$100 must bear a 2c revenue stamp and for each additional \$100 or fraction thereof, it must bear a 2c revenue stamp.

Freight and Express—Each bill of lading or express receipt shall bear a 1c revenue stamp. It is the duty of the agent to see that you affix and cancel this stamp before he signs same.

Telegraph and Telephone—It is the duty of every operator to collect 1c additional for every message for which a charge of 15c or more is imposed.

Conveyance—Deed, instrument or writing whereby any lands, tenement or other realty sold shall be granted, assigned, transferred or otherwise conveyed to or vested in, the purchaser or purchasers or any other person or persons by his, her or their direction, when the consideration or value of the interest or property conveyed, exclusive of the value

CITY COUNCIL TO CALL ELECTION AT MEETING THURSDAY

CURITIES MARKET IMPROVES

Wichita Can Be Disposed of by the Time They Are Voted and Approved

At its meeting Thursday night an order for an election to vote on the issuance of \$45,000 in street improvement bonds will be presented to the city council and as all the members of the council have already declared themselves in favor of an election it is practically certain to be called.

While no street for the improvement has been designated it is believed the greater part of the money will be expended on one of the cross streets and probably for the continuation of the pavement on Tenth street.

It is believed that by the time the bonds are ready to be placed on the market conditions will have improved sufficiently to enable them to obtain a high price. It is also believed that about any time they may have for sale.

of any lien or encumbrance thereon exceeds \$100 and does not exceed \$500, 50c; and for each additional \$500 or fractional part thereof in excess of \$500, 50c, provided that nothing contained in this paragraph shall be so construed as to impose a tax upon any instrument or writing intended to secure a debt.

Power of Attorney—Power of attorney or proxy for voting at any election of officers of any incorporated company or association except religious, charitable, literary societies or public cemeteries, 10c. Power of attorney to perform any and all acts not mentioned above, 25c, except for the collection of claims from the United States.

Protest—Upon the protest of every note, bill of exchange, acceptance, check or draft or any marine protest, whether protested by a notary public or by any other officer who may be authorized by the law of any state or states to make such protest, 25c.

Insurance—Each policy shall bear a revenue stamp equal to the amount of 1/4 of 1 per cent for each dollar or fractional part thereof paid premium. The insurance companies have to pay for and affix these stamps before they deliver the policy to the

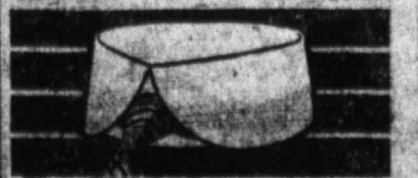

If you want to be a patriot and help pay this war tax, cultivate a habit for chewing gum. Every single package that sells for five cents has to bear a revenue stamp. Luxuries come high, but we've got to have 'em.

If it be true, as statistics tell us, the people of the United States, are becoming more highly educated and enlightened, why is it that crime is also on the increase?

It required \$1,116,000,000 to pay the expense of the American government the last fiscal year. The year before that the expense was \$1,098,678,788. That don't look good to us Democrats who were accusing the Republicans of extravagance in governmental affairs, and we can expect to be reminded of this often enough during the next presidential campaign.

With fifty recruiting stations and a population of 600,000 people, Manchester, England, we are told by press dispatches, has only succeeded in persuading 400 recruits to fight the Germans and Austrians. That shows to some extent the amount of enthusiasm being manifested by the average Englishman in this European war. They have cultivated the idea that the other fellows—the Belgians, the French, Russians and Japs—should be willing to make targets of themselves.

THE COLOMBIAN INCIDENT.

It seems that Great Britain is getting somewhat worried over Colombia's neutrality.

German agents are reported to be operating a powerful wireless station in that country.

Charles Roberts, the British under-secretary of the colonial office, intimated in the house of commons recently that his government proposed to appeal to the United States to use its good offices to compel our South American neighbor to maintain strict neutrality.

It is to be assumed that Great Britain would predicate such an appeal on the Monroe doctrine, but if so Great Britain would be placing an interpretation on that doctrine which its most enthusiastic sponsors would scarcely care to concede.

As to the attitude which South and Central American nations may assume toward each other, or toward foreign

countries, the Monroe doctrine has nothing to say.

Its chief purpose is to prevent their colonization of conquest by European powers.

If Colombia has violated her neutrality, that is her business, and while we sincerely regret such delinquency on her part, the Monroe doctrine implies that we go no farther than to give her friendly advice.

If England, or the allies, were to become provoked to such an extent as to take "drastic steps," that is their business, and the Monroe doctrine would not admit of interference on our part unless such "drastic steps" involved colonization and conquest.

Certainly, the Monroe doctrine is rather elastic and could easily be strained so as to aggravate the situation materially.

A rigid interpretation of it, however, does not place the Colombian incident in the category of dangerous occurrences except as it might be used to provoke trouble.

Both the entente and the German alliance are to be pardoned for mild attempts to persuade the United States to show its hand as favoring either one side or the other, but this government does not propose to be drawn into the holocaust.

If circumstances should force us to take up arms, it seems highly improbable at this time, we propose to do so under such conditions as will require the necessity of issuing White Books, Blue Books, Gray Books, Orange Books or any other colored books to justify ourselves before posterity and the world.

Galveston, Dec. 1.—Thirty of the steamships leaving Galveston during November carried export wheat to the amount of 5,300,000 bushels. Fifteen of these ships cleared for Genoa, with considerably more than half the grain, 2,921,120 bushels.
Cotton exports for November amount to 389,657 bales. Forty-four vessels carried cotton. This staple was exported to Great Britain, Norway, Sweden, Spain, Italy, Denmark and Japan.

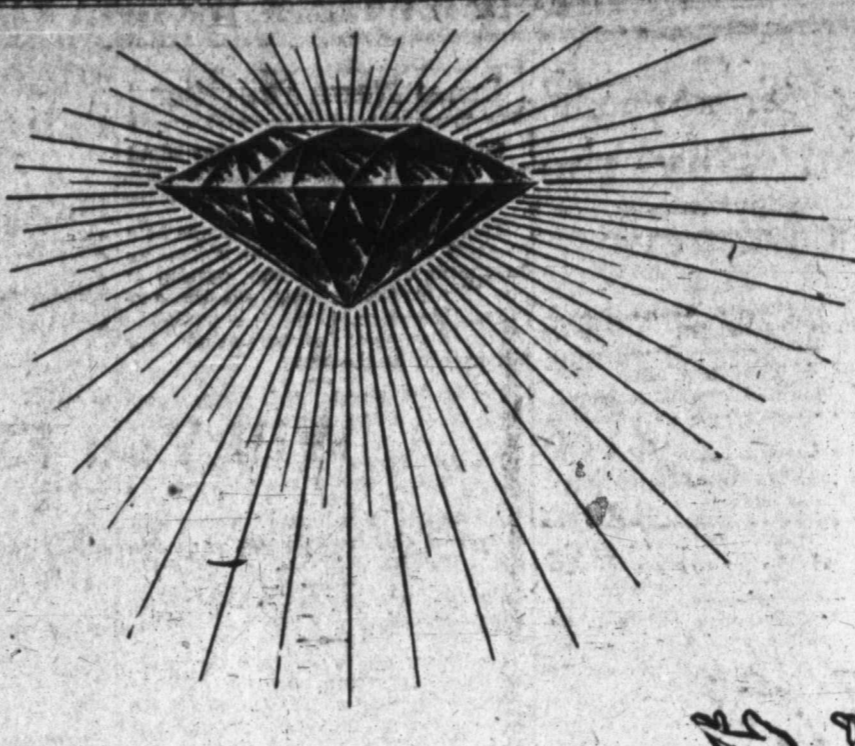
