Editor Wichita Daily Times, Dear Sir: There appeared in your issue of yesterday a statement issued by J. J. Manley relative to the paving bond election to be held tomorrow...

that those who come after us, who will receive the same benefits from them, will pay a part of the burden, in other words, that the burdens may be justly distributed.

The bonds in question to be voted on tomorrow amount to \$45,000, and draw interest at the rate of five per cent payable semi-annually with option to redeem at any time at the pleasure of the city after ten years.

Mr. Manley states that this one-fourth collected the first year must remain in the treasury for forty years without interest and so on. Mr. Manley takes as his basis \$40,000 in bonds and by his high financing he determines that this \$40,000 costs the city \$120,000 before it is paid.

Mr. A. E. Myles, auditor, estimates by this investment of the sinking funds in bonds drawing five per cent that the same instead of having to run forty years will be liquidated in less than twenty years.

Mr. Manley asserts that no good financier would consent to such a system in his own private business, and yet there are but few men in Wichita Falls who have built their own homes who have not resorted to a similar practice in fixing a mortgage in order to build their homes.

HAS STATE HEADQUARTERS  
Temple, Texas, Jan. 11.—State headquarters for the campaign for better marketing and farming conditions were to be opened in Temple and Belton today. Prof. Perry G. Holden of Ames, Iowa, was to be in charge of the campaign, with a corps of thirty assistants who are experts in all branches of farming. The movement, which will embrace the entire agricultural section of Texas, has been styled the Texas Farming Campaign and the slogan, "Texas Will Feed Herself and Keep \$200,000,000 at Home."
