TO WAGE CAMPAIGN FOR POLL PAYMENTS

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE TAKES STEPS TO BRING ABOUT INCREASE

RIVAL TEAMS TO COMPETE

Captains Will be Appointed to See That Payments are Made in Remaining Four Days

In the last four days for poll tax payments the Chamber of Commerce is to wage a campaign to bring the poll tax payments this year in this precinct up to last year's figures. At the meeting of the directors this morning President Huff was authorized to appoint captains of two teams each of whom is to select ten assistants to make a canvass of the city. Those who induce the payment of the most poll tax will probably be given a banquet by the directors.

Poll tax payments for the county so far are running several hundred behind last year's figures and it will take hard work to bring the payments up to last year's figures. Mr. Huff expected to name the captains for the two teams this afternoon.

MOTORCYCLE POLICEMAN BADLY HURT IN ACCIDENT

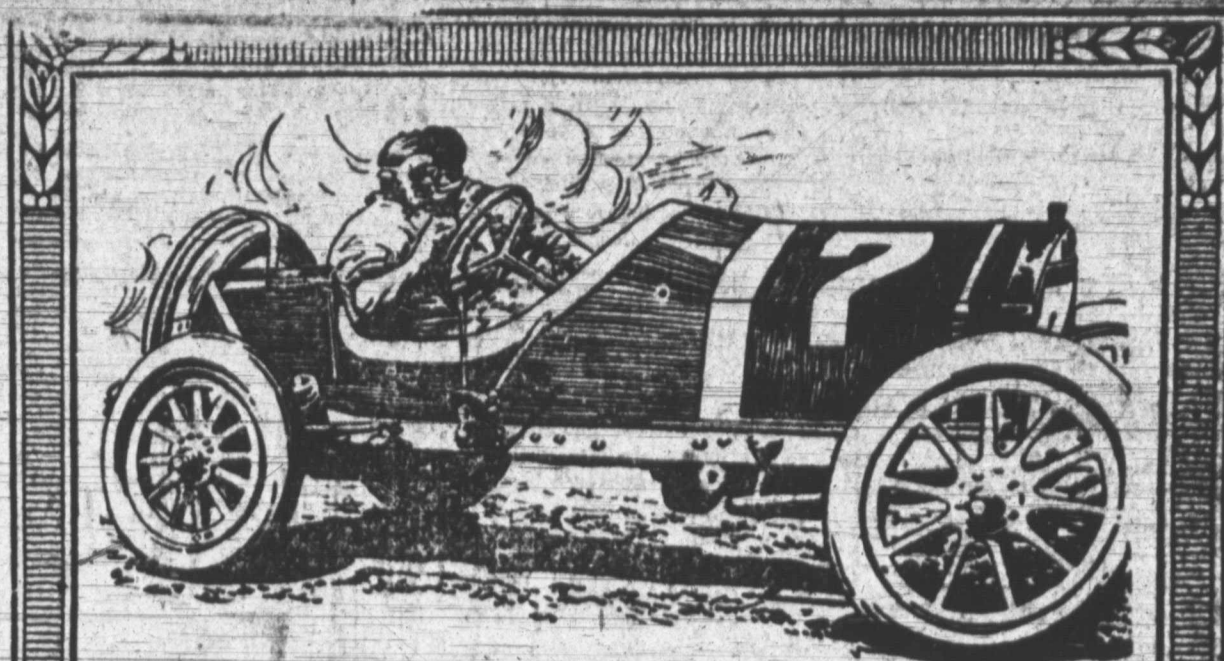
Fred Smith is Thrown from Machine on Tenth Street—Is Picked up Unconscious
