**CITY IS ASKED TO LICENSE DRAYMEN**

JITNEY CARS MAY ALSO BE INCLUDED IN PROPOSED ORDINANCE

REGULAR SESSION OF COUNCIL

Purchase of Tract Near Incinerator Ordered—Other Matters Receive Attention

As soon as copies of ordinances can be obtained from other cities the city council will consider the adoption of an ordinance requiring draymen operating in Wichita Falls to take out a license and give bond. In this connection, it is expected that the question of requiring operators of "jitney" cars to take out licenses and to give bond will also be discussed.

A committee of draymen appeared before the council last night to ask that licenses and bonds be required from draymen. They said it had been the practice for outside parties to drive in and operate a dray wagon for a few days or a week. They reported that there were now so many of these transients in the business that the regular draymen were crowded out of their stands. Some of these outside parties had proven unreliable and had brought reproach on all the draymen, they declared, and said that they would not object to a reasonable license fee and would be glad to furnish any bond that the council might require. Mayor Britain told the committee that letters had already been written to other cities asking for copies of their ordinances in connection with this subject.

Dr. Reed of the sanitary committee reported an offer from Sam Wisdom to sell the city a tract of land adjoining the incinerator site for \$125. The offer was ordered accepted and Dr. Reed was appointed to close up the deal.

The water company was ordered to install a fire hydrant at Humphries and Daggett streets. This was ordered some time ago but the water company reported that it would be required to spend a large amount to lay a main to that point. Members of the council decided last night that a fire hydrant at that point was a necessity.

Better water service in the territory between Sixth and Eighth streets west of Hottel street which include the site for the city and county hospital was discussed and the regular committee was instructed to take up the matter with the water company.

Ralph Robertson was granted permission to install a gasoline tank under the sidewalk at 712 Indiana avenue where he is opening an auto supply station.
