

55 BODIES RECOVERED AT ARDMORE EARLY THIS AFTERNOON

GASOLINE DISTILLATE EXPLODES

GERMAN'S HAMMER STRUCK A SPARK EXPLoding GASOLINE TANK CAR AND DYNAMITE

WRECKS BUILDINGS

Fire Breaks Out and Other Explosions Add to Disaster in Which Depot and Several Business Blocks Were Wrecked

By Associated Press. Ardmore, Okla., Sept. 28.—The death list as a result of yesterday's gasoline and ensuing dynamite explosion here was bought up to fifty-five this afternoon when the bodies of a man and two small children were found on the former site of the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway freight depot. Of the dead thirty-six are white and nineteen are negroes.

Three More Bodies Found. The death list today was increased by the finding of a farmer, aged about 40 years, two small children, a boy and girl, aged seven and ten on the site of the freight depot which was first consumed in the flames following the explosion.

The streets for about three blocks from the site of the explosion have been roped off from traffic. Persons are likewise kept a considerable distance from the freight yards where there is another car of distillate which may, according to those in authority, explode like the first one.

The MacMahon Oil Company, a local concern, was first to head a relief fund list with \$1,000. Money for aid has come from Gainesville, Texas, Madill, Marietta and Norman, Okla., as well as from the state prison at McAlester.

Property Damage \$500,000. The property damage is estimated at more than a half million dollars. A tank containing 250 barrels of gasoline exploded.

Prisco and Rock Island railroads. The Rock Island freight station and scores of other buildings quickly took fire from the flying liquid. The flames spread rapidly until all of Main street appeared a roaring furnace. Thirty freight cars in the Santa Fe railroad yards were destroyed. The pall of smoke hanging over the whole city prevented rescuers from doing effective work.

Windows Shattered. All school buildings, business houses and residences within twelve blocks of the business district bear evidence of the explosion. Practically every window in the city was shattered by its force. At the store of Maddin & Co., scores of girls were working, and it was feared last night some of them lost their lives.

Three downtown business buildings are now being remodeled and will be occupied as soon as the improvements are finished. They are old First National Bank building, the old City National building and the White Front building at Seventh and Ohio streets.

ABSINTHE IS PROVING A VERY LIVELY CORPSE

French Wineshops Asserting Political Influence to Annul the Prohibition Order.

Paris, Sept. 27.—Absinthe is dying hard in France. Artificial drinks resembling it in color and flavor are obtainable in spite of the vigilance of the authorities.

The wineshops play in French politics a role similar to that of the American saloon, hence the reluctance of the deputies to follow the military authorities in the radical measures they have taken and to support the government in proposed measures they have in proposed legislation forbidding the sale of any drink leading over 15 degrees of alcohol.

The next step originated in the parliament itself, in the proposed limitation of martial law to the zone of operations of the armies. Pressure was brought to bear upon the press and upon parliament by the National Union of Wholesale and Retail Wine and Liquor Dealers, who threatened to withdraw advertisements from the newspapers, and political support from the deputies unless the anti-liquor campaign were stopped.

EPISCOPAL GUILD MEETS ON MONDAY AFTERNOON

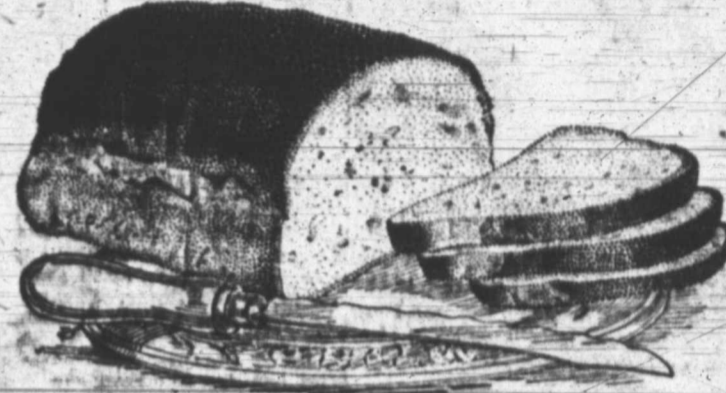

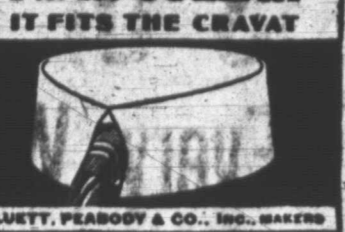

### Turkish Soldier Blindfolded To Keep Him From Learning Military Secrets



BLINDFOLDED TURK GETS ARMISTICE TO BURY DEAD.

Englishmen and Frenchmen, fighting on the Gallipoli peninsula to batter a way to Constantinople, have acquired a high opinion of the Turk as a fighting man and also of the personal qualities of the Moslem. They say he "fights fair." On the other hand, German reports assert

that the Turk has no great objection to the Frenchman, but does not like Tommy Atkins. Recent reports say that the allied forces on the peninsula have been strengthened by a great Italian army, so in all likelihood the Turks are now crossing arms with their old opponents of

the Turko-Italian war for Tripoli. The picture shows a blindfolded Turk being taken through the British lines—blindfolded to keep him from acquiring useful military information—after he had come from his own side with a request for an armistice in which to bury the dead.

### Carranza In Interview Sets Forth His Aims

(New York Times.) New York, Sept. 27.—The following striking interview with General Venustiano Carranza has been secured from the Constitutional leader at his headquarters in Vera Cruz by Bernard Gallant. In it General Carranza sets forth for the first time his full views toward the United States and the Latin-American powers, discusses frankly just what the Americans and all other foreigners may expect from him, and what his views are on the various problems confronting Mexico and what he intends to do to establish peace and his purpose in doing so.

were imbued with ideas of Socialism and Anarchism.

Revolution Economic, Not Political.  
He looked at me very seriously and said:

"Are you acquainted with the cause of revolution? Let me give you a brief review of what is usually transpiring in our country.

"The revolution in Mexico is not of a political nature. It is an economic revolution. It means the industrial awakening of Mexico.

"During the days of Diaz the natural resources of the country were exploited by a few rich friends of Diaz, who were given special concessions. Only those few developed the country. Others—Mexicans as well as foreigners—had no opportunities whatever. Mexico was a land of special privileges. This could not last forever, and the result was the present revolution.

"Mexico is a country rich in natural resources, but all its wealth is merely potential. Money, and a great deal of it, has to be invested before we can utilize the riches of our country. We know this very well, and for that reason we want foreigners to come and invest their money here. We will exploit our resources, but they will come in the future under different conditions.

"Mexico will no longer be a land of special privileges, but a land of a million opportunities. It will be a country where all will be given an equal chance—Yes, indeed, we want foreigners, but we expect them to come to Mexico under different conditions than they did in the days of Diaz.

"They accuse us of being confiscators. A little reasoning will immediately show the fallacy of such a thought.

"Of what value would all the foreign property be to us even if we did confiscate it? Mines, oil-fields and other property are of no value if they are not exploited. To confiscate them would mean nothing more than getting a white elephant on our hands. But when they are operated by their owners the government deserves a revenue from such properties and that is what we are after. A close inspection will convince you that we need foreign capital, and, in return, we offer great opportunities, that the days of special privileges have gone, never to return. From the investor we expect nothing more than an equitable revenue, and for this he will be given the fullest protection of the laws of the country.

"As in all revolutions and upheavals a great deal of foreign property has been destroyed in Mexico. Whether this was done intentionally or not is hard to establish. But from the outset of the revolution it was the intention, the honest desire, of the Constitutionalists to reimburse all those who had suffered through loss of property and valuables. This phase of the reconstructive work of the Constitutionalists is, I think, of greater importance to foreigners than the proposed A. B. C. peace conference. And it is in this phase of the question, I hope, that the Washington government and the representatives of the Latin republics will take up, as I suggested.

"Tribunal to Pass on Foreign Claims.  
According to the ideas of General Carranza, the question of foreign claims is to be passed upon by a tribunal composed of members from various foreign countries and of as many Mexicans. Before this body all claims will be presented, evidence carefully investigated, and, if the claims are found just, they will be adjudicated to be paid by the government. Moreover, the Constitutional government is to create a special reserve fund out of the government revenue which is to be used for no other purpose than making good the losses sustained by foreigners during the revolution. This General Carranza claims, is one of the whole reconstructive program of

the Constitutionalists. I asked him what were the chances of American investors in Mexico. He said that the Constitutionalists believed in conciliation and

Mexico and he deems it far more important than party conferences. General Carranza thinks Mexico so wealthy and its income, under normal peaceful conditions, so large that it will be able to pay off its internal and external debt in a comparatively short time.

"A great deal of the misunderstanding between the foreign investor and the Constitutionalists is due to the desire on the part of the former to cling to the ideas of the old regime," continued General Carranza. "The Constitutionalists believe in an equitable taxation of all products imported into or exported from Mexico. This is not to be done with the idea of burdening business men, but as one of the fundamental principles of all governments.

No More Tax Exemptions.  
"In the days of Diaz, many of his special concessionaries were exempt from taxation. Those days are past. It is to this phase of reconstructive program that many foreigners object, in reality organized governments are doing, and nothing else. We place no burdens upon foreigners.

"Like many other nations, we, in our bitter struggle to free ourselves from the yoke of centuries of oppression, have undoubtedly made many mistakes. We have wandered much, and to the eyes of the world our errors must have looked amazing. But it is not to be forgotten that we are just getting our first lessons in democracy, and it is very likely that we shall make many more mistakes.

"Our errors have led many people to believe that what Mexico needed was a strong man to rule it with blood and iron. Nothing is farther from the truth than this. What Mexico needs is not a man on horseback but an honest, energetic man of experience, a man who understands the needs of the country and the people, one who can rule wisely and sympathetically. That is Mexico's need."

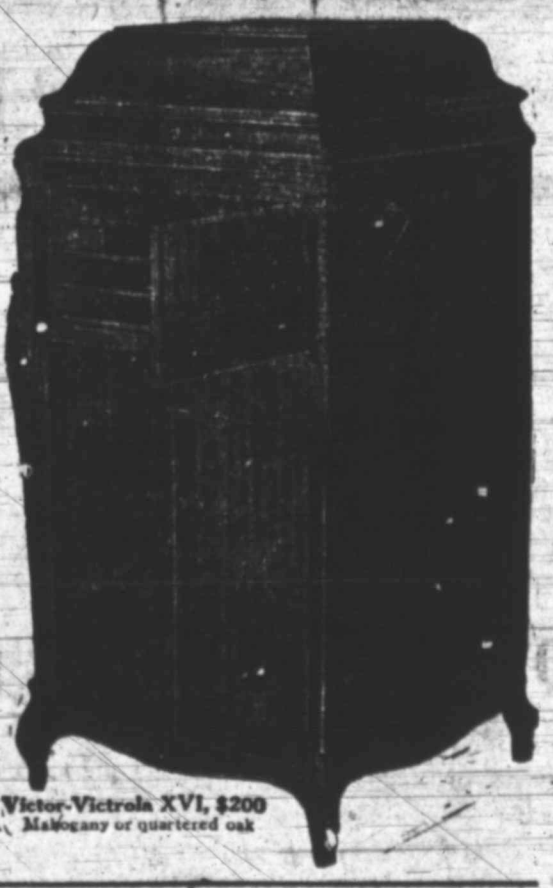
