



I wondered how many missions one had flown, and pilots he had trained; how many foxholes he may have dug; how many chocolate bars had he left by the trail for children to pick up? Also, how many C-rations had he given away that da? Here are a few comments by the veterans helping me at the cemetery: "Lift that stone-see how many fish he took home. Never home--always on the go." As I stopped to look for another name, I could hear the silence, the taps, the 21-gun salute. The squadron of jets with a missing plane. Here was a sailor who was at sea for a long, long time. So many never made it home, to wear their deserved medals. As I turned to look for another name on the list, I noticed an older veteran sitcing on the tailgate of his pickup, resting. Since the wheat has dried considerably, the thrips come out of the wheat into the cotton," Butman said. The small insects have even invaded the towns. They will also give you a bite, if you don't swat them or get them off, we understand. 

**Children's Eye Frames** 



Children's Eye Frames wishale, which is best for your child? Before considering the frame, ask your eye car pecialist how thick the lenses will be based on the prescription. To eliminate distortion, get a small frame for thicker lenses. Trames are made of either plastic or metal. In the past, plastic was the most durable. However, with new materials this is no longer the case. Your vhild's sports and daily activities. Make sure that the frames do not slide down the nose and that the temples wrap all the way around the back of the ear. Spring hinges on the temples are another helpful feature. For maximum safety, children's lenses should be made of polycarbonate. It is the strongest material, as well as the lightest. Polycarbonate has built-in protection against ultraviolet rays, and the lenses are scratch-resistant. If your child needs his or her glasses all the time, consider buying a back up pair in case one gets lost or damaged. Finally, let your child participate in choosing the style and color of the frame.
