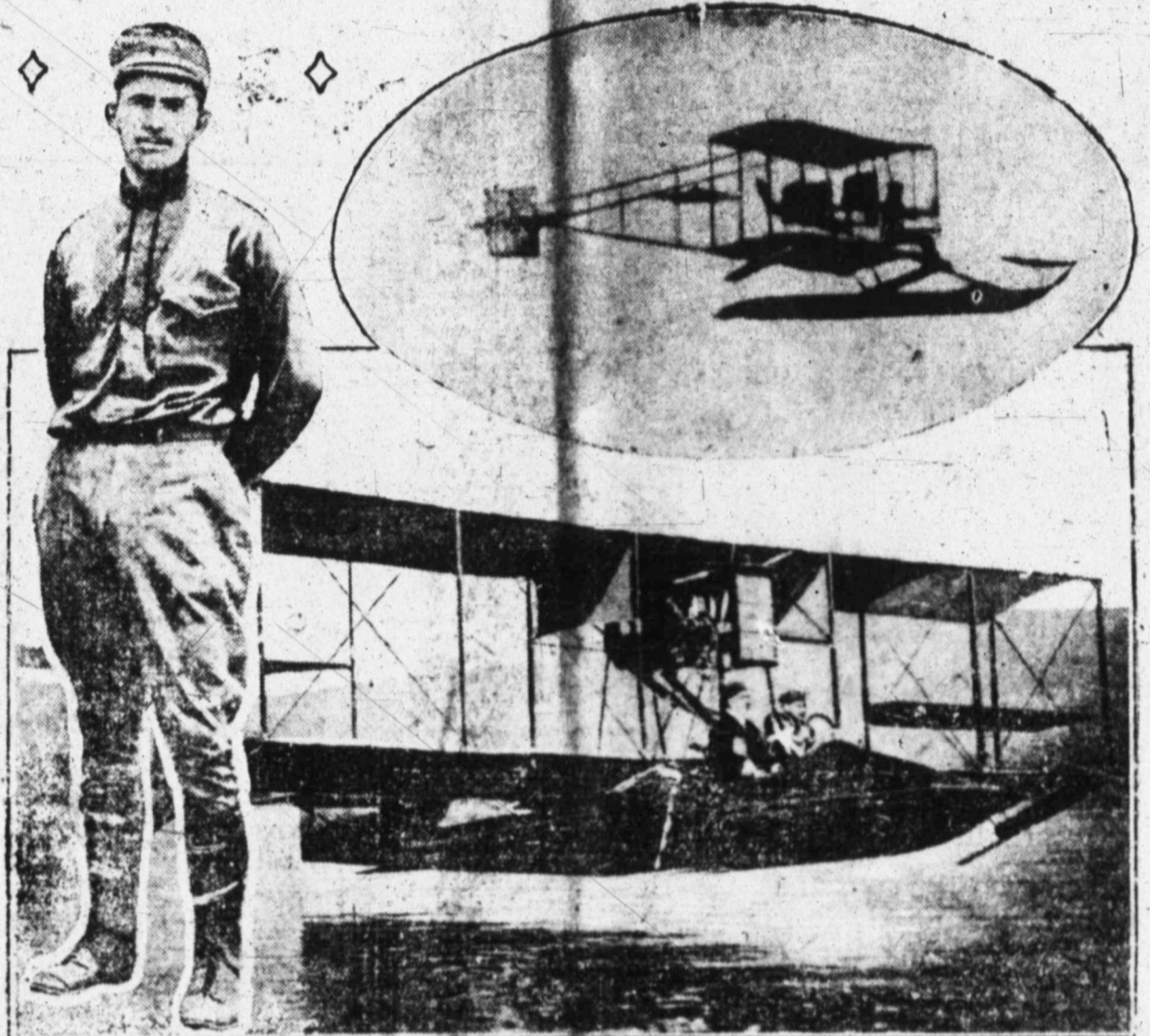

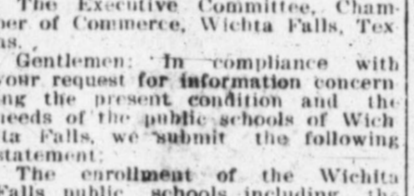

### DENIES GERMANY HAS ANY DESIGNS ON THIS COUNTRY

CHANCELLOR VON BETHMANN-HOLLWEG SAYS SUCH IMPUTATIONS ARE SILLY—WANTS NOTHING ON HEMISPHERE

### "FIGHT FOR FUTURE"

Says War is Being Waged For Germany and Not For Any Space in Foreign Country. Addresses Reichstag Today

By Associated Press. Berlin, April 5.—Dr. Von Bethmann-Hollweg, the German chancellor in a comprehensive speech in the Reichstag today, discussing the military and political aspects of Germany as resulting from the war, protested vigorously against the report that Germany now or in the future, contemplated aggression against the United States. The chancellor also indicated that any suggestions of peace on the basis of destruction of Prussian military power would be possible only one answer—the German sword.

He stated that if Germany's adversaries desired to continue the slaughter of men and devastation of Europe, the guilt would be theirs, and that Germany would have to "stand it as men." The chancellor said: "The latest offspring of the campaign directed against us is a report that we, after the end of this war, shall rush against the American continent, and that we shall attempt to conquer Canada.

"This is the silliest of all imputations invented against us. Equally silly are the reports that we contemplate the acquisition of any territory on American soil in Brazil or in any American country whatsoever. "We fight for our existence and for our future. For Germany, and not for space in a foreign country, are Germany's sons bleeding and dying on the battlefields of Europe.

The close in wheat was steady, 1 1/2 and 1 3/4, and 2 1/2 and 2 3/4 net lower, with May at \$1.19 1/2 and 1/2 and July at \$1.17 and 1/2. Corn closed steady at a loss of 1/2 and 3/4 to 1/2.

### HOLLAND'S BODY IS BURIED TODAY

BROTHER-IN-LAW ATTENDS SERVICES FOR MAN SLAIN MONDAY NIGHT

### NEGRO NOT TALKING

Will Probably Have Hearing as Soon as District Attorney Humphrey Returns

Funeral services for Sam Holland, who was shot and killed Monday night by J. W. Battie, negro restaurant owner, were conducted this morning at 10 o'clock from the Wichita Falls Undertaking Company chapel. Rev. A. L. Andrews, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South officiated. J. A. Crowley of Crowley, Texas, brother-in-law of the slain man was the only relative present at the service. Burial was made in Riverside Cemetery at 2 o'clock this afternoon. The body will be exhumed and re-buried as soon as relatives of the dead man decide upon a permanent burial place.

Meanwhile, Battie maintains an air of sullenness and silence in the county jail, refusing to discuss the case either with fellow prisoners or outsiders. He has refused to make any statement aside from that which he made Tuesday before County Attorney Greenwood and Assistant County Attorney Davenport, when he admitted discharging his revolver during a quarrel with another negro over 25 cents, but said he did not know at whom he fired. The killing occurred in Battie's restaurant in the rear of the Red Front Saloon, Seventh and Michigan, when Holland sought to act as mediator.

County Attorney Greenwood said this afternoon that several witnesses will be called to testify at a special hearing as soon as District Attorney Humphrey returns from Archer City where he is attending a grand jury session. He is expected to return the latter part of this week.
