dismissed. Sampson, who resigned as the e mails became public, released a statement noting that other senior Justice Department officials were
aware of the dismissal discussions with the White House "since the election" of 2004.
In his e-mails to the White House, Sampson suggested that
U.S. attorneys who have "exhibit U.S. attorneys who have "exhibit-
ed loyalty to the president and the ed loyalty to the president and the attorney genera" should be
retained, while those who "chafe against administration initiatives" should be removed.
He also clearly understood that
those actions could have political repercussions.
poitical repercussions.
In a Nov. 15 memo, Sampson
urged Miers to run the dismissal urged Miers to run the dismissal plan by Rove's office, as a "preexecution necessity I would recommend." He added, "I am concerned that to execute this plan
properly we must all be on the properly we must all be on the
same page and be steeled to with stand any political upheaval that might result."
Nevertheless, Gonzales has
insisted that insisted that he was kept in the dark about these e-mail talks.
Either way, he doesn't look too good. It means that he is either trying to save his skin or he can' smell the stink under his own
nose.
If he was involved, he might as
well give up now. Congress plans
to hove hearings where Sampson, Rove and Miers could be forced to
