





# More than 900 new laws go into effect today

AUSTIN (AP) — With four months left before the year 2000, Texas lawmakers are touting a new law meant to head off potential Y2K mishaps.

Computer manufacturers and vendors that identify potential Y2K problems and offer free or low cost solutions are now immune from lawsuits.

"As the new millennium nears, it is imperative that businesses and consumers take the appropriate measures to properly protect themselves from potential glitches that may arise," said bill sponsor Rep. Brian McCall, R-Plano.

The law is one of 924 that go into effect today, including a measure lowering the blood alcohol limit from .10 to .08.

Some provisions in the Y2K law already are in effect.

The state has established a

Web site and a toll-free number to help consumers link to manufacturers and find ways to check the readiness of their computer systems to ensure they can handle the date change from 1999 to 2000.

Computer scientists say computers might read only the last two digits of 2000, causing some systems to freeze and, in some cases, shut down at midnight on Jan. 1.

"Lawmakers said fix the problem, work out your differences informally, and if at all possible, don't tie up the courts by fixing blame on one another," said Jon Opelt, director of Citizens of Lawsuit Abuse.

The law also creates a two-year statute of limitations for filing Y2K claims from the time a problem starts.

It requires that parties try to

resolve their disputes informally — without litigation — if problems aren't fixed early.

Among the other laws going into effect today is one making it illegal to drive with a blood alcohol concentration of .08 or higher.

Authorities began enforcing the law at midnight.

"It will save lives, said Lt. Gov. Rick Perry. "Drunk driving must not be tolerated in Texas."

The law means a 170-pound man could consume one less drink an hour — four instead of five — before being considered drunk, according to Perry. For a 137-pound woman, it's three instead of four drinks in an hour.

The lower limit "means fewer drinks before drivers can be arrested for drunk driving,

Fewer drinks means fewer drunk drivers, and fewer deaths on Texas roads and highways," Perry said.

Texas joins 16 other states that have adopted the stricter limit. Passage of the law qualifies the states for federal grants totaling \$57.4 million this year and more money later.

Also taking effect today is a law that allows people trained to use automated external defibrillators to use the machines without the risk of being sued.

"The number of deaths from cardiac arrest do not need to be as high as they are," said bill sponsor Sen. Jane Nelson, R-Flower Mound.

"This device is a true lifesaver and those good Samaritans who use it to help others should be applauded, not penalized with a lawsuit."

# New federal child car seat regulations to be enforced

WASHINGTON (AP) — Child car seats take on a new look starting today, when stricter head protection standards take effect. That means most seats will come equipped with a tether strap that anchors the top of the seat more securely so children move less in a crash.

The change is the first phase of a three-year federal plan to create a universal, easy-to-use child seating system. The goal is to eliminate the confusion among parents that results in incorrect installation of up to 80 percent of car seats.

Once all autos and seats have the new system, the government estimates it will save up to 50 lives and prevent 3,000 injuries per year.

While there are hundreds of thousands of child seats already in use, parents should not abandon them. Seat manufacturers and automakers are offering kits to add the tethers and new attachment points to existing seats and cars.

Experts believe that existing seats are safe when installed properly, but the new regulations are needed to simplify that task.

"Currently, it varies from seat to seat and vehicle to vehi-

cle what type of restraint system you have," said Steve Oesch, senior vice president of the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, an industry-backed research group that supports the change.

"This system will make child restraints safer, simpler and more secure," said Dr. Ricardo Martinez, head of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, the federal agency issuing the new regulations.

Starting today, the safety administration is requiring that automakers do their part by beginning to equip new cars with anchor points for the top tether straps.

In most sedans, the anchors will be on the shelf between the rear seat and rear window. In minivans, the anchors will be on the floor behind the seat. Eighty percent of the 2000 model year vehicles sold in the United States must have the anchors, with the percentage increasing in succeeding years.

By Sept. 1, 2002, car seat makers must also add two more straps to attach the seat bottom to a car without using its seat belt system.

# Feds challenge judge's custody of Davidian evidence

WACO (AP) — A federal judge's authority to take control of evidence sifted from the ruins of the 1993 Branch Davidian inferno is now challenged by the U.S. Justice Department in a power struggle that pits two governmental branches against each other.

Lawyers' 19-page motion Tuesday contends that U.S. District Judge Walter Smith's order demanding custody of all documents and other evidence is without any legal basis under federal or civil court rules, according to The Dallas Morning News.

The move followed FBI Director Louis Freeh's push for an independent investigator to head the probe into why it took his agency six years to acknowledge using incendiary tear gas canisters in the waning hours of the siege near Waco, Texas.

Smith "threatens a wholesale intrusion" into the executive branch and an "unwarranted and substantial burden" on the entire federal government with his Aug. 9 order, according to the Justice Department motion. "It should be plain... that separation of powers prevents a federal court from acting as an independent investigator."

The filing followed by one day a Waco federal prosecutor's warning to Attorney General Janet Reno that lawyers within her department had long withheld evidence that the FBI fired pyrotechnic tear gas within hours of the fatal fire at the compound.

Meanwhile, jailed Branch Davidians may seek new trials following Assistant U.S. Attorney Bill Johnston's revelation that evidence may have been illegally kept from them

prior to their clients' 1994 trials.

"If we can get our hands on a piece of evidence proving that something was withheld from us, we'll probably go back into court," Houston attorney Rocket Rosen, who represents Davidians Kevin Whitecliff and Livingstone Fagan, told the Waco Tribune-Herald. "I think it's very likely based on what I'm hearing and reading."

He told the newspaper that defense attorneys may file a writ of habeas corpus asking for a new trial, arguing their clients are being held illegally because the government failed to disclose the use of incendiary devices against the Davidians.

Notes referring to the FBI's Hostage Rescue Team acknowledging that "military gas" — an incendiary device — was used during the April 19, 1993 assault on Mount Carmel came to

Johnston's attention, he said Monday. The notes were written in 1994 before the criminal trial of 11 Davidians by a paralegal working for the U.S. Attorney's office.

Johnston said a handwritten notation on the notes recommended they not be shown to anyone outside the department's legal staff.

The Texas Department of Public Safety had requested Smith seize control of Davidian evidence it was holding for the Justice Department. The DPS said it thought the agency was being used by the federal government to keep the evidence from public inspection.

The FBI's about-face last week, after claiming for years that only non-burning tear gas was used during the 51-day siege, has triggered the latest round of scrutiny.

# Man handed death sentence for shooting two truck drivers

DALLAS (AP) — Late-night road rage that a former financial analyst blamed on his fatal shootings of two truck drivers has brought him a death sentence, with the jury foreman describing the capital murder defendant's testimony and writings as the most crucial evidence against him.

Jurors deliberated less than 90 minutes on Tuesday before sentencing Douglas Alan Feldman to lethal injection.

Feldman, of Richardson, had confessed both in letters and during his trial to opening fire on Robert Stephen Everett, 36, of Marshfield, Mo., and Nicolas Aog Velasquez, 62, of Irving, Texas, in August 1998, prosecutors said.

Everett was killed on U.S. 75 near the Allen-Plano line north of Dallas. Feldman, who was

riding a motorcycle, had contended that Everett almost ran him over.

"I chased Mr. Everett down and I shot him to death," Feldman, 41, testified earlier. "I felt like I needed to stop that man. I caught up with him again and I fired directly into the cab."

Velasquez, an Exxon trucker, was fatally shot 40 minutes later at a Dallas gasoline station as he was filling tanks there.

"I saw that man standing by that truck," testified Feldman. "I exploded again in anger. I drove by and shot him. It was just acting out. I felt emotionally impelled and consumed by anger."

Feldman admitted shooting a third man, Antonio Vega, because he thought the victim was a trucker. Vega survived.

# Guard killed during disturbance at private prison

SANTA ROSA, N.M. (AP) — A correctional officer was stabbed to death and several others were wounded in a fiery inmate revolt that caused extensive damage to a private prison, authorities said.

The disturbance at the Guadalupe County Correctional Facility erupted Tuesday evening. Law officers regained control early Wednesday and imposed an inmate lockdown, said state Secretary of Public Safety Darren White.

White said the 42-year-old guard, who was not identified, was stabbed numerous times. He did not know how many inmates were involved in the stabbing or the uprising.

"Our goal is going to be to find whoever is responsible for the cold-blooded murder of this guard and hold them accountable," White said.

White said inmates set fire to four dormitory areas — known as pods — and "there was destruction of much of the property that was contained in and

around the pods." Each pod holds about 50 inmates.

A prison "special response team" had retaken three of the pods shortly after 11 p.m. Tuesday and took the fourth from prisoners' control early today, White said.

"As far as we know, no one escaped," said State police Deputy Chief Herman Silva.

Corrections Department

spokesman Geroges Scott said at least one inmate was stabbed. He did not immediately know the inmate's condition.

White said it was too early to determine the cause of the fire. The uprising is the first violent incident at the prison since Aug. 23, an inmate died after he was beaten with a laundry bag full of rocks in a day room at the Santa Rosa prison.

# Turkey factory scorched, twice

FREDERICKSBURG (AP) — Firefighters toiled deep into the night Tuesday trying to put down persistent flames that twice engulfed a turkey processing plant.

Sunday House Foods, where live turkeys have been slaughtered, plucked and packaged for more than 30 years, first burst into flames Tuesday afternoon.

The heavily refrigerated factory released clouds of ammonia fumes into the air, the San Antonio Express-News reported.

The gas forced the evacuation of hundreds of nursing home residents and other neighbors from the area.

Officials told the paper the factory — owned by San Antonio businessman James Leminger — probably was destroyed.

Back injury drops Sampras out of U.S. Open men's draw

NEW YORK (AP) — Lightning struck twice at the U.S. Open. The day started when Pete Sampras became the first top-seeded player to pull out of the U.S. Open before his first match since 1950.

So shocking were the exits of Sampras and Rafter that losses by sixth-seeded Tim Henman of Britain and No. 13 Alex Corretja of Spain on Day 2 of the year's final major tournament were almost overlooked.

Sampras was seeking a record 13th Grand Slam tournament men's singles title after tying Roy Emerson's mark by winning Wimbledon in July. Instead, Sampras withdrew from the Open after injuring his back during practice on Sunday.

Rafter was trying to become the third man since 1926 to win three straight titles at America's premier tennis event, joining John McEnroe and Ivan Lendl.

He was scheduled for an MRI today and planned to meet with doctors before deciding what treatment he will undergo.

Sampras never got to a court. Rafter made it to the fifth set before retiring with the score 4-6, 6-3, 7-5, 1-0.

Guillermo Canas of Argentina upset Henman 7-6 (7-1), 6-4, 6-3, and Australian Wayne Arthurs bounced Corretja 6-3, 6-4, 1-6, 4-6, 7-6 (8-6).

The women had no similar upsets as defending champion and No. 2 Lindsay Davenport led a parade of seeded women players into the second round.

Also winning first-round matches Tuesday were No. 4 Monica Seles, No. 5 Mary Pierce, No. 7 Serena Williams, No. 9 Julie Halard-Decugis, No. 11 Nathalie Tauziat, No. 14 Sandrine Testud and No. 16 Conchita Martinez.

Gone are Alexandra Stevenson, the surprising qualifier who reached the semifinals at Wimbledon, and the entire Black family of Zimbabwe: brothers Byron and Wayne along with sister Cara.
