Martinez was placed in custody a couple of hours after the shooting and was charged with the shooting death of his Hollingsworth, who is his mother-in-law.

Two weapons believed to be used in the homicides were thought to have been tossed into the Comanche Trail Park Lake. However, searches by the Big Spring Department Fire a

Service dive team were suspended after they came up empty handed. The weapons used are believed to be a .38caliber and a .25-caliber handgun.

Capital murder charges carry penalties of life imprisonment or the death penalty. In addition, bond that originally set for Martinez on the charge of shooting Hollingsworth has

Increased gasoline prices not only have motorist digging deeper in their pocket-

books when filling up their tanks but it also has city county and school administrators looking at increased budgets to compensate. McQUEARY

Big Spring Independent School District Superintendent Bill McQueary said that with the upcoming budget studies, gasoline prices will definitely be an item to look at

"We will definitely be taking into consideration the gas situation and the increase of the price we are paying," said McQueary. 'We will look very closely during the budget studies that will be coming up in a few weeks. We may have to cut back on some of our travel.

McQueary said that the five football games that are on the road to such places as Lubbock and Plainview are not really a problem. "We are only talking about five road games there and I am not too concerned about those," said McQueary. "It's those other frequent long-distance trips that I am more concerned with. I am, however, somewhat optimistic that the prices will soon be going down but we can't always count on that happening." McQueary said the school budget year runs from Sept. 1 through Aug. 31. Big Spring ISD board will begin working on the new budget next week.



Tax <u>rebate</u> Slight hike seen by city of Big Spring By BILL McCLELLAN News Editor

Big Spring saw a slight increase in sales tax rebates, comparing June of this year to the same month in 1999, according to the state comptroller's office.

The city received \$261,576.03 this June, compared to \$258,542.22 an increase of 1.17 percent. For the year, Big Spring has received \$1,783,996-49, up .29 percent from the same period a year ago.

With few exceptions, cities across the Big Spring area saw increases for the some of which month were substantial.

June's sales tax rebates were up 11.59 percent in Andrews, for instance, comparing \$47,694.94 to last year's \$42,737.59. For the year, sales tax rebates are at \$334,441.83, up 10.27 percent.

Big Spring bus terminal to receive \$100,000-plus in repairs and renovations

More than \$100,000 worth of repairs and improvements are planned for Big Spring's bus station after Greyhound Lines Inc. received almost \$2.7 million in federal funding for intercity bus projects from the Department of Texas Transportation (TxDOT).

State officials awarded more than \$5 million in federal funds to enhance intercity bus service across the Texas The state

Transportation Commission approved the measure during its monthly meeting.

Greyhound was one of eight transit entities that will share in the \$5.15 million and has earmarked its share of the funding for nine projects.

Big Spring's terminal, located at 311 E. Third St., was built during the mid-1960s and is in need of repair and renovation. Kristin according to

I have to say, though, that if there is a psychic disease of epidemic proportions in America among people of all races, religions and ethnic backgrounds today, it is avoiding responsibility. The U.S. government ought to change the national motto to "It Ain't My Fault." That, of course, is a surefire way to guarantee failure because anybody who wastes energy blaming others for his or her own shortcomings is a loser, pure and simple.

As a matter of fact, that's a common characteristic of petty criminals. Whatever they did, it's never their fault. Whenever you hear people repeating that theme, you might as well write them off. They are and always will be worthless to themselves, to their families and to their countries

It's important to study the past because it's easier in hindsight to see what worked and what didn't work. But it's a big mistake to get hung up in the past. The past was not our time, not our world, not our responsibility. The present is our time, our world and our responsibility

Better to make sure we don't foul up than to waste time pointing fingers at people long dead.

All we owe the people of the past is to look at them in the context of their own time, not in the context of our time. They, like us, fell out of the womb into an already existing society with already existing beliefs and institutions. Like us, they had no choice but to play the cards God dealt them.

It's our play now, and the pot is the future.

Harry Truman also made an excellent choice for his recovery time. His vacation house was in Key West, and at its heart a poker table and good friends who knew how to use it. Old Harry wore vacation shirts that never needed tucking in, brightly colored, often in a fish print. When it came to relaxing, the man had exquisite taste.

Jimmy Carter plugged into Musgrove Plantation on St. Simons Island to recharge. I once was privileged to see the outside of that sweet hideaway, tucked on the marsh side of and then



Computer program adds power to your debt payments

By DEBBIE L. JENSEN Feature's Editor

For the family that is barely treading water because of debt, or just can't seem to save anything after all the bills are paid, there are two new resources to help

Dana Tarter, Howard County extension agent family and consumer science, has a computer program that will give monthly debt payments more power. And a web site sponsored by the extension service will show you how small changes can add up to big savings.

"What you need to think about are your financial goals," Tarter said. "What do you need? A lot of times we confuse 'need' with 'want.'

These days many families are struggling under a large amount of credit card debt.

"The beginning of school is a good time to look at this, because there are going to be expenses school supplies and new clothes," Tarter said. "Ideally you are going to start saving for that ahead of time."

In addition, Tarter suggested looking at what are "must-haves" such as required school supplies, and what items - such as clothes — could be carried

HOW TO USE POWERPAY



CHEYENNE, Wyo. (AP) – When Lloyd Kortge goes to work, the commute can take two days and he sees more moose, elk, bison and bighorn sheep than people.

Kortge works at the Thorofare Ranger Station in the southeast corner of Yellowstone National Park, right in the heart of what mapping experts say is the most remote place in the continental United States.

"It's some great country," Kortge said. "It's just meadows and a big, wide valley. That big, wide valley is why they call it the Thorofare. It's a lot of country to poke around in."

To get to the station — a cabin, barn and corral – Kortge drives about 15 miles from his home. Then he saddles up

"It's a long trip, 32 miles for us by terms of actual distance as the crow horseback, and that is the shortest route," he said.

There are wide swaths of empty country across the Lower 48 states, from California's Mojave Desert to West Texas and Nebraska's Sandhills. But the ranger station was pegged as the most remote place by Susan Boswell, president of Cartographic Technologies in Brattleboro, Vt. Her company was asked by an automaker to find the place most distant from a publicly maintained road.

Analyzing Census Bureau records, she found that roads are "uncomfortably close" nearly everywhere. The nearest road to the Thorofare Ranger Station is only 20 miles away.

"There's nothing around, but in

The second-most remote spot is in the Bob Marshall Wilderness in Montana, 18 miles from a road. Third is in the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness Area in Idaho, 16 miles from a road.

The Thorofare station is near the heavily forested Teton Wilderness. To the east is the Trident, a 10,778-foot plateau, and to the north and west is the valley of the Yellowstone River, which flows north into Yellowstone Lake.

Along the river, "you can hear geese or cranes or loons," Kortge said. "There are all types of birds."







DEAR ABBY: There is a common misunderstanding that all blood comes from the Red Cross. In fact, while the Red Cross provides about 46 percent of the nation's blood, a network of independent, nonprofit, community-focused blood banks supply 47 percent of America's blood. Hospital-owned blood banks provide about 7 percent.

For the 72 community blood banks who work 24 hours a day to assure enough blood is available for the critically ill and injured in their respective communities, this is an important distinction. 





In about 1700, a harpsichord maker, Bartolomeo Cristofori, invented a brand-new instrument for an Italian prince. It would change music forever.



Its sound comes from plucking metal strings. There is no way to change the volume.

But Cristofori's invention was different. Its music was made by little hammers striking the strings.

The harder musicians hit the keys, the louder the sound was. Now musicians could control the softness or loudness of the music.

People thought this was so amazing that they named the new instrument the "soft loud," or "pianoforte" in Italian. Over time, people shortened pianoforte to piano.



The popular piano

By the end of the 1700s, the piano was an important status symbol in Europe and the American Colonies. At that time a skilled worker would have to give up

almost a whole year's salary to buy a grand piano. It was a luxury only the wealthy could afford. Fifty years later, the price had dropped enough so that more and more people could afford one. It became quite fashionable for middle-class

homes to have a piano. This issue is based on the exhibit: "PIANO

300: Celebrating Three Centuries of People and Pianos" at the Smithsonian Internationa Gallery in Washington, D.C. It will run until June 3, 2001.

In 1942, Harold Rhodes designed a special piano to help servicemen injured in World War II. These pianos were small enough to be played in bed by wounded airmen recovering in hospitals. He used parts from wrecked airplanes to make his



instrument for many rock musicians. With today's electronic pianos, musicians can just press a key and get a variety of sounds.

With digital pianos there are no hammers striking the strings. When a musician touches the keys, prerecorded notes are played.

Computer discs have replaced paper rolls in today's player pianos. Musicians can even put discs in the piano and record their own playing.
