Government. The Supreme Court refused to pass upon that question.

What we are trying to do now is to get the title cleared up and the rightful ownership of Texas confirmed. It is an issue that means a lot to us. The revenues from such lands are set aside for the education of our children and they are important.

But even more important is the question of justice to Texas. There are far greater questions involved in this issue than mere money. Those lands are ours by solemn and binding agreements. Our title has been confirmed by


treaty, by Congressional resolution, and by Court decisions dating back over the years. We cannot permit them to be taken away at the last minute. We are determined that Texas shall receive its just due. We will fight this out to the end and I believe we will win.

New Notes in Cooking

Easy on the cook—easy on the budget. Accent*-seasoned canned corn (with chopped green pepper and onion for flavor) baked in a shallow dish with little pork links on top. The sausage flavor bakes into the corn—the whole affair smells so tantalizing—the family eats so heartily. Wonderful one-dish supper.

Here's a "flavor" tip for pot-roast. Rub a little powdered ginger on roast just before you dredge the meat with flour in preparation for searing and browning.

Two accompaniments no hearty soup will scorn—a bowl of sour cream and a bowl of tiny sausage balls (poached in water until done). Spoon some of each into the soup bowl according to taste.

Fold cooked spaghetti, grated cheese and a bit of chopped onion into condensed tomato soup and simmer until the ingredients are well blended. Arrange on your prettiest platter; top with broiled frankfurters, sprinkle on a little Accent* for even flavors.

If fried chicken needs a garnish, try half-slices (fairly thick ones) of fresh lemon, studded with whole cloves or "laced" with strips of pimento.

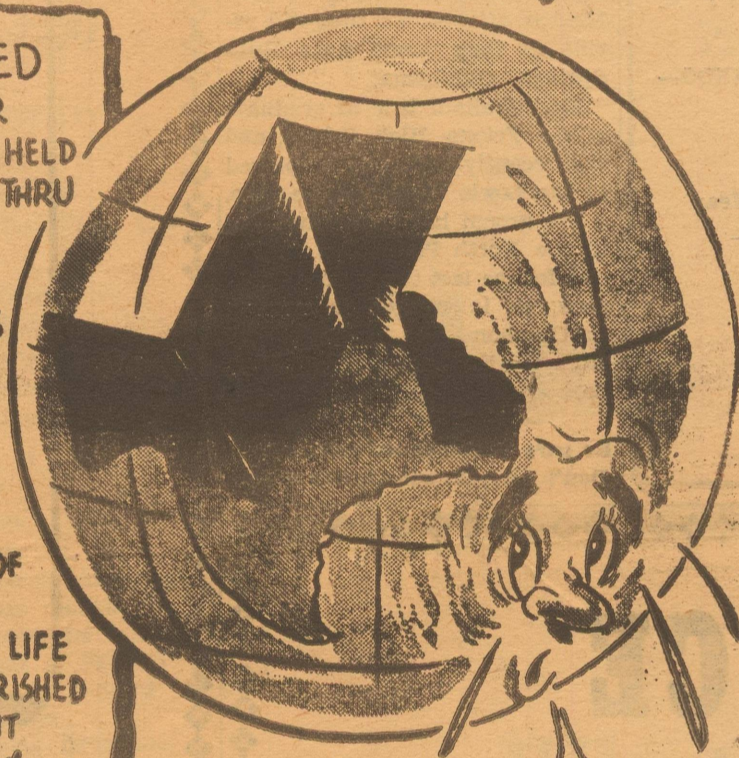

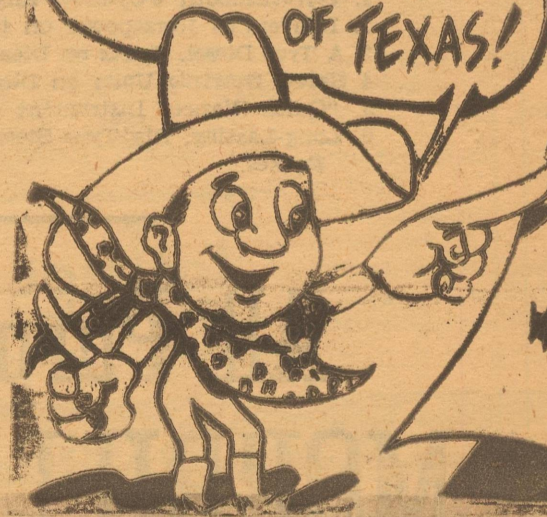

debts that are presently owed by business concerns, municipalities, individuals and the Federal Government are fixed amounts that were incurred in dollars of approximately the same value as at present. A drastic and immediate increase in the value of the dollar would simply mean a corresponding increase in outstanding indebtedness per centage-wise. It would also mean a corresponding decline in the value of goods and of course wages. The President has placed in his cabinet a number of outstanding business men who have full knowledge and understanding of the problems involved, and I do not think that they are going to take any steps that could result in a major recession and a possible depression.

Washington was a city of receptions during the past several days for the President and his opponent whom he defeated in the November election, Gov. Adlai Stevenson. There were several receptions for Governor Stevenson during his short stay in Washington, the highlight of his visit being of course his meeting and conference with the President. 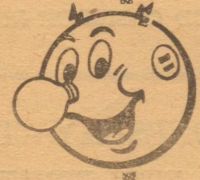

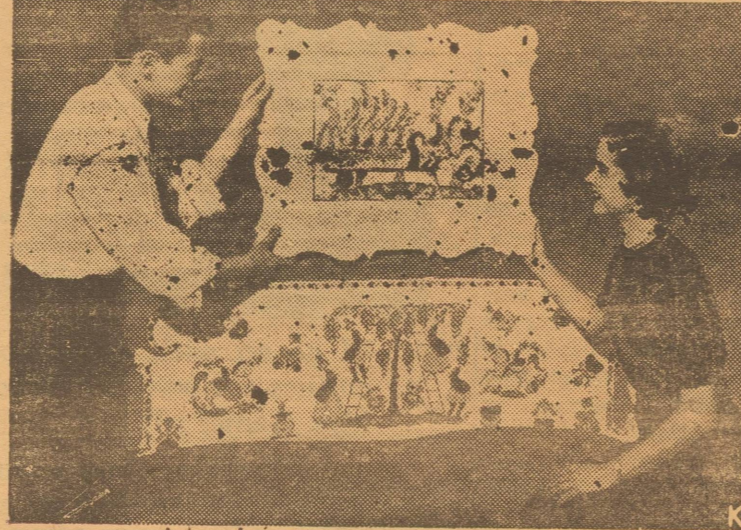

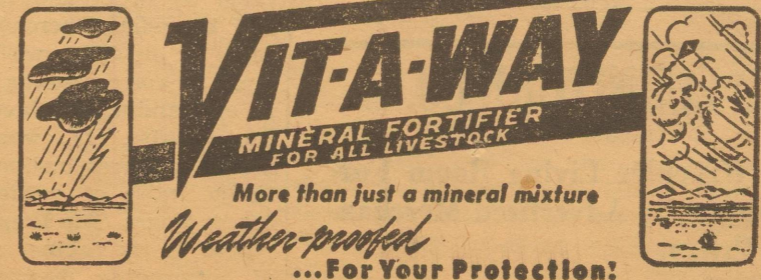
