**Chain-chain-chain**

**Youngsters provide links to curing cancer**

Colored construction paper chains decorate the hallways of Moss Elementary, symbolizing the culmination of the students' efforts to help find a cure for cancer.

In Links for a Cure, Moss students — along with those from Bauer,

Coahoma, Elbow and Marcy — sell paper chain links for 10 cents apiece to raise money for Relay for Life, the largest American Cancer Society fund-rais-

er of the year.

The links concept was first conceived by Relay for Life co-chairman Diane Wood, who had heard of a similar program.

Wood tailored the program to fit Howard County schools in hopes of creating an awareness

**8-liner operators warned  
to operate within the law**

They feature brightly colored video screens and cheerful sounds. Each one has eight ways to win on every play. And now the Texas Supreme Court has ruled them illegal.

For years eight-liner video games — a kind of video slot machine — sneaked through a loophole in state gambling law designed to allow games with small non-cash prizes.

"There is an exclusion in the penal code where non-cash prizes were exempted," said Howard County Attorney Mike Thomas. "That was intended for machines that give a prize like a stuffed animal."

However, eight-liner businesses used the exclusion to offer valuable gift certificates to retail outlets. The Texas Supreme Court put a stop to that April 3.

"The Texas Supreme Court ruled in Hardy v. State that the eight-liners are gambling devices," Thomas added.

Thomas, Big Spring Police Chief Lonnie Smith and Howard County Sheriff Dale Walker met with local eight-liner operators Friday to explain the decision.

"The county attorney explained his viewpoint of what the Texas

"If they are operating illegally, then arrest warrants will be sought, and search and seizure warrants will be sought as well for civil forfeiture."

Supreme Court handed down," Smith said. "What his intent was and what his understanding was was that eight-liners are a gambling device and if they are operated the owners can and will be prosecuted for it."

Smith said the state law does offer some exemptions and it's up to the business owner to decide whether to continue to operate and test the law.

"I explained from the law enforcement view that if they felt like they are legal, keep operating," he said. "Those that are in operation as of 8 a.m. Monday, we will make note of them. We will probably contact another agency and possibly conduct undercover operations at some point

**Peterson named year's  
Conservation Farmer at  
Howard SWCD banquet**

Craig Peterson has been named Conservation Farmer of the Year by the Howard Soil and Water Conservation District.

Peterson received the award during the District's annual awards banquet Tuesday. Also presented were poster contest winners from Crossroads area schools.

"Craig has proven himself to be an excellent conservation farmer," said Eddy Spurgin, district conservationist with the Natural Resources

Conservation Service. "He realizes that farming in a low rainfall area makes it extremely important to capture the limited rainfall that falls on his dryland cotton farms."

Peterson practices such conservation measures as constructing numerous basin terraces, furrow diking and contour farming.

"All of these conservation practices help in capturing and storing rainfall that falls on his cotton fields," said Spurgin.

"Craig also does an outstanding job of maintaining his terraces on his 48 inch solid pattern cotton. These terraces, in conjunction with contour farming, not only conserve water and soil, but

also increase cotton yields. Research has shown that for every inch of rainfall that can be saved on a farm, that

improves cotton lint yields by 50 pounds."

Peterson graduated from Borden County High School in 1980 and began

farming in 1982. He and his wife, Terri, have two children, 13-year-old

of the disease among the participants.  
"It is set for a two-week period of time," Wood said. "Kids buy chain links for 10 cents apiece and place the name of a survivor or someone who had died of cancer on the chain link."

Then, the links transform into more than paper chains.  
"The links don't just represent money but they represent people who have been touched by cancer in some way," said Debra Barton, Coahoma Elementary administrative assistant.

In Coahoma, efforts by the 440 pre-kindergarten through sixth grade students yielded more than \$1,400.

"Originally, we wanted to display the links all around the school but we had such an incredible response it wasn't possible," Barton said. "We left seven large yellow trash

bags full of links at the office so the students could see. There were more than 14,000 links."

Moss Elementary is continuing its fund-raising effort through the end of April. Third and fourth graders are in a race with the kindergarten through second and special education students to sell enough links to create a chain that runs down their respective hallway and back, said third grade teacher Jackie Swinney.

Each school chain will be displayed during opening ceremonies of the annual Relay for Life, set May 9-10 at Blankenship Field.

"Friday night, we will have some of the kids stretch the chain out," Wood said. "The one with the longest chain wins. We will then hang those links on the inside of the fence around the event."

in time. If they are operating legally, then they'll never know we were there. They'll never know anything about it."

If the undercover officers discover illegal activity, it'll be a different story, Smith added.

"If they are operating illegally, then arrest warrants will be sought, and search and seizure warrants will be sought as

well for civil forfeiture," he said.

Smith wouldn't say whether local businesses seem to be complying with the law.

"The choice is up to them. It's their decision. They can do what they feel is necessary," he said. "They've all been in contact, they all know what the law is. So we put it to them. I'm not going to say we've been down checking on any of them and I'm not going to say we haven't been checking

on them."

Walker said eight-liner businesses in the county seem to be shutting down the machines.

"What we've seen in the county is that people are complying with the law," he said. "If we have any complaints we will start an investigation on their business. We've already told them they don't want to go that route because not only do they stand a chance of losing their equipment but the way the law is written we can

even go in and freeze their bank accounts."

Since businesses in the county that operate eight-liners are primarily bars, Walker added that they can also lose their liquor license if they are caught illegally operating eight-liners.

Attempts to reach local owners of eight-liner machines for comment were unsuccessful.
