same. It lies in making the motorist realize his responsibility, to make him act on the highways as he wants others to ac cident prevention. Their violation is responsible for ninety per int of all accidents.

The time is always ripe for campaigns to educate motor iss. Such campaigns should be continuous, as they are in industry They should be intensive and well-directed. Last year we lowered
the automobile accident rate a trifle-this year every driver should make it his personal business to create a real safety record
