CHICKEN: No. 1 or 2 can ground

chicken; No. 1 or 2 cap boned chicken (both white and dark meat.)

An entry is 3 cans of one product prepared by the same individual. An individual may enter as many meat products as desired.

Only tin containers can be entered because meat canned in glass is so seriously damaged in flavor and texture that it cannot compete favorably with meat products canned in


