CITATION BY PUBLICATION

THE STATE OF TEXAS

TO: Ernest John Graeter, Defendant, Greeting:

You are hereby commanded to appear before the Honorable District Court of Coryell County at the Court House thereof, in Gatesville, Texas, at or before 10 o'clock A. M. of the first Monday next after the expiration of forty-two days from the date of the issuance of this citation, same being the 19th day of February A. D. 1943, then and there to answer Plaintiff's Petition filed in said Court, on the 21st day of Oct. A.D. 1942, in this cause, numbered 5078 on the docket of said court and styled Tina N. Graeter, Plaintiff, vs. Ernest John Graeter Defendant.

A brief statement of the nature of this suit is as follows, to wit: Tina N. Graeter, plaintiff, sues Ernest John Graeter, defendant, for a divorce, dissolving the marriage relationship between plaintiff and defendant; that plaintiff and defendant were legally married on or about October 15, 1927; that plaintiff is an actual bona-fide inhabitant of the State of Texas, and has resided in the State of Texas, for a period of more than 12 months next preceding the filing of said petition for divorce; that plaintiff is also an actual bona-fide inhabitant of Coryell County, Texas, and has resided in Coryell County, Texas, for a period of more than six months next preceding the filing of her petition for divorce; that defendant is and was guilty of excesses cruel treatment and outrages toward plaintiff of such nature as to render their further living together insupportable, calling her ugly and vile names, greatly humiliating her, causing her much mental anguish and pain; that there was born unto the plaintiff and defendant the following children, Marie Graeter, a girl aged 13 years; Ruth Graeter, a girl aged 11 years; Bertie Faye, a girl aged 10 years, Lena Graeter, a girl aged 8 years, Bettie Graeter, a girl aged 6 years, John Graeter a boy aged 4 years, and Ernest Jr. Graeter, a boy aged 2 years; that said children are now in possession of defendant and she asks for the care, custody and control of said minor children; Alleging that defendant is financially able to support said minor children and for the court to adjudge defendant support them in an amount suitable to their station in life and for her attorneys fees, and costs of court as is more fully shown by Plaintiff's Petition on file in this suit.

The officer executing this process shall promptly execute the same according to law, and make due return as the law directs.

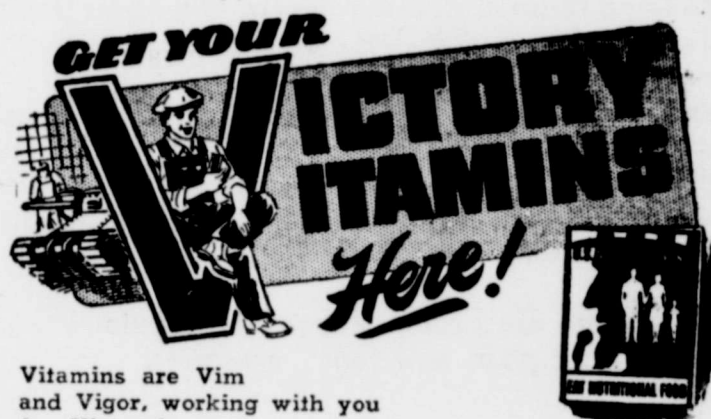
