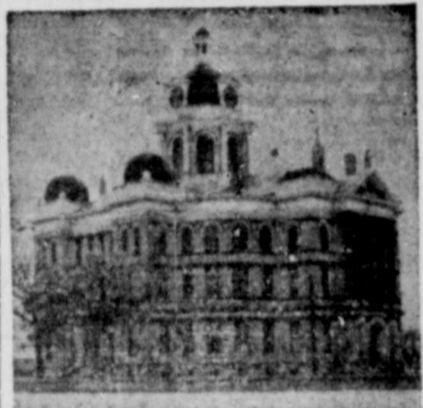

133 BOMBERS BLAST PARIS

London, April 4 (AP).—One of the biggest armadas of American 4-motored bombers ever dispatched from British bases, 133 of them swarmed Paris Sunday raining destruction on the outlying Renault motor and armament works with such deadly effectiveness that returning crews declared they "don't" see how anything can be left there now.

NAZIS HATING FRENCH IN GERMANY

London, April 4, (AP). — The Berlin Radio announced Sunday the transfer to German jails of 2 former French Premiers, Edouard Deladier and Leon Blum, and the former Allied military leader, Gen. Maurice Gustave Gamelin, because of a "planned Anglo-American coup de main" which might free them and lead to their use against Adolf Hitler.

USICANS SMASH AFRICAN POSTS

N. Africa, Apr. 4 (AP).—The 2nd U. S. Army Corps, overrunning Axis defense posts and wiping out mortar nests, has unleashed a successful drive thru the difficult hills east of El Gueitar toward a junction with the

British 8th Army, a communique said Sunday.

CHINKS STILL LETTIN' 'EM HAVE IT

Chungking, April 4 (AP).—Continued clashes along the Peiping-Hankow railway north of Sinyang, Jap base in S. Honan Province, were reported Sunday by the Chinese high command.

8 RAIDS IN DAY AT KISKA

Washington Apr. 4 (AP).—Carrying out the heaviest raids yet made on Kiska in the Aleutians, American heavy and medium bombers poured bombs on the Jap base in 3 separate assaults, the navy reported today.

BIG GUNS LOB 'EM OVER CHANNEL

London, April 5 (AP).—Big guns opened a duel across the Straits of Dover just after midnight today, the British getting in the first blow.

NAZIS SMASH AT DONET LINE

London, Apr. 5 (UP).—Germany in a strong but futile bid to crack the Russian Donets river line, has lost more than 100 men killed, nine tanks knocked out, 30 infantry trucks destroyed and 7 planes downed in a day of heavy

fighting south of Izyum, Russia's Sunday night communique said.

PASSENGER TRAINS IN HEAD-ON CRASH

Little Rock, Apr. 4 (UP).—The engineer of a Rock Island passenger train was killed and 25 persons hospitalized today as the result of a head on collision between the Flyer and a troop train 3 miles east of Little Rock. First reports from military police indicated that the death toll, if any would be exceptionally small.

HOUSEWIVES ASKED TO KO BLACK MARKET

Washington, Apr. 4 (UP).—The office of war information tonight appealed to housewives to help stamp out black market operations in meat by refusing to pay more than established ceiling prices.

LOWER DRAFT CALLS IN APR.

Washington, Apr. 4 (AP).—The government has intensified its effort to get men into war work by announcing that the 38 to 45 year olds may be drafted unless they leave non-essential jobs for more essential labor, and at the same time has made an "administrative" reduction in the state draft calls for this month.
