

> The Regulations have also been amended to provide for the issuance of all "B" books outside the gasoline shortage area for a period of three months.

> Basic, transport and special rations issued for leased vehicles will continue to expire at the end of the period for which the ration is issued. When issuing a "B" or a ration for a leased vehicles, the "C" book as a Special ration or as words "earlies renewal" on the cover of the book should be crossed out and the word "expiration" should be inserted.




