PARIS. Nov. 7. 1918, 2 P. M.-The greatest war of all times came to an end at $2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. today, The allies and Germany signed an armistice three hours earlier on the field of battle. Early this morning the German delcgaion passed tiru the altied lines under a white flag and immediately signed the capitulation.
