> "Whooping cough is usually transmitted by direct contact with the secretions of the mouth or nose, and only a very short exposure is required to contract the infection. Handkerchiefs, drinking cups and toys may also transmit the infection.

> "The infection is communicable from the appearance of the first symptoms and is most contagious at this early period when the nature of the affection can only be suspected. seven days. A slight fever, running of the nose, and cough make their appearance so gradually and insidiously that a diagnosis is practically impossible unless a history of exposure is obtained.

"When the whoop appears there is no mistaking the disease. If there is gold. whooping cough in your community, keep other children away from your little children and keep your children at home. Call your family physician early. Isolation of all cases for at least two weeks from the development of the characteristic whoop should be rigidly enforced."

1937 Cotton Adjustment Payment

With the time for marketing the 1937 Parmer County Cotton Crop rapidly drawing near it is important that those who are planning to participate in the 1937 Cotton Adjustment Payments be sure that they take care of the steps necessary for them to be in line for these payments, which will be made in the late part of the spring of 1938, at the time they can prove compliance with the 1938 Agricultural Conservation Program, which is necessary for them to be in line for payment. Producers selling cotton this fall should be sure to take the following steps:

1. Have the purchaser of their cotton give them a sales receipt showing the amount of lint cotton bought by the buyer, the exact date which the purchase was made, and this should be signed by the purchaser or his authorized agent.

2. File the original of this receipt with the secretary of the County Agricultural Conservation Association, who is the county Agent. This should be filed within fifteen days after date of sale. These receipts may be mailed to the County Agent's office.

3. If the producer is operating more than one farm in the county he should be sure to designate which of the farms he is operating produced the cotton covered by the receipts. If the producer has a worksheet under the 1937 A. C. P. filed on the land it is a good practice to indicate on the receipt the serial number of the worksheet covering the farm on which the cotton was produced.

Forms will be made available to producers and cotton buyers at a very early date but a receipt containing the above mentioned information should be made on all cotton sold before forms are made available. The regular government forms will then be made out for these sales as soon as the forms are available.

Producers should be certain tha all cotton which they sell and wish to put in for payment must be evidenced by these sales certificates or receipts in order to be eligible for the

FSA Arranges for Long Term Loans in Erosion Area

AMARILIO, Texas-Recognising the exceptional conditions obtaining in the wind erosion area of the Southwest and the necessity for e lending arrangement which must be adapted to the needs of that situation, the Farm Security Administraton, Region 12, with headquarters at Amarillo, Texas, has been authorized. under special circumstances, to make loans to farmers with repayments extending over a period of 10 years.

This announcement was made this week by Regional Director L. H. Hauter, following receipt of a communication from Secretary of Agriculture Henry A. Wallace, who outlined the following reasons and objectives for this federal agency to make long-term loans:

1. An economic unit sufficiently large to maintain a family on a satisfactory basis while following the type of agriculture most suitable to the land in this real

2. Control by the borrows lease or otherwise of an economic unit for a sufficient length of time to restore the land to its suitable use and to warrant the borrower in making improvements of the soil or equipment which are necessary for the effective operation of the farm or ranch.

3. The provision of suitable foundation herds which may be used for the development of the family unit with principal emphasis on livestock

4. The provision of credit for a sufficient length of time in order to permit borrowers with small means to put into effect the above men tioned practices.

5. A system of repayments which will recognize the variability of form returns in the region.

Mr. Hauter said the new long-term policy will enable farmers to follow more closely those programs designed to salvage eroded lands and return them to their best economic uses Under such a policy it will no longer be necessary for a borrower to gamble on large acreages of cash crops, such as wheat. It will also enable those farmers living on farms or The Homemaking Club had its ranches, which are too small for their operations, to lease adjacent land over a period of years with an option, where feasible, to purchase the land at the termination of the lease.

DENTON, October 7—Even the best of huntsmen may not know of the unusual laws tucked away in the state game regulatons of Texas. Among the "don'ts" one finds that it is unlawful to kill or injure a bat. presumably because these birds are so destructive to harmful bugs and

Deer hunters must remember not to use any sort of deer call except deer horns, which may be rattied. Nor can one hunt at just any hour during the season; between sunset and sunrise the huntsmen must forbear shooting at any game animal. Game animals which must not be killed at any time are turkey hens, doe deer, fawn or spike buck.

Prey of Texas Hunters For conversational purposes nonhunters may be interested in knowing just what kind of game lures their fellow Texans to the chase. Listed as game animals are deer, elk, antelope, wild sheep, bear and squirrels. Among the game birds are turkeys, ducks, geese, brant, grouse, prairie chickens, pheasants, quail or partridge wild pigeons, doves, snipes, chachalaca, plover and shore birds of all varieties.

Fur-bearing animals, on which a tax must be paid, include badger, civet cat, fox, mink, muskrat, opossum, polecat, skunk, raccoon, beaver and ringtail cat.


