W. Coz, State Mealth Officer <br> Austin. Texas, Jan. 18-"Texas is faced with the probability of local smallpox epidemics if precautions are not immediately employed," declared Dr. Geo. W. Cox, State Health Officer. "Last year there was not a single death from smallpox in Texas, while last wieek over thirty cases and two deaths were reported. <br> Smallpox epidemics would never occur it everyone, and especially children, could be effectively vaccinated. The lack of vaccination causes the present menace of this disease. Modern safeguards have removed every legitimate objection to vaccination. The virus is made from calves, and, consequently, is incapable of transmitting human blood dlseases. <br> A primary vaccination with one successful revaccination will, as a rule, protect throughout life from the milder forms of smallpox, but this is not true in he severer types of this disease.
