





The few small manufacturers of 30 years ago advertised to sell their primitive cars, which cost around \$3,000 for a "mediumpriced" model. They created a bigger demand than they could fill, and so bigger factories, increased employment, constantly better automobiles resulted. And today we can buy an infinitely superior car for about one-fifth of the price while half a million men are directly employed in the industry, compared to a few thousand at the time this picture was taken.

AUSTIN.-It should be good news to Tom, Dick and Harry that unemployment insurance starts in Texas next Saturday, January 1st. It means to these workers that in the event they lose their jobs in 1938, they will have a windfall to

help out until they can secure employment.

Who doesn't remember those depressing days of 1933 when men walked the streets searching for employment, knowing that their cash reserve, if any, was rapidly dwindling? These men had no hope of help then from the government, only a blind faith that somehow we would "muddle through." To prevent the recurrence of those cruel days, something has been done about it!

1938 marks a new era as the state and federal governments jointly enter upon the humanitarian program of the president by assisting out of work employees in finding new employment and in providing him with funds during unemployment. Already in the field are sixty employees of the Texas Unemployment Commission stationed at twelve district offices ready to serve the 12,600 employers and 875,000 employees who are enrolled under the Texas Unemployment Compensation act.

In almost every town in Texas, the Texas State Employment Service has an office where the unemployed may register for work. Every effort will be made by the service office to place the applicants. During the past few months scores of thousands have secured jobs in private employment arranged through the Employment

Under the Compensation Act, if Fom, Dick and Harry lose their himself in his job. jobs, these men must go to the employment service office in their town and register for work. During a 2 weeks period in which time applicants must report once a wek to the office, every effort will be made to find them jobs. If the search is fruitless, these men will be entitled to receive cash benefits payable weekly. The maximum payment is \$15 weekly, minimum \$2, but they will be eligible for benefit payments not more than sixteen weeks in one year, provided that their earnings have been sufficient to allow it.

If the applicants are receiving Workmen's Compensation or Old Age Assitsance, unless the assistance is a less amount than the individual would be entitled to under the law, they will not be eligible for benefits.

An employe to be eligible under the law must have been employed by an employer of 8 or more persons find he has no further means of and his wages must have been re- enjoyment. ported to the Unemployment Comsion by that employer under the employee's name and social security account number.

Every employer is being furnished ing the proper form of reports and the method of filing of claims of benefits. Shortly after the enactment of the Federal Security Act. AUSTIN, Texas,-"There is very being as follows, to-w good excuse at the holiday season to crowd into the day and night as much pleasure as possible. It is the one time of the year when every-day mer County. Texas affairs take second place. In so far as individual possibilities permit, the fiesta spirit prevails. That many persons are "short" on rest and relaxation at this time is evident to all. W. Cox, State Health Officer.

"Hospitals have many patients who are there solely because their desire for so-called relaxation persistently overcomes their judgment regarding nature's demands. And many thousands of others, for the same reason, are depriving themselves of abundant vitality and maximum health without which life cannot be lived at its best.

Doubtlessly there never has been a time in history when it is easier to remain in high-gear day and night than now.
