



Truman Tuesday As of two weeks before the election, neither the Republicans not the States Rights Party had won enough supporters to challenge the Democratic nominee's traditional hold on Texas voters.


On November 7, 1867, just 81 years ago this week, Marie Sklodowska was born in Warsaw. Later removing to Paris, she married Pierre Curie and with him discovered radium, the element used in the treatment of cancer and other diseases. In 1898, after her marriage to Pierre, the couple found'a new metal, polonium, while investigating pitchblende. 6 months later they discovered radium. In 1934 Mme. 


