

Agents of Central Texas attended a cotton meeting at Hillsboro, A February 9, for more education on cotton insects and their control. Early season dusting with 3-5-40 will control the group of insects which will hit early. The three ingredients mentioned above include BHC, DDT and Sulphur. There will be more about cotton later. Sandy lands and loams should have 150 lbs. of fertilizer applied two weeks ahead of planting. Thrips cost farmers heavily in this county in 1948. This insect is easily controlled with 7 to 10 lbs of 3-5-40.

Main objection to teaching religion in public schools, according to comments collected in this poll, is the-difficulty of satisfying all denominations. Some people say it would be impossible to find the

right teachers. Dr. Fosdick has an answer: What about economics? he asks. this is a course of study that offers the same objections. Yet the public schools have a way of teaching economics. The same could be true in teaching non-sectarian religion. Teachers who preach sectarian doctrine could be expelled just like those who use their economics courses for

propaganda purposes. Hundreds of thousands of Texans would agree with Dr. Fosdick, especially on the teaching of the Bible. In 1941, The Texas Poll asked a cross section of the adult population this question: "Do you believe courses in Bible should be taught in Texas public schools?" A two-thirds majority answered "yes". Typical comment of the majority was that "if such teaching is kept non-sectarian, it could be offered to all children as the greatest book of all time." But a good-sized minority objected. They couldn't trust the teaching to be "non-sectarian." "What Bible," asked an El Paso man, "Protestant, Catholic, or Jewish? I'm against it."


