

New F-M Highways Are Okehed By State Hwy Department: Funds Sept.

In a release from the Texas Highway Department, Coryell County will get, in Bill No. 287, 15.2 more miles of Farm-to-Market highway. This work, of course, is subject to the condition that Coryell County will furnish all required right-of-way free of cost to the State. They are: "From end F-M 182 at Turnersville to end of F-M 928 at Bosque County line, a distance of approximately 7.2 mi." "From end F-M 183 at Purmela to Hamilton County line, a distance of approximately 7.6 miles" "From end F-M 185 at Osage East to McLennan County line, a distance of approximately 0.4 mi." On acceptance of the provisions of this order by the proper officials of Coryell County the State Highway Engineer is directed to proceed with the preparation of plans for construction at an estimated cost of \$150,100 and when right-of-way and funds are available to proceed with the construction and to assume the roads for maintenance upon completion of construction.

Wednesday night, the official schedule starts, and will pit Gatesville vs Purmela at 8:15. Thursday, Turnersville vs Pearl and Friday, Coryell City vs Evant. The "main stems" of the Board have not announced other activities will take place tonight, but it was once rumored the Gatesville High School Band would be present, and of course, other notables.

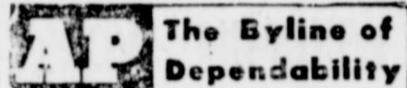
Legion Names Cummings Head: Other Officials Named Also

"ARNAMA Reorganization Sent To Congress

WASHINGTON, D. C. July 18. (AP)—President Truman today sent to Congress his reorganization plan designed to tighten unification of the Army, Navy and Marines. He said he wanted to provide "a sure means whereby all members of Congress will be able to vote" on improving the defense organization in case legislation with that in mind does not pass. Such legislation now is in Congress, but if Congress does not disapprove Truman's plan, the reorganization will take place without passage of the unification bills.

Brannan Urges Food Handlers Investigation

WASHINGTON, D. C. July 18. (AP)—Agriculture Secretary Brannan urged Congress today to center its monopoly investigation on the food manufacturing and transportation industries and varied marketing practices affecting the farm income. "Marketing charges in the food industries are holding up while prices are going down," he said. "The entire difference in cost to consumers is coming out of the farmers' prices—none out of the middleman's margins." He spoke before the house monopoly investigating committee.



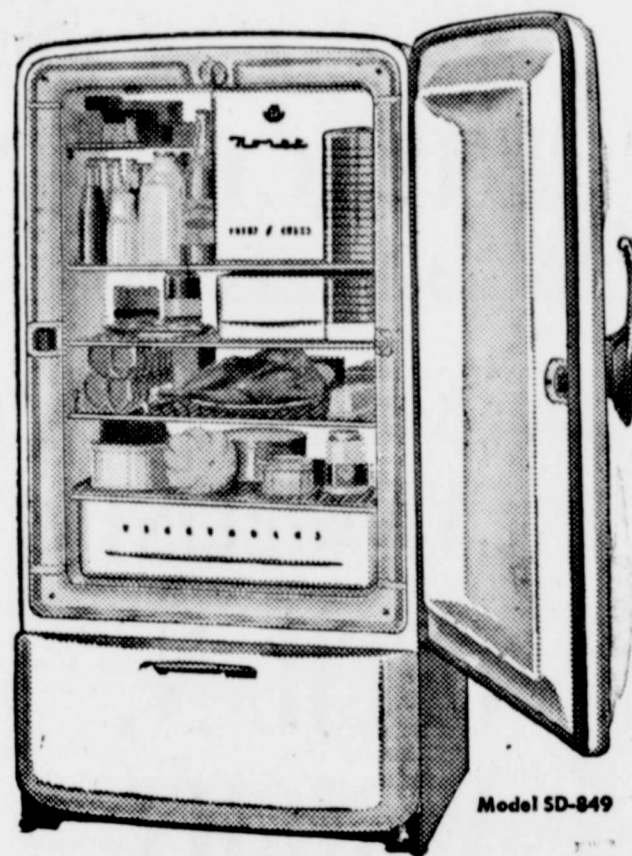

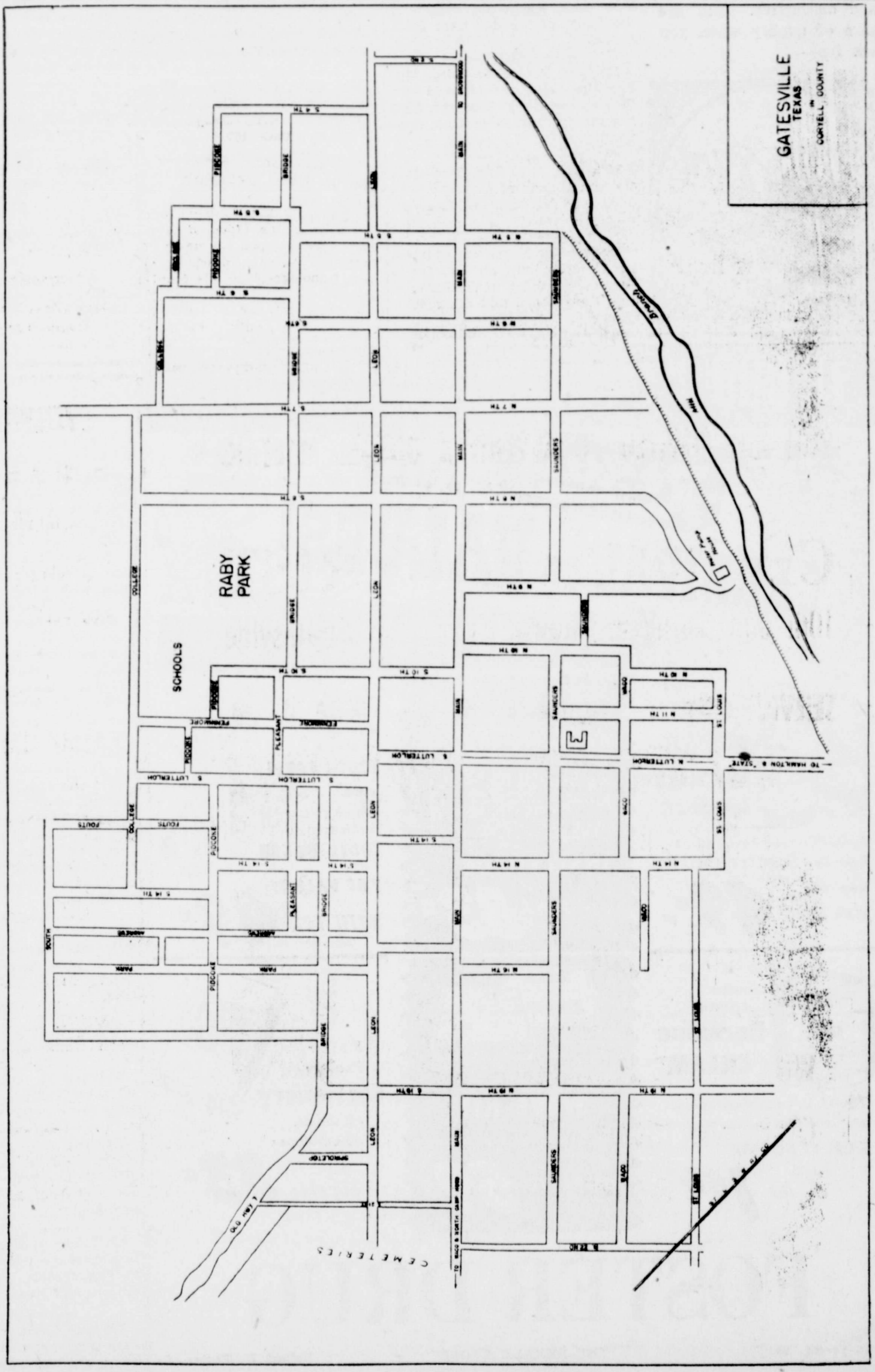

AUSTIN, Texas, July 16.—The elevation of Allan Shivers to the governorship by the death of Gov. Beauford Jester is bound to improve his chances for the Democratic nomination in 1950. But even before fate thrust upon him the job of chief executive, he already had the inside track to win it in next year's elections. Twice in recent months The Texas Poll has conducted statewide surveys to measure the relative popularity of prospective candidates for governor. Both times Shivers placed first. The most recent survey was completed just one week before Governor Jester died. A cross section of qualified voters was shown even names, listed in alphabetic order, and asked this question: "Here are the names of some men who may run for Governor of Texas next year. Which one do you think would make the best governor?"

Carlos Ashley, state senator representing the Austin district, became the latest prospect in June when he announced seriously considering running for governor to put a stop to "gravy-train government." His remarks were interpreted by political observers as a side-swipe at Shivers, then presiding over the senate as lieutenant governor.

Ashley's low standing in the poll is an indication that he is relatively unknown over the state.

The fact that Shivers will have had the advantage of more than a year in the office before next year's primaries may influence the final decision of some of the men who have been planning to enter the race.

Only Caso March, former Baylor University law professor, has committed himself publicly. Unsuccessful in two previous campaigns for governor, he has announced he will continue running until elected.

Until recently, Attorney General Price Daniel, Railroad Commissioner Olin Culberson, and Land Commissioner Bascom Giles have all been regarded as almost certain candidates. State Superintendent L. A. Woods on several occasions has remarked he may run since his job was abolished by the Gilmer-Aikin school reform legislation.
