"From end F-M 183 at Purmela to Hamilton County line, a distance of approximately 7.6 miles' "From end F-M 185 at Osage East to McLennan County line, a

distance of approximately 0.4 mi. On acceptance of the provisions of this order by the proper officials of Coryell County the State Highway Engineer is directed to proceed with the preparation of plans for construction at an estimated soct of \$150,100 and when right-of-way and funds are available to proceed with the construction and to assume the roads for maintenance upon completion of construction.
