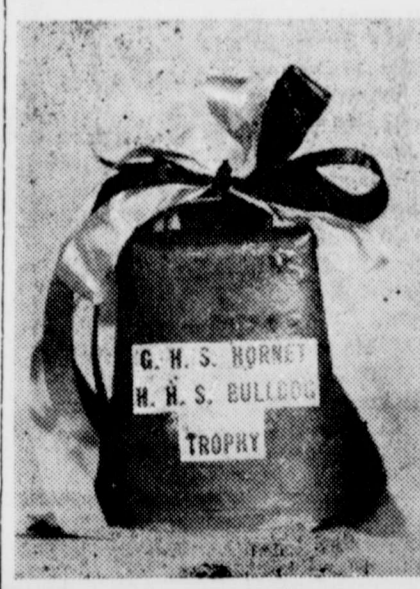
100 or more points.
