 Levita And PancakeFriday in Austin, local citizens appeared at a public hearing before the State Highway Commis sion, asking for 2 FM highways in Corvell County.
Hearling the representatives was County Judge Norman C

## Storm.

One highway would be from St. Hwv. 36 north to the present FM 217 at Pancake, a distance of 4.5. The other from FM 2412 near Levita, north to FM 217, and would require a bridge over the Leon River.
Storm asked that the roads be placed high on the list when the commission plans Coryell road
work, and the Commission said it would consider the proposals, and noted that Coryell is not over its FM road quota.

\section*{Texas' Civil War Centennial Plans Being Made

AUSTIN, Tex. Feb. 4. (AP) Texas will play a considerable part in the many Civil War Centennial commemorations planned throughout the nation in 1961 to 1905. Centennial Commission recently, Gov. Price Daniel noted that 59 military battles and events took place in Texas during the Civi War.
Daniel named the 18 member of the State Historical Surve Commitiee and 15 members at arge to make up the Centennial commission. Walter Long, Austin was made state chairman, and Gegrge W. Hill executive director of she State Historical Committee was made director of the commis sion.
Hill said Historical Survey Com mittees in 220 counties will work e Confederate tons in cooperation with the Daug ters of the Confederacy and other Cowfederate groups, including the Chilldren of the Confederacy, Sons of Confederate Veterans, and Civil War Round Tables.
The Daughters of the Confederac
annal observances beginnin in 1961 and continuing through 1965 at various points throughout Texas including Sabine Pass, Gal veston and Palmetto Ranch. Hill said the Historical Survey, efforts will center around seven activities:

1. Construction of the Texas burfederate Monument at Vicks the $\$ 100,000$ appropriation by the 56th Legislature.
2. Designation of the new State Courts building as the Texas Confederate Memorial with a memor ial foyer, as provided by constitu tional amendment.
3. Inclusion of the Texas Con federate period in the new Stat Archives building, now under construction.

Confederate Museum housed in the old State Land of fice building now being restore by the state.
5. Restora
by County Historion state marker mittees.
6. Erection of new state tourist
markers to point out sites of Con-
