AN ORDINANCE FIXING OF GATESVILLE, CORYELL Book G, page 198. COUNTY, TEXAS, PROVID-ING FOR THE MANNER IN WHICH SUCH RATE MAY BE CHANGED, ADJUSTED AND AMENDED AND DE-CLARING AN EMERGENCY. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY

OF GATESVILLE: SECTION 1. Effective with the first gas bills rendered on or after general service rate for sales of 6 weeks natural gas and natural gas service rendered to residential and commercial consumers within the city limits of Gatesville by Lone Star Gas Company, a Texas corporation, its successors and assigns, is hereby fixed and determined as follows:

Minimum Monthly Bill \$1.00 Readiness To Serve Charges \$.50 per month.

\$.8433 gross per MCF; \$.759 net per MCF.

Net rate shall apply to all bills paid within ten days from monthly billing date.

This ordinance does not regulate any rate or charge except those specifically set out hereinabove.

The above rate is applicable to each residential and commercial consumer per month or for any part of a month for which gas is used at the same location.

SECTION 2. The ate set forth in section 1 may be changed and amended by either the City or Company furnishing gas in the manner provided by law. Service hereunder is subject to the orders of regulatory bodies having jurisdiction, and to the Company's Rules and Regulations currently on file in the Company's office.




