## Co. Agent News

Three questions are very common today. What will kill bagworms, grasshoppers and Johnsongrass These three 'hings are very common now and need to be controlled. Following are recommendations on each:

Bagworms may bee controlled b using malathion, lead arsenate or toxaphene. Follow directions of manufacturer. Spray to kill this pest before they become too large

Good control can be achieved by spraying or baiting a strip around the fence row or edge of field. Spray with toxaphene, aldrin, wieldrin or chlordane. Bai's may be made by using one of these materials in bran. Be sure to take precautions when handlin insecticide We want to kill the grasshoppers and not you.

For jonnsong iss spot treatment with oils or dalapon is the easiest cheapest and most effective method of geting rid of Johnsongrass in row crops. It costs but 5 to 12 dollars per acre to rid fields of heavy infestations of Johnsongrass

In cool weather, naphtha i reeccommended for spot oiling purposes, but in hot weather a 50-50 mixture of naphtha with either an additive is also an effective


