The Stato Supreme Court held Wednesday the State Highway De partment had overstepped its authority in trying to build a highNay on private land without ac quiring titlo to the land
Two private owners in Coryell County, MoNoil and C. J. Griffin brought suit against county officLals, the State Highway Commis sion and the Department. The tion represented a suit against the state without the necessary leyislative auhority.
Acts of officials which are not tawfully authorised are not aits of the state, "suid Judge Ruel Walker in writing the court's opinion. "If the present suit could not $b_{e}$ maintained without legislative con
sent, officials of the state would never have to condemn land legalty. Thes could simnly appropriate it ant the land owner would be enthe Legistature granted him pernission to sue, "Walker said
Lower courts dismissed the high
way commission and departmen from the trespass suit.
"The Supreme Court does not agree with the court of civil appeals that the pleas of the state officers were properly sustained because the suit against them is to of a function of sovereignty ${ }^{4}$ the court said.
Walker said there is no law con ferring upon the highway dept. the authority to construct a highway across privately owned property without acsuiring legal right to do so. The question is not whether respondent (highway officials) were arting on behalf of the state to arromplish a governmental purpose but whether the action they by law.
