the State the right guilt of a lawbreaker
Seven years ago a chronic cri minal named Mallory was accus ed of rape in Washington. He was arrested late one night and put i. jail where he stayed till business
hours the next day. He signed a confession and made no clain that he was mistreated or roughly handed $i_{2}$ any way.
The Supreme Court of the Uni ted States held that this delay of $71 / 2$ hours in arraigning him after his arrest rendered the confession inadmissable. This is what came to be known as the Mallory decision. Mallory was turned loose to commit new crimes. He is now lodged in jail in Pennsylvania. This week the House passed bill to set this court decision aside insofar as we can do so. (Conshould not remove any Constitushould not remove any Constitu
