BROWNSVILLE, Te..., O_.. (AP)-Dovelopncat ot a new
reezing tecnmque which will preserve indivadual sections of citrus fruit in frozen form has been announced by two local firms.
The announcement said the new method piomses to stimulate increased use c.tus, parieularly grapetruit, and could revolutimize marketing processes of the multi-
Manny Sanch.z, president of the Brownsville Sh mp Exchang and Cold Storage Corp., and Lar ry Lighiner, local citrus growe and shipper, said the process invilves flash freezing of the tree ripened citrus sections.
They said previous attempts to freeze citrus has resulted in ruptured cells, and when the product tured cells, and when the produp
was defrosted it turned o mush.
They said he new process, which involves flash freezing of individual grapefruit, orange or tangerne sections results in excellent appearance and flavor.
The development and processing techniques were worked out by Lightner and the BSE \& CS plant manager Jack Loff.
Loff said the defrosted sections look and taste as natural as if prepared from whole fresh frui. He said sweetner is added whee needed for flavor control.
