2-1/2 cups sifted all-purpose $\quad 1-1 / 2$ cups sifted confectioners 1 tear 1 teaspoon cream soda 1 cup (2 sticks) Danishflavor margarine

1 (9-oz.) pkg. None Such 1 condensed mince meat
teaspoon vanilla extract Sift together flour, baking soda and cream of tartar. In a large
size bowl, cream margarine and sugar together until light. Break mince meat into small pieces. Place mince meat and egg in elec tric blendor; blend until mince meat is pulpy. Stir into creamed mixture. Add vanilla and sifted dry ingredients; blend well. Refrigerate dough about 30 minutes, then roll into $3 / 4$-inch diamon a well-greased baking sheet. Bake in a moderate $\left(375^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right.$.) oven, about 10 minutes, or until lightly browned. Cool slightly before removing cookles from baking sheet. For GREEN ICING blend 1 cup sifted confectioners' sugar, $1 / 2$ teaspoon vanilla extract and 1 tablespoon water until of spreading consistency. Tin slivers of red cherries. coloring
