

W^{HERE} do juicy, tender pork chops come from? Ask any 4-H'er working on a swine project and he'll tell you that they come from the back of the hog. What's more, the hog provides three kinds of chops: loin, rib and shoulder. He knows that pork chops from properly fed hogs today have less fat and therefore fewer calories than ever before.

But that's not all. In a swine breeding project, he learns about breed selection, housing and approved sanitation and health.

If he has a marketing project he keeps up with latest information on feeding, weight gain, and supply and demand for live hogs. In between he finds time for showing, demonstrating approved practices, and judging animals and meats.

Scores of 4-H farm youth enrolled in the national 4-H Swine program get instruction in animal sciences such as anatomy, bacteriology, genetics and physiology. County extension agents and local 4-H leaders guide the young farmers in specific project areas, and coach them in management and record keeping. They also explore careers both on and off the farm.


In addition to using this knowledge, the youngsters are encouraged to do their best and try for awards provided by the program sponsor, Moorman Mfg. Co.

The awards include six \$500 scholarships for national winners chosen from all the state award winners who receive expensepaid trips to the National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago. As many as four members per county can earn gold-filled medals for completing the best swine projects in the county.

1 (2-1/2 lbs.) smoked pork butt* 1-1/3 cups None Such readyto-use mince meat 2 (11b. 11-oz.) cans 1 small onion, sliced sauerkraut, well drained

Cover pork butt with cold water; bring to boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 1 hour. Place drained sauerkraut in buttered 2-1/2 quart casserole. Mix in the mince meat and sliced onion. Remove pork butt from water. Slice into medium-thick slices and arrange over sauerkraut mixture. Cover casserole. Bake in a moderate (350°F.) oven 40-45 minutes, or until meat and sauerkraut are tender.


