 room door slightly opened. He looked through the hinge crack and saw Janice lying in the bathtub, facing the wall. Bob then called the sheriff's office and went to the front door to wait for help. Bob's statement noted that patrolman Gribble arrived in a few minutes.
 McClellan then read into record a statement taken from Wallace Plentl on March 15

which included the following testimony:
 "On Thursday night, March 13, 1969 I was on duty as a patrolman in Coryell County, Texas, about 9:00 p.m., I checked out with the County radio unit "public service" and got out of my patrol car at my home and went in the house. My wife, Janice Plentl, and my three children were in the living room of my home. Janice and my youngest son were

on the couch in the living room and were asleep. My sons, Bruce and Bob were watching television. I got Britt up from the couch and walked with him downstairs to bed. I then told Bruce to get ready for bed, and told Bob to go down to bed. Both of us went into the bathroom from the living room. The children had gone down to bed. She gave me, that is Janice gave me kind of a karate chop across the chest, I don't mean to say a mad type of blow, because I don't believe she was mad at me, but I grabbed her by the throat with my fore finger and thumb of one hand, I choked her. In fact, I was choking her when I heard my son, Bob calling and asking what was the matter. I let her go and she slumped down and I realized that I had killed her. I told Bob to go back down to bed, and he did. In choking Janice I must have hit her head against the wall or partition between the tub and toilet as her head was bloody and the water in the bath tub was bloody. I left the house immediately and drove south in my patrol car on Highway 36 as I had panicked, and shortly thereafter, I heard over the radio that my son had found my wife in the bath tub, and I headed for home as fast as I could as I wanted to get back to my children."

McClellan entered one other piece of evidence noting that Wallace Plentl took out a life insurance policy on his wife, Janice Plentl in the amount of \$20,000 in February of 1969. The State rested its case at 8:33 a.m.
 Judge Truman Roberts then found Plentl guilty of murder with malice aforethought, setting judgment at life imprisonment in prison.
 Plentl, through defense attorneys waived the right to appeal and Judge Roberts set sentence at life imprisonment in the Texas Department of Correction immediately.
 Judge Roberts remarked, "I have sentenced two lawyers and one sheriff in eight years, and now I have sentenced an ex-highway patrolman for the murder of his wife. As far as I am concerned, you will serve the rest of your life. Take him away, sheriff."

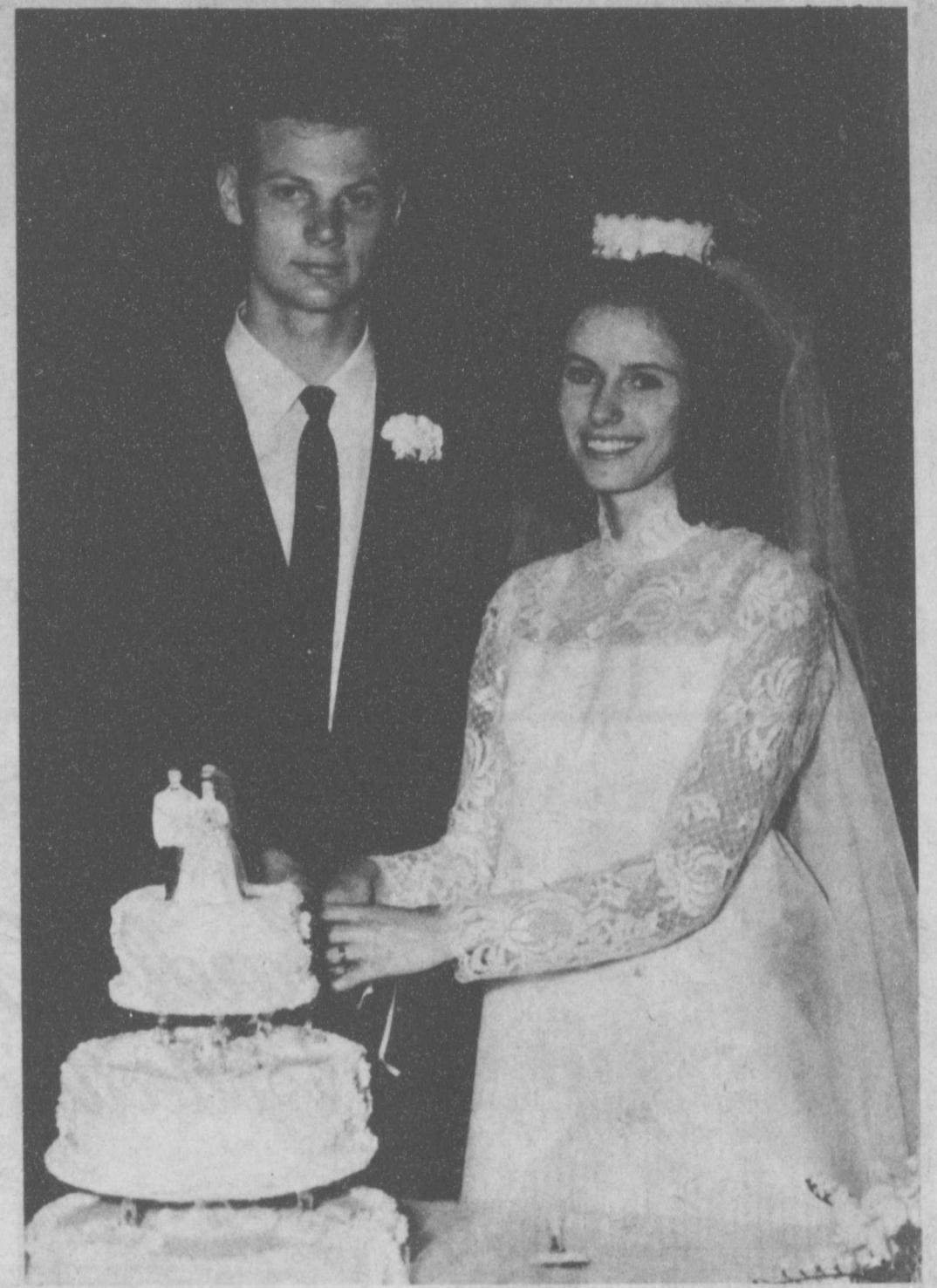
