was hit on Feb. 3, 1943. When it became appar ent that the ship was
sinking and there were not enough life jackets for everybody, the chaplain gave theirs to others and chose to go down with the ship. "It was," an eyewitness

## We can't put off jail issue any longer

Alot of us have never been in jail, never expect to be incarcerated and don't have a whole lot of sympathy for those
who are. That said, we - by law responsible for providing a place to house those who commit crimes in our jurisdiction those who
Basically speaking, we can either put them in a facility of our own making or we can pay to have them incarcerated elsewhere. The only other choice is to not prosecute anyone and let criminals run freely up and down our streets We don't know your thoughts, but for us, that last "solution" is not an option.
It should be pretty clear to our county commissioners court that paying someone else to take care of our prisoners is not viable either. It's just too expensive, no matter how you do the math.
That leaves putting them in a facility such as the Howard County Jail. What sthe problem with that? Nothing, other than the ract that the jail is old, doesn't meet state standards any more and isn't large enough to hold as many criminals as we need to have put away for awhile
This past week, some of our commissioners went to Austin to visit with members of the state jails standards commission. What they wetting waivers for the jail just to "get by" been getting waivers for the jail just to "get by since the 1970s. The cong to hap made clear that practice isn't going to happen much longor. If a fire were to somenow start in our county doors cannot be remotely unlocked The corri dors are extremely narrow and exit doors open against traffic. Fire suppression equipment also inadequate.
None of us want to see our spouse, son, daugh ter or friend - or ourselves - incarcerated But you have to realize it could happen Certainly most of us know someone who has been locked up for whatever reason. Would you want a love one locked up in place that isn we must ensure they are confined in a place that is safe.
"These are serious, life-threatening factors, and the standards commission is very con cerned about them," said longtime commissioner Bill Crooker
We should all be concerned
The jail issue has been on and off the table for many, many months and it is a problem that won't go away. It's time for everyone concerned to take a good hard - positive - look at how to best get this done. And then get after it. Let's unlock the lockup issue and deal with it before we have a disaster that not only cost dollars but lives.

The birds - whose remains were carefully examined amid avian influenza fears - had livers so diseased "they looked like they were a spokeswoman for Vienna's veterinary authority, told Austrian tele vision Thursday.
All died of broken necks after slamming into windowpanes, apparently after gorging themselves turning the juice inside to alcohol, Wehsely said.
For the last time, all my feath ered friends: If you drink, don't fly, OK?

and other personal items at Auction Galleries and Auctioneers in Dallas on Aprill 14-15.

## Stallone and Rocky have something to prove

PHILADELPHIA - It's a clear, chilly, noir midnight on bombed-out Jasper Street. An El train chugs against the sky two blocks away. To the right, peeking above a roof, One Liberty Place shines brightly, a million miles away.
Beneath lonely street lights, a film crew huddles around a white van parked outside one of the two hab itable houses on the block. Inside the van, Rocky Bal boa is listening to his friend Marie: Go for it. Get in the ring one last time.
That also happens to be why Sylvester Stallone is in Philadelphia. Rocky's creator is giving the big lug one last shot as he directs and stars in "Rocky Balboa," the sixth in the epic series. Stallone also wrote the screenplay.
Filming began Jan. 9 and is expected to wrap by next week. The film is not expected in theaters until February 2007.
Although Philadelphia settings also figured into all previous "Rockys" except for "IV," Stallone said he had to come back to do all the exterior work on "Rocky Balboa."

The city itself is the costar," said Stallone, sucking on a cigar between takes.
Stallone owes the city a lot.
In December 1975, he was a broke young man - New York-born, Philadelphiaraised - with something to prove when he shot his gritty story of an up-andcoming club fighter who goes the distance.
And now with "Rocky Balboa" revisiting many of the same haunts from the Oscar-winning first movie, Stallone might be a wealthy guy on the brink of 60 , but he has something else to prove:
Don't count out people just because they're getting up there.
If 1976's "Rocky" was a story for the ages, "Rocky

Balboa" is a story for the single mother living on the for everybody. Especially if in all.
aging.
Stallone is among the old est of the baby-boom gener ation, and in this installment - where we pick up his story 15 years after "V" - Rocky is not ready to pack it in as he gets into the ring against a guy two decades his junior.
"I think that it's a philosophically sound piece," Stallone said. "People that are on the cusp of wanting to just give up and really not participate in life would recognize maybe a sense of opti mism.
"In my generation, it seems that no one wants to go away gently anymore. They're staying healthier, they're looking out for themselves
They're driving race cars ... climbing mountains. I think that's the wave of the future. "I think that people should be willing to walk on thin ice because it's really rewarding if you happen to get across that lake that's frozen."

Here's how it goes: The long-suffering Adrian the girl Rocky met in the pet shop in the original is dead. Rocky owns a restaurant in South Philadelphia. He's pals with Adrian's brother Paulie (Burt Young), but he's distant from his son, Rocky Jr. (played by Milo Ventimiglia), who goes by Robert as he lives the yuppie life in Philadelphia's Center City.
He's friendly with Marie - played by Geraldine Hughes - who was a kid in the first Rocky. She's a
 edge of poverty.
The world has changed, but Rocky hasn't.
One day, ESPN simulates a boxing match between a computer-generated Rocky and the current champ (Mason "The Line" Dixon, sioner

Dixon's people want a fight.
Rocky accepts, then balks.
"He's called upon to (do this), almost as a publicity stunt that turns out to be a foolish gesture, but it starts to spark something in him," Stallone said
"What starts out as an outlet for his grief becomes a magnet for all the people around him who have giv en up in life and they start to bond with him," Stallone said.
"If the mountain is there, why not try to climb it? He's being just scourged by the press, scourged by his friends, 'You're nothing' Just because you've had a few too many birthdays you should stop trying things? That's what Rocky would say. 'Time goes by ou're standing still.
The state boxing commisplayed by Philadelphia lawyer Jim my Binns, who played Rocky's lawyer in "Rocky $V^{\prime \prime}$ - is against it, too, un til Rocky convinces him

But fight Rocky must, and he gets into the ring with Dixon. Stallone and Tarver shot their ring scenes last month in fron of a full house at Las Vegas' Man dalay Bay Resort \& Casino. "Those were real blows, Stallone said bale fully.

If Stallone owes the city a lot, he's paying it back with this film.

Work on "Rocky Balboa" started here in October, when location scouts set out to find the haunts used in 1975. "It was kind of fun," said Patricia Taggart who has scouted for the former CBS series "Hack" and the Oprah Winfrey film "Beloved." People had a good idea, but "no one knew where they all were." Some spots had been torn down
This was a good thing, Stallone said. He wanted to show change.
Taggart, California-based location director Paul Schreiber and production designer Franco Carbon toured familiar places and found a few new ones - 21

Stallone has said he was down to his last hundred bucks in 1975 when he wrote "Rocky." The film had a minuscule $\$ 1.1$ million budget when shooting started that December. Cast and crew traveled from California by train to save a few bucks, recalled Frank Stallone, his brother the musician. The company rented a van to work out of and drove it to pizzerias to pick up food.
The film won three Academy Awards, including best picture. The first five "Rockys" grossed nearly $\$ 500$ million, combined.
"Rocky Balboa's" budget is a reported $\$ 24$ million still low by Hollywood standards - but the production has 120 crew members and trailers galore. Stallone flew in by private jet and is staying at one of the fanciest hotels in town.
Even some actors were cast on the fly. Stallone, looking for a hard-edged girl in a bar scene, said he tested dozens of trained actresses. "As fate would have it, I ran into her," he said, pointing toward Angela Boyd, 20, a skinny kid with blond hair.
After shooting her scenes, Stallone hired her as a production assistant.

People will be speculating for the next year about how it all ends, Stallone hopes.
He said he's shooting three endings: over Adrian's grave, in the boxing ring, and on the Art Museum steps. Dismissing chatter on the Internet, he insisted that Rocky would live.

But Rocky will not live for a seventh movie. Asked whether the series would continue, Stallone waved his gnarled hand briskly and, with a grin, said: "No, no. I doubt it. This (movie) really puts a cap on the sítuation."
Word is, Stallone is itching to do the fourth "Rambo" film, anyway.

## Lathan is into 'something' good

Like many who grow up in show-biz families, actress Sanaa Lathan says some of her earliest memories are of the world of performers. The daughter of director-producer Stan Lathan, who got his start directing the PBS series "Say Brother," and dancer Eleanor McCoy, who appeared in the original Broadway production of "The Wiz," the star of "Something New" wasn't exactly rocked to sleep as a baby in a dressing-room steamer trunk, but she came pretty darn close.
"My mother was teaching dance classes when she was eight months preg. nant," says Lathan, whose birth didn't put her mother out of commission for long. "She would put a blanket on the floor under the piano and have me there in her rehearsals and dance classes." Needless to say, as a child she was all too familiar with the notion of Take Our Daughters to Work Day.
"I danced through my whole childhood," remembers Lathan, 34. "I actually wanted to be a dancer, probably up 'til junior high, and then that kind of got shifted." Realizing how hard the life of a hoofer can be and that "many people don't respect people in the entertainment industry all that much," the self-described "brainy kid" and
"tomboy" started thinking about other career paths. "I said, 'You know, I don't want to go into the arts. I want to be a lawyer or a doctor. I wanted to have a respentable job.'
That all changed, however, when a recruiter from Yale Dr.ma School showed up at th University of California $t$ Berkeley and convince the English major, who , that point had begun $w$ king with a group called the Black The-
atre Workshop, that R-E-S-P-E-C-T could be spelled with an MFA instead of a JD.
"I think me getting in (to Yale) in a weird way validated me in terms of wanting to be an actress. I had a real strong desire to be respected." Plus, when it all came down to it, Lathan says, "I wasn't really all that interested in law. So I'm happy I got in, because, once I was there, I realized that this is "what I'm supposed to do."
Though she has had an enviable Hollywood career so far, life for this up-andcoming star hasn't changed all that much since her breakout performance in 2000's "Love \& Basketball." That film, in which she played a promising athlete opposite then-real-life boyfriend Omar Epps, brought her national attention, but as far as the actress was concerned, it could just as easily have been her last job in the business. "Every movie that I do," she says, "I have yet to know what I'm doing next before the movie's over."
"It can be pretty scary. There's a lot of faith involved," Lathan says, explaining her "strong intention to not take jobs for money."
Er, can we bring up 2004's "Alien vs. Predator," in which Lathan did battle against two sci-fi beasties in subterranean Antarctica?
"Listen," says Lathan, without missing a beat. "I don't know what you thought about it, but I thought that this was really special, in that this is a fierce-ass woman who is very" - and here she pauses, but only for a second, as if she's wondering whether she's about to go too far in her own defense - "mythical and heroic, if you want to just get deep with it. I mean, it's entertainment, but it's a first, in that this

is two major franchises coming together, and it's a black woman who is the sole survivor. I, just on that level, wanted to do it."
True to her latest project's name, Lathan believes her work on "Something New" is another first. There have been interracial love stories in film before, she explains, but few involving a black woman with a white man. "That really is something new," she insists, but not just for that reason alone. "Usually those films are the couple against the world, but this is about her dealing with her internal struggle about being with a white man which is real."
It's a struggle she knows all too well. "I've even dealt with it in terms of dating interracially, where there's a certain guilt that happens, because of our history," she says. "Our history is so loaded, we're so intertwined, yet there's so much unconscious stuff that happens. Like you could be in a happy, wonderful dating situation with a white man, and then be terrified to go to a black event. I've literally talked girlfriends through this,' like 'You have to go, girl' - you
know? - 'Don't worry about what they're thinking.' And one of the things that is so ironic is that the pressure that you get is from your own people. You're 'abandoning' your own."
Although she's quick to note that "Something New" is not a message movie, she believes that it does touch on some still-volatile issues of identity.
"What I find is that, because we do live in a white world, you become - it's weird - black people become more conscious of themselves being black than a white person is of being white." That's be-
cause, for white people, she says, "there's like an ownership. 'This is my world. I see myself. From the time I'm little, I see myself reflected.' " If there is a moral to the movie, Lathan says, it's that we need to step outside of these little cages of our own making.
"It's almost as if you become your own imprisoner," Lathan says. "Do you know what I mean? You start to see yourself - and I don't think this is a good thing - as 'I am a Black Woman.' " Buy into that too deeply, she says, and you may end up looking at the world through a very narrow window indeed.

Anyone who knows me will tell you I'm a "new music" junky from the word go.
Classic rock, though nostalgic, tends to make my skin crawl. Of course, living in Big Spring for so long with nothing else to listen to on the radio except country and Tejano, you don't have to go far to uncover the root of my musical psychosis.
If it's new, I'll listen to it - at least once.

This philosophy was born out of the same type of mu sical tastes I see many of the people my age following. You'll find them at Wal-Mart, gathered around the discount-bargain bin, searching through copies of Motley Crue, Bon Jovi and still one of my favorites, Twisted Sister.
What can I say? Dee Snider would kick Howard Stern's... well, you get the picture.
And while I constantly search the musical world over for new tunes, some really great stuff has snuck in the back door under the guise of some old bands I had lost interest in. Bands like Megadeth, the focus of this week's column, have been putting out new and surprising. ly good albums, quietly biding their time until people like me go back to see what they have missed.
Man, I've missed a lot.
First off, let's start with a little about the band that once had parents, churches and
Maranatha up in arms, drawing accusations concerning explicit lyrics and subliminal messages - My "Peace Sells... But Who's Buying" album told me to burn my grilled cheese, true story not to mention whispers of devil worship.
Luckily, all of that bologna was made up by some record executive somewhere who realized you could sell more records to your target audience - the kids - if the parents had a burning, if not misdirected, hatred for the band.
Dave Mustaine, the creator and driving force behind Megadeth, began his trek with 'Deth after being ejected from Metallica in 1983. A note to all of you rising musicians out there: If you drive your band's tour bus off into a ditch because you're drunk, it's not likely you'll be around much longer.
With a bad taste in his mouth - probably from the booze -

Mustaine set out with one goal:

To create a band more successful than Metallica. And, depending on whose opinion you ask for, that's exactly what he did.
With more than a dozen albums and imports to his credit, Mustaine has become one of the most recognized and revered guitarists to ever play a heavy metal concert. The list of lead guitarists Mustaine has employed reads like a list of who's-

With lyrics like "Justice means nothing today, now that the courts are for sale. Pick a crime from the menu, pick a sentence and defend you and pick up the down payment called bail. The system's for sale," Mustaine once again touts his "justice versus politics" ideology on the album's track
"Kick the Chair."
The album is by far a success, managing to capture the energy Megadeth had Megadeth

who in the metal guitarist world, second only to Ozzy Osbourne. It's also widely rumored that Mustaine had even planned to bring Darrell "Dimebag" Abbott into the group, but plans were spoiled when Abbott refused to join without his brother, Vinnie Paul.
Megadeth has also featured the talents of guitarist Kerry King (Slayer), Marty Friedman (Cacophony) and Al Pitrelli (Savatage).
Then, as it happens so often in this industry, tragedy struck.
In January 2002, Mustaine suffered a compressed radial nerve in his left hand and arm, making it impossible for him to play guitar. In April of that year, Megadeth was disbanded. Mustaine went through physical therapy for his injury, and began to explore other areas of the music industry, including production. However, he fully recovered from his arm injury following successful therapy.
During this time also, Dave Mustaine became a born-again Christian and has settled his demons to embrace what he deems "a more fulfilling family life." His political views still hold strong to justice rather than blind obedience to a new order. Mustaine clearly has a problem with politicians, which is evident by the caricatured political powers that adorn the cover of Megadeth's 2004 comeback release, "The System Has Failed."
Featuring a number of politically driven songs, "The System Has Failed" reached deep into current events, touching on the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan and theories of corruption leading all the way to the president of the United States. when the band was hungry and trying to make a name for itself, but it also has the sharp-edged visions of albums like . "Youthanasia" and "Countdown to Extinction."
That album saw only moderate success in 2004, selling 150,000 copies, and was quickly followed up in 2005 with "Greatest Hits: Back to the Start," which represents a full-circle for the band.
Like most greatest hits albums, "Back to the Start" spans the entire Megadeth discography, featuring many of the tunes that helped Megadeth climb out of its pigeon-hole genre and move more into mainstream, such as "Holy Wars.. The Punishment Due" and "Symphony of Destruction."
The album also goes back to the band's darker days, pulling "Peace Sells, But Who's Buying?" and "In My Darkest Hour" into the mix.
Overall, both albums should definitely be on the wish list of any metalhead that still has a place in their heart for Megadeth and that particular musical scene. I guess it's a good thing they didn't sell out like Metallica. I have a really hard time trying to imagine Mustaine doing a country-inspired tune or a rendition of "Whiskey in the Jar." What can I say except... Yuck!
