Philippines landslide death toll at 1,800 GUINSAUGON, Philippines (AP) - Rescue workers held little hope Saturday of finding more survivors 1,800 people, saying this farming village in the eastern Philippines was swallowed whole by a wall of mud and boulders.
The search was focusing on an elementary school 250 children and teachers had received cell phone text messages from survivors.
On Saturday, 11 other villages in the area were evac uated out of fear of further landslides. Guinsaugon, on he southern part of Leyte island, has been swampe with 27 inches of rain over the last two weeks.
The U.S. military dispatched two warships and 1,000
Marines to the area. Friday's disaster.

Roadside bombs kill U.S. soldier, 6 Iraqis
BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) - A U.S. soldier and at leas six Iraqis were killed in Baghdad and north of the raqi capital Saturday in a spate of roadside bombings, German plane missing in northern Iraq.
An Iraqi police major was assassinated by drive-by gunmen in the insurgent stronghold of Ramadi, wes of Baghdad, in the latest attack targeting security orces that the United States hopes will eventually
The U.S. military said a roadside bomb struck an American vehicle at about $8 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. in eastern Baghdad killing a soldier assigned to the Multi-National Division-Baghdad.
The death, the first reported by the command since Iraq to at least 2.273 since the Irag war began in March 2003, according to an Associated Press count.
The attack happened near the Shaab soccer stadium, and the area was cordoned off by U.S. and Iraqi forces. An American helicopter landed at the scene to tak

## Online TV network places cowboy culture on the Web

DALLAS - The wild West and the computer age seem an odd marriage.
But executives at the Gold Buckle Network in Addison, say renewed interest in cowboy culture and the emerging technology of Internet TV complement each other perfectly.
"It's going to change not just Western (programming) but movie-making and entertainment as a whole," Gold Buckle CEO Chris Hill said about providing traditional TV content on the Web.
The Gold Buckle Network targets an audience of Western lifestyle enthusiasts - people who may attend rodeos, fish and hunt, and listen to country music. The Web site, which launched in November 2004, is part TV network, part radio station and part general store. Growth among rodeo audiences spurred the company's development.
"It's the next big breakout sport," Hill said. "We just ended up on the early end of the deal."
Nationally televised rodeo events, such as Professional Bull Riders competitions, in some cases have attracted more viewers than NBA games, said author and freelance writer W.K. Stratton of Austin, Texas. Stratton's book, "Chasing the Rodeo," was published last year.
He said that fans like the speed and danger of rodeo but that they also feel drawn to the sport's history.
"The myth of the West, that's our national myth," he said. "Our heroes are cowboys."

Gold Buckle also appears to be on the cutting edge of the emerging Internet TV
trend, said TV industry analyst Phillip Swann.
"It's coming," he said. "The networks know it. They are all preparing for it."
TV networks, along with cable and satellite companies, are already adapting to consumers' desire for on-demand video. Such services allow viewers, usually for a fee, to choose when they watch programs rather than conforming to network schedules.
Gold Buckle offers the same type of on-demand product on its Web site Without downloading any files or software, users can view streaming video of rodeos, TV shows and musicians. Computer-television connection kits allow viewers to watch on their TV screens rather than computer monitors.
Swann, author of "TV Dot Com: The Future of In teractive Television," said expanding the video on-demand concept to the Inter net allows for more content and audience targeting.
Internet sites cost less to operate than traditional broadcast and cable TV networks. Because they need fewer viewers and less advertising, such Web sites can target specialized audiences, Swann said.
Hill said Gold Buckle puts the viewers in control. "The whole concept was, put the consumers in charge of what they want to watch instead of the broadcasters deciding what to feed them," he said.
The broadcast networks have recently entered the on-demand arena. ABC last year started offering shows such as "Desperate House wives" and "Lost" through iTunes.
NBC and CBS followed by inking deals with DirecTV and Comcast, respectively that make programs such

as "Law \& Order: Criminal Intent" and "CSI" available on-demand. Google, AOL and Yahoo all have reached similar deals for TV shows. Gold Buckle Network's library contains TV shows, rodeo events, movies and music videos. Titles include TV episodes of "The Lone Ranger" and "The Cisco Kid" as well as movies starring John Wayne and Roy Rogers.
Much of the content is free, but some newer items cost $\$ 1$. Eventually, parts of the site will become sub-scription-based.
Executives plan to add hundreds of titles in the coming months, including
tractor-pull coverage and Gold Buckle-produced programs.
Cody Bertram, a 26 -yearold Addison software engineer, watches rodeo cover age and movies from the Gold Buckle Network, though he doesn't consider himself part of the Western lifestyle.
"I've never been a cowboy or anything, but I do like the culture," he said.
Bertram said the quality of Gold Buckle's streaming video impressed him. A link between his computer and television allows him watch on a 52 -inch screen.
"I think what they've done is actually going to be
more commonplace in the future," he said. "The Internet will become the focal point of your entertainment center."

## Organization seeks to help blues artists

SANFORD, Fla. - David Butler learned how to play the guitar when he was a teenager, a long time ago now, and he never stopped. Sitting in the living room of his Spartan apartment in Sanford, his long, powerful fingers rake across the strings of a red guitar: It fills the room with the determined, primitive rhythms of the blues.
It's not the stylized version of the traditional music that surfaces in suburban garage bands, where the middle-class idea of misery is getting a " C " in biology or being grounded for the weekend.
Butler, 75, has seen harder times: discrimination, financial hardship, potentially life-threatening medical conditions. He has one artificial leg, a reminder of a long-ago motorcycle accident, and doesn't see so well.
Such realities reverberate in the music.
"I met Lightnin' Hopkins in Atlanta, Ga.," Butler says softly, the consonants in his deep voice striking hard against the roof of his mouth. "I was young then, and I went up on stage and played this here."
He touches the strings again, unleashing a rumbling bass line.
What do you call that?
"-Don't Get Mad with Me, I Ain't Mad with You.'
The song is obscure, like the man singing it, but Butler and his music haven't been forgotten. He and other traditional blues practitioners are considered cultural treasures by the Music Maker Relief Foundation, a North Carolina organization devoted to offering musicians support and long overdue recogni ${ }^{\text {ion }}$.
"I've never heard anybody el ?play like him," says Tir Duffy, the musicologist tho started the foundati more than a decade $a$, in Hillsborough, N.C "He does all

Duffy, 42, developed his interest in traditional Southern music in the 1980s, when he studied folklore at the University of North Carolina. In the spirit of legendary folklorist Alan Lomax, Duffy
wards
"It's hard for the true traditional artists to have any platform because they have no expertise competing against white college-educated kids. How can you compete against a guy like Jack White of the White Stripes? This kind of sophisticated guy reaches straight to roots music twists it and makes big hit records. A guy like David Butler isn't going figure that out."
Music Maker sends monthly checks to musicians such as Butler, amounts that average $\$ 100$ to augment annual incomes that typically range from $\$ 6,000$ to $\$ 15,000$. Equally important, the foundation has sponsored concerts and more than 55 CDs exposing the music to new generations.
Music Maker has garnered the endorsement of stars such as Bonnie Raitt and Taj Mahal, the latter a member of the board of directors.
"These people are part of the tradition that brought this music to the forefront in the first place," Mahal says. "There's a whole industry built up around how to exploit these artists, yet they always seem to be the last considered whenever the tradition is spoken about."

Two of Butler's performances are featured on "Treasure Box," a 2005 three-disc compilation fea-
turing Music Maker artists. Duffy has enough material to release an album of Butler's songs, but he has so many other projects that he isn't sure when it might happen.

Meanwhile, Butler plays every day in his living room, serenading the pictures of Jesus on the walls. Spend enough time with him and he might share tales of his stint in baseball's Negro Leagues or encounters with famous bluesmen.

He has played everywhere from folk-art festivals to off-the-beaten-path nightclubs in a band that includes bassist Scott Riggan, 35, who brought Butler to Duffy's attention.

Riggan, co-owner of Jack's Cycles in Sanford, met Butler more than 10 years ago when the musician did odd jobs at the shop. He offered Butler gas money for guitar lessons, and the two became friends.

It was a slow process.
"He was pretty much a loner," Riggan says. "He was pretty anti-social, beaten down. It took him a long time to build his confidence."

Butler is still distrustful of strangers, but music knocks down the walls.
"We weren't making anything sounding like anybody else," he explains after another old tune. "We needed something that sounded like us."

## ‘Neil Young: Heart of Gold’ on track

In "Neil Young: Heart of Gold" the folk-rocker, 60, sings home truths in his fragile, faraway falsetto that burrows deep into your core.
Jonathan Demme's concert movie is better than a front-row seat to Young's "Prairie Wind" performances in Nashville last August. At the film's intimate best, it gives a guitar's perspective of the troubadour. He plucks his instrument as he plays our heartstrings. It's movie and music bliss.
Demme captured Young, who resembles a spud with stringy hair stuffed into a Stetson, at a pregnant moment, shortly after the singer's skirmish with death.

Grieving the loss of his father in the winter of 2005, Young learned he had a brain aneurysm. Songs poured out of him before going under the knife emotionally heartfelt, if not musically complex, ballads about God, family and country.
Young wrote and recorded them thinking that they might be his last testament. And they're the basis of "Prairie Wind," an album that erases any remaining border between country. folk, grunge and rock - not to mention that between the United States and Young's native Canada.
When he survived surgery, the musician (himself the subject of an immodest number of concert films including "Rust Never Sleeps" and "Year of the Horse") and Demme (director of "Stop Making Sense," the sublime 1984 Talking Heads concert movie) made plans to document his personal comeback.

In the resulting concert, Young croons the new "Prairie Wind" songs and reprises iconoclastic classics such as "Heart of

Gold," "Old Man" and "Needle and the Damage Done."
Demme and Young conceived the performance as a three-act drama that, in tumbleweed fashion, rolls from heartland to hearth and, finally, to church. These locations are suggested by the painted backdrops that frame his musical family, including Emmylou Harris and Young's wife, Pegi, all clad in wheat-colored Western garb. The backdrops and costumes underscore the frontier traditionalism that Young has long packed in his artistic saddlebags.
In the first act, the musician takes stock of his life and takes leave of his loved ones. It's a musical set that at times suggests one administering his own last rites before it explodes into a rollicking wake where the departed is a participant. The songs testifying to his love for father, daughter, dog and guitar wrap the audience in a blanket of emotion.
It's a warm blanket, but not a fuzzy one. For the prickly tension in Young's music has always been that of a restless homebody, the guy who can't wait to make the getaway but who also welcomes the homecoming.
The reconciliation - and powerful release - of that tension comes toward the end of the first act with Young's prayerful "When God Made Me." Contemplating the ultimate getaway, Young demands in his still-boyish wail, "Did He give me the gift of voice so some might silence me?" The emotional force of this question dissolves the rock of ages into a river of tears.
When, in the live-to-tell second act, Young revisits

the songs that made his one-woman show on Broad- wisdom like Young does reputation, he revels in way she mined old materi- here. The result was simitheir contradictions. Singing it at 60 lends it a both-sides-now resonance and power that he never could have anticipated, nor could the audience.
Only on one other occasion have I enjoyed the privileged moment of seeing a musical artist hear for the first time themes in her work. Back in the ' 80 s when Lena Horne did her
