



## BSISD set to celebrate Public Schools Week

Big Spring Independent School District officials always encourage parental involvement, but this week, they'll really roll out the red carpet.

More than 3,700 BSISD students will help celebrate Texas Public Schools Monday through Friday, with observances held at most of the campuses.

Texas Public School Week is designed to give schools the opportunity to showcase posi-

tive things happening in the district and to encourage parents to visit the campuses, officials said.

Campuses have put a premium on flexibility in their scheduling to allow parents greater access to activities, leaning more toward daytime activities.

Big Spring High School held an open house earlier this school year, so it has no planned observances this week, but the other BSISD campuses have several activities slated.

Bauer Magnet Elementary is inviting parents to lunch every day this week and will have a unique dress theme every day.

For example, students are encouraged to wear a funny tie Monday, while Wednesday has been designated "Pajama Day." Bauer activities conclude Friday with a kindergarten rodeo.

Kentwood Elementary also has a daily dress theme, as well as unique events such as a "cafeteria campout" Tuesday

evening and a field trip to Scenic Mountain Friday.

Marcy Elementary parents are encouraged to have lunch with their children at the campus. Monday is reserved for kindergarten parents, Tuesday for parents of first-graders, and so on.

At Moss and Washington Elementary schools, there will be daily dress themes, and parents are invited to attend lunch with their children following the same rotating schedule as

Marcy.

Goliad Intermediate School students will also take advantage of daily dress themes, while Big Spring Junior High will have the dress themes, as well as special events tied toward promotion of reading.

While no events are planned at BSISD, parents are welcome to visit the campus at any time during the week. In addition, lunch (at \$2.35 per adult) will be served to parents this week, officials said.

## Jail site

### Commissioners to discuss possible location for facility

Howard County Commissioners are expected to meet in a special closed session Monday morning to discuss real property being considered in relation to the future construction of a new county jail facility.

The closed session, which is slated on the agenda for the commissioner's court's normal Monday meeting, is a part of county officials' ongoing struggle to develop a plan to construct a new facility, made even more urgent by a 90-day deadline recently set by the Texas Commission on Jail Standards.

"They very strongly suggested that we come back in three months and tell them what we're going to do to correct the problems with our jail," Commissioner Jerry Kilgore said following a meeting with TCJS in Austin. "What I got from them was ... they were saying, 'You better get to planning for a new facility.'"

Kilgore said the state commission has granted waivers to the local facility since the mid-1970s, but hinted that its patience may be wearing thin.

"They very, very strongly suggested that ... if we violate one more standard, we're going to lose our accreditation," he said. "What I got out of it was that they are willing to work with us, but they've gone about as far as they're going to."

During their last meeting concerning the jail, commissioners agreed to study building a jail facility — minus the joint law enforcement center origi-

nally conceived — west of the Howard County Courthouse.

The county jail has been a major point of discussion and division at the county level for the past several years. The existing jail fails to meet state standards in several areas, but the state has granted waivers — or "variances," as the state commission describes them — on many of these areas, allowing the jail to remain in operation.

Jail problems that have been granted waivers include not having at least two unobstructed exits from the jail; inadequate fire suppression equipment; no reliable means of remotely unlocking and locking of cells; exit doors that swing against traffic; and corridors that are too narrow.

Also on the meeting's agenda, County Auditor Jackie Olson will present the commissioners with invoices and purchase requests.

County Treasurer Teresa Thomas is expected to present commissioners with personnel considerations, as well as review the county's time keeping system and employee manual.

County Road and Bridge Administrator Eddy Jameson will present the court with pipeline crossings and a report on county road maintenance. Jameson is also expected to present the commissioners with cell phone contracts.

## HC officials eye radiology program

Howard College trustees are expected to take the first step toward providing a radiology program when they hold their regular meeting at 12:30 p.m. Monday in the East Room of Dorothy Garrett Coliseum.

This area has been without a certified radiology program for several years, but plans are on the board to offer the program through HC's San Angelo campus, College President Dr. Cheryl Sparks said.

Sparks said HC officials initially tried to organize a joint radiology program with Odessa College and Midland College, but those efforts

fell through. But subsequent interest from potential students in the San Angelo area persuaded the college to take another look at offering the course.

Pending approval from trustees and the state coordinating board, Howard officials will then hire a program head, with plans to begin offering the course sometime during the 2006-07 school year.

Also Monday, Sparks will inform trustees of the latest enrollment news from the junior college district.

Sparks said enrollment continues

to be flat in the district, with 1.6 percent fewer students taking classes this spring as compared to last year.

The Big Spring campus reported a very slight increase from last year with 1,222 students, nine more than 2005. The news is opposite in San Angelo, which reported 1,196 students enrolled in classes, 19 fewer than this time last year.

Sparks said enrollment figures have remained fairly flat since an upward spike in the 2003-04 school year. During that year, the district reported an increase of more than 200 students from the previous year, but figures have slowly

**SORRY, WRONG ADDICTION**

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — A brochure offering help and advice to those affected by methamphetamine addiction mistakenly listed a telephone number for an adult singles chat line instead of a drug help line.

About 60,000 copies were sent to dozens of Tennessee counties before the error was caught.

"It was an unfortunate mistake," said Wally Kirby, executive director of the Tennessee District Attorney Generals Conference, which sponsored the mailing.

The mailer referred to a toll-free number for a drug hot line operated by the Association of Alcohol and Drug Services.

# Future of Internet highway: toll booths or more lanes?

NEW YORK — On the Internet, the traffic cops are blind — they don't look at the data they're directing, and they don't give preferential treatment.

That's something operators of the Internet highway, the major U.S. phone companies, want to change by effectively adding a toll lane. They want to be able to give priority treatment to those who pay to get through faster.

Naturally, consumer advocates and the Web companies that would be paying the toll are calling it highway robbery.

"Allowing broadband carriers to control what people see and do online would fundamentally undermine the principles that have made the Internet such a success," Vinton Cerf told a Senate committee recently. Cerf, who played a key role in building the Internet, is now the "Chief Internet Evangelist" at Google Inc.

On the Internet, information is carried in "packets," small chunks of data. An e-mail might be divided into several packets and travel different routes to the destination, much like cars have multiple ways of getting somewhere. The packets may arrive out of order, a few even late, but data can be reassembled to reconstitute the e-mail.

This design grew out of the military's desire for a network that was both

simple and reliable. And as the Internet became more widely available, this equal treatment of traffic was part of what made it attractive; individuals, startups and big corporations were on the same footing.

Now, however, the Internet is being used for things the engineers of the 1960s and 70s couldn't have envisioned, like video, telephone calls and Internet games.

It doesn't matter if an e-mail gets where it's going half a second late, but a half-second's delay in a phone call is annoying, and a half-second's delay in a fast-moving game can mean a missed shot.

Thus, the telecommunications companies want to be able to provide "tiered service," guaranteeing that, for a price, some packets will get to their destination on time.

The carriers are under "tremendous pressure" from customers to provide more reliable service, said Shawn White, director of external operations at Keynote Systems Inc., which tracks the performance of Web sites and the Internet.

Brief delays, for instance, could result in stuttering video, unacceptable to advertisers, White notes.

Whether they tier their service or not, telecommunications companies need to expand capacity. To do so costs money, and the telecoms argue that Internet users will have to pay, one way or another.

They say it's preferable that the money come from those who need and are willing to pay for better service, rather than spreading the cost out over all users.

"We do have to recover the cost for building the new capacity out there that the content providers are expecting us to provide," said Jim Cicconi, San Antonio-based AT&T Inc.'s senior executive vice president of external and legislative affairs.

AT&T already provides connections between offices of the same company, or between government offices, using AT&T's own lines rather than the public Internet. This allows AT&T to guarantee a certain quality level.

By prioritizing packets, AT&T could extend that service to the connection between a Web site and a surfer at home.

To the opponents, abandoning the "network neutrality" principle opens up the prospect of the carriers blocking sites that don't pay up or that compete with the carriers' own services — for instance, by providing phone calls.

The carriers have stoked those fears with some hard-line rhetoric. John Thorne, Verizon Communications Inc.'s senior vice president and deputy general counsel, was quoted by The Washington Post as telling a conference that Google "is enjoying a free lunch that should, by any

rational account, be the lunch of the facilities providers."

Ed Whitacre, AT&T's chief executive, has raised eyebrows with similar statements to the effect that Google and Yahoo Inc. are freeloading on the Internet, a remarkable assertion considering both companies pay millions of dollars in Internet access fees, and their visitors pay for Internet access as well.

Brasil Telecom SA, Brazil's third-largest phone company, said in mid-February it had installed the first system that can identify information by type — say, a voice call — and bill the company providing it, addressing what the company calls "revenue leakage." The company would not give further details on its plans.

U.S. carriers are careful to point out that they don't intend to block anyone's Internet access or degrade service.

"None of the worst scenarios people have painted here can take place nor are they taking place," Cicconi said, adding that the government would stop any such abuse, as the Federal Communications Commission did in one case where a phone company that provides Internet services blocked a competing voice-over-Internet company.

Also, competition among carriers means they won't want to block sites for fear of losing cus-

tomers, Cicconi said.

Opponents say that even if toll roads leave the rest of the Internet unimpeded, it will stifle innovation.

"The next great idea, the next Google or eBay or Napster or whatever, won't have the capital to get themselves in the fast lanes right away," said Ben Scott at Free Press, a nonprofit that promotes freedom of speech. "The reason the big e-companies were so successful were that they started on the same level playing field as everyone else."

Another objection to packet prioritization is technical.

The Internet2 association assumed that prioritization was the way to go when it started building a super-fast next-generation network connecting universities.

However, engineers abandoned that notion after a few years, concluding that it's more effective simply to expand the network's capacity for all traffic — adding lanes to the highway instead of a parallel toll road.

The FCC has supported net neutrality in somewhat hedged terms, leading to calls in Congress for a stronger defense of the principle to be included in a future telecommunications bill.

The telephone and cable companies are arguing against any such law, pointing to the traditionally very light regulation of the Internet.

"The hands-off policy

has given us the flexibility to innovate and respond to consumer demand," said Kyle McSlarrow, chief executive of the National Cable & Telecommunications Association.

For the carriers, part of the attraction of a tiered Internet is probably that they would get away from being a "dumb pipe." They're the messengers, with the unglamorous job of passing along the data that others produce and consume. With tiered service, the carrier would become more important.

"It's very rational behavior in the industry. I would do the same thing if I was paid by my shareholders," Free Press' Scott said. "But rational market behavior doesn't necessarily mean good public service."

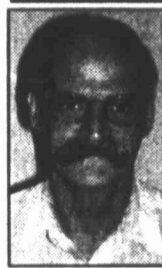
# Aptitude test for criminal minds

**MILL VALLEY, Calif. (AP)** — A man who allegedly mailed a half-pound of marijuana without an address label on the package was arrested after authorities returned it to its sender.

# Let's welcome Chinese tourists

One of the great benefits of China's rapid economic growth over the past decade is a quickly expanding middle class. And as in all societies with disposable income, the members of that growing middle class are beginning to explore the world.

By some estimates, Chinese travelers spend \$75 billion a year traveling to such destinations as Hong Kong, Singapore, Australia, France, Germany and Italy — everywhere, it seems, but the United States.

In fact, while the number of Chinese travelers has tripled in the past five years (to 32 million in 2005), fewer and fewer are coming to America. In 2000 some 250,000 Chinese visited our country; in 2004 just 200,000 did. In other words, Chinese travel to the United States has been decreasing by 5 percent a year at a time when the dollar has been weak, making travel here less expensive.

So why is the United States such an unpopular destination with the Chinese?

It's not. All else being equal, it's safe to say that many more would be flocking to our shores, as they did between 1999 and 2000, when Chinese travel to the United States jumped 18 percent. But all else isn't equal. Several factors keep Chinese travelers, and their tourist dollars, out of this country.

It starts with what the Chinese call "Approved Destination Status," or ADS, which is how the Chinese government designates countries that have complied with certain requirements to facilitate group travel to foreign countries. The United States is not on China's ADS list.

This has nothing to do with any

geopolitical rivalry between our nations but with a combination of unintended consequences and cultural differences.

The first issue is that after Sept. 11, the United States tightened travel regulations across the

board, requiring all visa applicants to be interviewed in person by U.S. consular officers. The problem is that China covers a vast expanse of territory, roughly comparable in size to the United States, and there are only five U.S. consulate offices in the entire nation. To demand that Chinese group travelers go hundreds of miles for an interview before they even know whether they'll be granted a visa is hugely burdensome.

To solve this problem, the Chinese want the United States to create a unique visitor visa reserved solely for group applicants from China. The United States, understandably, is reluctant to carve out exemptions for one country. In addition, for all that the Chinese have done to liberalize parts of their economy, we still have fundamental differences when it comes to ideas of fairness and free markets. The Chinese ADS program would require the U.S. government to grant specific U.S. travel agents exclusive contracts with China.

Needless to say, the United States cannot give preferential treatment to selected travel companies and grant them the profits from all inbound Chinese travel business. It would violate our laws and our most basic ideas of fairness.

So are we at an impasse? I hope not. After all, the purpose of diplomacy is to overcome such impasses, especially when the interests of both countries are as clearly aligned as they are here. The United States, remember, is suffering a deep and continuing trade deficit. Encouraging increased travel and tourism to this country is essential to bringing our trade accounts into balance.

Meanwhile, the Chinese are hungry to absorb U.S. culture. They buy our consumer products and devour our movies, music and video games. Tens of thousands of Chinese come to study in our schools.

During the Cold War, our government subsidized cultural exchange programs between the United States and Soviet bloc countries because we believed exposing others to our way of life would convince them of the benefits of freedom and democracy. That same spirit should apply to China. But we don't need to subsidize such travel; we just need to let it happen.

The Commerce Department is negotiating with the Chinese. The State Department, which is responsible for visa processing, also needs to be at the table. Seventy-five other countries have signed ADS agreements with China. Of course, we should never jeopardize our security or our free-market principles. But with enough will, we should be able to create a solution that works for all sides.

## No verdict in baby's death after third day of jury deliberations

MCKINNEY — Jurors in the capital murder trial of a woman accused of killing her baby by severing the girl's arms went 13 hours without a verdict Friday, even asking for definitions of their role and the term "deliberation."

Dena Schlosser, 37, has pleaded innocent by reason of insanity in the death of her 10-month-old daughter Margaret. Prosecutors are seeking a conviction and a life sentence.

One of the latest among 14 notes the jury has sent state District Judge Chris Oldner was a request for him to define "deliberation" and the precise role of a juror. Oldner read what they requested from Black's Law Dictionary.

Defense attorney David Haynes and prosecutor Curtis Howard said they had never heard of such a request.

Jurors also asked to

hear again testimony from Schlosser's husband about Dena Schlosser calling to tell him she had cut off their daughter's arms. John Schlosser testified that he didn't believe her at first.

Friday was the panel's third day to deliberate without reaching a unanimous decision. Oldner ruled that the jury be sequestered, and deliberations were scheduled to resume Saturday morning.

Jurors said they were deadlocked Thursday, but Oldner ordered them to continue deliberating.

They surpassed 30 hours of deliberations Friday.

The defense says Schlosser didn't know right from wrong during the 2004 slaying and want her committed to a state mental hospital.

Police found Schlosser soaked in blood, holding a knife and listening to a hymn as the baby lay dying in her crib.

During closing arguments, Assistant District Attorney Bill Dobiyski displayed a bloody kitchen knife and urged jurors to hold Schlosser accountable for the death of her daughter. He said psychiatrists were merely taking educated guesses when they testified Schlosser didn't know right from wrong.

Defense attorney Bill Schultz said the case comes down to whether Schlosser knew the attack was wrong. He also said prosecutors have no business questioning medical professionals.

## Governor wants to expand eavesdropping

AUSTIN — In a plan to battle border violence, Republican Gov. Rick Perry is asking the Texas Legislature to expand wiretapping authority for state and local law officers.

His proposal, part of a Texas-Mexico border security package Perry has been promoting around the state, is expected to be addressed in the 2007 Legislature. But it could come up in a special session this year if lawmakers finish tackling school finance.

A civil liberties advocate said he is skeptical about widening the scope of law enforcement wiretapping.

"They have a lot of authority to do that already, and the border security problems are exactly the types of crimes that they already have authority to do the wiretapping for," said Scott Henson, director of the police accountability project for the American Civil Liberties Union of Texas.

Currently, Texas investigations into murder, capital murder and many drug trafficking offenses can include electronic eavesdropping if approved by a judge. Perry wants to add kidnapping, extortion and aggravated sexual assault to that list.

His proposal differs from the federal program President Bush is under fire for in which eavesdropping on certain terrorism suspects has been conducted without court warrants. Perry wants to continue to require that a judge approve Texas requests to secretly listen in on conversations, his spokeswoman said.

"Criminal organizations that are bringing drugs and violence into Texas, that's the target of this law enforcement tool," said spokeswoman Rachael Novier.

Perry first mentioned the idea in October when he pledged \$9.7 million for security along the border. He made that announcement in Laredo, across from the Mexican city of Nuevo Laredo — the

site of ongoing drug-related violence.

This week in Amarillo, Perry elaborated on his border proposal and wiretapping request alongside Rep. David Swinford, a Panhandle Republican whom Perry asked to shepherd border safety legislation at the Capitol.

"Texas law officers should have the same intelligence gathering tools as their federal counterparts," Perry said.

The governor said he chose Swinford to push the measure "because he is a law and order lawmaker who wants to stop illegal activity in places like Laredo and Del Rio before it impacts towns like Amarillo."

Perry and Swinford are in contentious races for re-election this year. Some of Perry's gubernatorial rivals also have spoken about tightening border security.

Swinford, chairman of the House State Affairs Committee, said he doesn't envision the state going as far as the federal government in electronic eavesdropping.

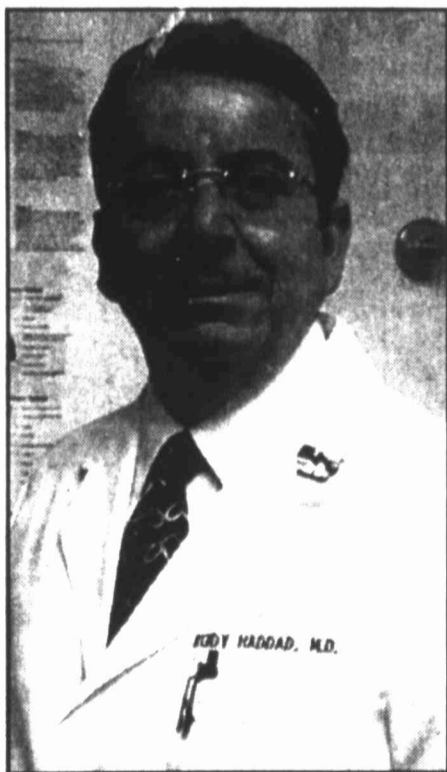

## Restoring Continence and Confidence

"At first, I leaked just a few drops of urine when lifting or coughing. But it has gotten so much worse. Now, I never leave home without wearing a maxi pad and carrying another in my purse. I'm afraid I'll have an accident."

An estimated 17 million American women share a common healthcare concern: the uncontrolled flow of urine from their bodies, a condition known as urinary incontinence. For some women, the condition is brought on with coughing, sneezing or exercise. For others, it is a strong urge to urinate and an inability to make it to the bathroom in time. For all of these women, the effects can be devastating.

"Stress urinary incontinence limits lifestyles and relationships because of the embarrassment that accompanies odor and wetness," explains Dr. Rudy Haddad of Haddad Urology clinic. "Typically the symptoms worsen over time, and so lifestyles and relationships are further compromised as the condition progresses."

Stress urinary incontinence occurs when there is uncontrolled urine leakage during a physical activity like lifting, sneezing or coughing. It typically is the result of hypermobility, a shifting of the urethra and bladder neck from their normal positions, and intrinsic sphincter deficiency, a condition in which the urethral sphincter is unable to close tightly enough to hold urine in the bladder.

Any single condition or a combination of conditions can lead to stress incontinence. Pregnancy and childbirth, aging, medical conditions, infections and medications and obesity are common causes.

Currently, there are no medications available to treat stress incontinence. For some women, behavioral therapy (monitoring fluid intake), Kegel exercises, protective undergarments and bulking injections offer temporary solutions. Fortunately, there also are solutions available designed to be more permanent.

One such solution is the female "sling" system for stress urinary incontinence. Doctors treat incontinence by surgically placing a narrow strip of material—called a sling—under the urethra to give it a point of support.

"The sling procedure is a minimally invasive, highly effective procedure," says Dr. Haddad. "It generally takes less than 20 minutes and commonly is performed on an outpatient basis."

Most patients are continent immediately following the procedure and can resume normal, non-strenuous activities within a few days.

Clinical studies support the enthusiasm that patients and physicians alike have for sling systems. One manufacturer, American Medical Systems of Minnetonka, Minn., reports a study in which more than 95 percent of patients remained completely dry and did not need any protection following the procedure with its Monarc™ Subfascial Hammock.

"The potential to give someone back their lifestyle before incontinence set in is great with sling systems," says Dr. Haddad. "It is life changing for so many patients, and yet such a straightforward procedure."

As with any surgical procedure, inherent risks are present. Although rare, some of the most severe risks with transobturator sling procedures include infection, erosion and vessel or urethra perforation. Some of the most common risks include urinary track infections, urge symptoms and urinary retention. Sling procedures should not be performed on pregnant patients.

# Governors want assurances on prescription drug costs

WASHINGTON — The Medicare drug benefit could erode states' finances if the Bush administration delays reimbursing states for stepping in during the program's troubled start, some governors say.

The federal pledge is one of the main issues governors plan to raise with the president at a White House meeting Monday.

Under the new prescription program, the federal government is relieving states of the cost of buying medicine for poor elderly people. In exchange, states will make monthly payments to Washington to help cover the cost of the benefit.

Many states were upset they had to make this payment at all; some are suing to stop it.

On top of that expense, states have bought medicine for hundreds of thousands of poor people who were not enrolled correctly when the program began Jan. 1. These people might have gone without their drugs without the states' help.

The federal government cannot have it both ways, asking states to make their regular payment and cover the early glitches, said Maine Gov. John Baldacci, a Democrat.

"We've put out \$5.9 million, and for a small state like Maine, that's a lot," Baldacci said in an interview while attending the National Governors Association's winter meeting.

"We can't be expected to pay back what we haven't saved. So we want partnerships developed. We're all tied in this together."

Many members of Congress have demanded reimbursement for states that are paying for drugs on an emergency basis.

The administration has opposed legislative fixes, saying it can handle the matter more quickly. The Health and Human Services Department has said the government will reimburse states for administrative costs as well as any difference between drug costs and payments from private drug plans.

The bill for some states could be substantial.

California said it will seek reimbursement for \$150 million. New York has paid an estimated \$115 million to help older people get medicine. Some states, however, are not seeking a penny because they had little extra expense.

Gov. Mike Huckabee, R-Ark.,

and the association's chairman, said he gets the sense the drug program is working more smoothly, though Arkansas had spent \$6 million it had anticipated and is requesting reimbursement.

"We were one of the states that had some real hiccups in the first weeks," Huckabee said.

"I'm not going to defend the whole program because there were clearly mistakes made. The mistakes were unintentional, but they still had real-life impact," Huckabee said.

"But I also don't want it to get lost that more people are getting prescription drugs than ever before, and they're really getting them at a better price than they've ever had them before," he said. "The net result is a plus, not a negative."

Under the program, about 42

million older people and the disabled are eligible to enroll in a private plan designed to subsidize prescription costs.

One of the biggest complaints is that the program is too complex. Some critics say beneficiaries are discouraged from enrolling because they cannot make sense of the dozens of plans available.

In a 39-page memo to insurers, employers and others running the drug benefit, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services is asking for advice on how to simplify the program.

The agency proposed limiting to two the number of drug plans a company can offer per region. Many insurers now offer three. With more than a dozen insurers often in a single region, consumers can have more than 40 choices.

## Weather threatens Mardi Gras events big and small

NEW ORLEANS — The Bacchus Lounge is a shell of its former self — gutted to the studs after Hurricane Katrina flooded it to the ceiling — but the Krewe of Dreux was determined to celebrate Mardi Gras at the little neighborhood bar Saturday and, weather permitting, march through the surrounding devastation.

Heavy storms in the forecast threatened to drown many of the day's activities: the large, like the celebrity-studded Krewe of Endymion's parade on elaborate floats through the relatively unscathed Uptown area; and the small, like the ragtag Krewe of Dreux's 34th annual trek through the flood-ravaged Gentilly neighborhood.

"We're winging it," Bacchus patron and Krewe of Dreux member

Dave Stephens, who helped gut the bar, said Friday. "We're going to see what the weather does. We plan to march. If the weather prevents that, then we'll party at the Bacchus."

This is the last big weekend of the annual Carnival season, culminating on Mardi Gras, or Fat Tuesday, on Feb. 28 with parades and street parties in and around the city. Tourism officials and merchants are hoping

that the event will gin up an economy reeling since Katrina hit on Aug. 29, flooding 80 percent of the city and dispersing more than two thirds of the population.

There were promising signs Friday in the French Quarter, as the streets began filling with revelers, many in costumes — white Elvis jumpsuits, sexy bustiers, T-shirts with obscene slogans taking aim at government officials.

**Al-Qaida claims attack on Saudi refinery**

ABQAIQ, Saudi Arabia (AP) — Suicide bombers carried out a bold attack on the world's largest oil processing facility but were stopped from breaking in by guards who fired on their cars, exploding both vehicles and killing the attackers.

Al-Qaida purportedly claimed responsibility for the Friday attack, the first on an oil facility in Saudi Arabia. The assault raised speculation that the militants were adopting the tactics of insurgents across the border in Iraq, where the oil industry has been repeatedly targeted.

Saudi Oil Minister Ali Naimi quickly announced that the attack "did not affect operations" and that Abqaiq operations and exports "continued to operate normally." The huge Abqaiq processing facility near the Persian Gulf prepares about two-thirds of the country's oil output for export, making it a crucial link in getting Saudi crude to the market.

Crude oil futures spiked more than \$2 a barrel amid fears militants would again target the vital industry. Light sweet crude for April delivery surged as high as \$63.25 a barrel before settling at \$62.91, an increase of \$2.37 on the New York Mercantile Exchange. Brent crude futures for April delivery jumped \$2.06 to \$62.60 on London's ICE Futures exchange.

The attack in Abqaiq, about 25 miles inland from Saudi Arabia's eastern Gulf coast, took place at about 3 p.m. — several hours after the weekly prayers on Friday, a day off for Saudis though the facility was in operation.

**Gunmen attack mosque in Baghdad**

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — Gunmen attacked a Sunni mosque in western Baghdad on Saturday despite an unusual daytime curfew aimed at curbing a wave of sectarian violence, police said.

Mosque guards returned fire, said police Lt. Thaeir Mahmoud. There was no immediate word on casualties.

Baghdad and three surrounding provinces have

been under a daytime curfew for two days as authorities attempt to rein in violence that has killed more than 140 people since an attack Wednesday on a revered Shiite shrine in Samarra. That triggered reprisal attacks against Sunni mosques.

**Bush Ports deal stands**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Bush administration said it won't reconsider its approval for a United Arab Emirates company to take over significant operations at six U.S. ports. The former head of the Sept. 11 commission said the deal "never should have happened."

Opponents, including the agency that runs New York and New Jersey ports, took their case to court, while the company, Dubai Ports World, stepped up efforts to change the minds of congressional critics.

The president's national security adviser said the White House would keep trying to persuade lawmakers — there's more time since the company offered to delay its takeover — but the administration wouldn't reconsider its approval.

"There are questions raised in the Congress, and what this delay allows is for those questions to be addressed on the Hill," Stephen Hadley said. "There's nothing to reopen."

Thomas Kean, a former Republican governor of New Jersey who led the bipartisan probe of the Sept. 11 attacks, said the deal was a big mistake because of past connections between the 2001 hijackers and the UAE.

**Army charges seven with video sex**

RALEIGH, N.C. (AP) — The Army has recommended that seven 82nd Airborne Division paratroopers be discharged following allegations they engaged in sex acts shown on a gay pornographic Web site.

Three soldiers face courts-martial on charges of sodomy, pandering and engaging in sex acts for money. Four others received nonjudicial punishments, according to a statement released by the military Friday.

The charges do not mention the name of the site, but the division had previously been investigating allegations that soldiers appeared on a gay pornography Web site. A spokesman for the division said the charges were a result of that investigation.

The military-themed Web site did not make any direct reference to the division or Fort Bragg, a sprawling post about 70 miles south of Raleigh.

"As far as we're concerned, it's isolated to the unit, and our investigation determined that these seven individuals were the only ones" involved, said 82nd Airborne spokesman Maj. Thomas Earnhardt.

**Medicare may limit drug plan offerings**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Bush administration is looking at ways to simplify the new Medicare prescription drug benefit, but initial proposals are unlikely to win over the program's critics.

In a 39-page draft memorandum to insurers, employers and others administering the drug benefit, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services asked for advice on how to simplify the program in 2007.

The agency proposed limiting to two the number of drug plans a company can offer per region. Many insurers now offer three, and since there are often more than a dozen insurers per region, consumers often have more than 40 choices.

The agency also said it expects that an insurer's two plans must have meaningful differences to make comparisons easier.

The recommendations appear to be a direct response to concerns that some older and disabled people are confused by the vast array of options.

**Michigan teen downloads billionth song**

WEST BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP, Mich. (AP) — Alex Ostrovsky got more than he bargained for when downloading Coldplay's "Speed of Sound" from the iTunes Music Store.

The 16-year-old's purchase was the one billionth song bought from

the online music service that Apple Computer Inc. kicked off three years ago, charging 99 cents for most tracks. Ostrovsky's selection was from Coldplay's "X&Y" album.

The youth, who lives in the Detroit suburb of West Bloomfield Township, was showered with prizes: a 20-inch iMac, 10 fifth-generation iPods and a \$10,000 iTunes gift card.

Apple also said it would establish a scholarship to the Juilliard School of Music in his name.

"Over one billion songs

have now been legally purchased and downloaded around the globe, representing a major force against music piracy and the future of music distribution as we move from CDs to the Internet," Steve Jobs, Apple's CEO, said in a statement.

**Crow recovering from breast cancer surgery**

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Sheryl Crow says she is recovering from breast cancer surgery and doctors have assured her she should make a full recovery.

Crow had the surgery Wednesday in Los Angeles and is recovering without complications, her publicist, Dave Tomberlin, told The Associated Press.

"Her doctors think her prognosis is excellent," said Tomberlin.

In a statement posted on her Web site, Crow called the surgery "minimally invasive" and said she will be undergoing radiation treatment as a precaution. She said she benefited from early detection.

# Department overcame objections to port security deal

WASHINGTON — The Homeland Security Department objected at first to a United Arab Emirates company's taking over significant operations at six U.S. ports. It was the lone protest among members of the government committee that eventually approved the deal without dissent.

The department's early objections were settled later in the government's review of the \$6.8 billion deal after Dubai-owned DP World agreed to a series of security restrictions.

The company indefinitely has postponed its takeover to give President Bush time to convince Congress that the deal does not pose any increased risks to the U.S. from terrorism.

Some lawmakers have pressed for a new and intensive review. Despite persistent criticism from Republicans and Democrats, the president has defended his administration's approval of the ports deal and threatened to veto any measures in Congress that would

block it. Hearings are to continue this week.

A DP World executive said the company would agree to tougher security restrictions to win congressional support only if the same restrictions applied to all U.S. port operators. The company earlier had struck a more conciliatory stance, saying it would do whatever Bush asked to salvage the agreement.

"Security is everybody's business," senior vice president Michael Moore told The Associated Press. "We're going to have a very open mind to legitimate concerns. But anything we can do, any way to improve security, should apply to everybody equally."

The administration approved the ports deal on Jan. 17 after DP World agreed during secret

negotiations to cooperate with law enforcement investigations in the future and make other concessions.

Some lawmakers have challenged the adequacy of a classified intelligence assessment crucial to assuring the administration that the deal was proper. The report was assembled during four weeks in November by analysts working for the

director of national intelligence.

The report concluded that U.S. spy agencies were "unable to locate any derogatory information on the company," according to a person familiar with the document. This person spoke only on condition of anonymity because the report was classified.

Sen. Carl Levin, D-Mich., and others have complained that the intelligence report focused only on information the agencies collected about DP World and did not examine reported links between UAE government officials and al-Qaida leader Osama bin Laden before the Sept. 11 attacks.

The uproar over DP World has exposed how the government routinely approves deals involving national security without the input of senior administration officials or Congress.

President Bush, Homeland Security Secretary Michael Chertoff, Defense Secretary Donald H. Rumsfeld and Treasury Secretary John

Snow, who oversees the government committee that approved the deal, all say they did not know about the purchase until after it was finalized. The work was done mostly by assistant secretaries.

Snow now says he may consider changes in the approval process so lawmakers are better alerted after such deals get the go-ahead.

Stewart Baker, a senior Homeland Security official, said he was the sole representative on the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States who objected to the ports deal.

Baker said he later changed his vote after DP World agreed to the security conditions. Other officials confirmed Baker's account.

"We were not prepared to sign off on the deal without the successful negotiation of the assurances," Baker told the AP.

Officials from the White House, CIA, departments of State, Treasury, Justice, and others looked for guidance from Homeland Security because it is responsible for seaports.

## Governor 'inclined' to sign abortion bill

PIERRE, S.D. — Gov. Mike Rounds said he is inclined to sign a bill that would ban nearly all abortions in South Dakota, making it a crime for doctors to perform an abortion unless it was necessary to save the woman's life.

The ban, including in cases of rape or incest, was approved Friday by South Dakota lawmakers, setting up a deliberate frontal assault on Roe v. Wade at a time when some activists see the U.S. Supreme Court as more willing than ever to overturn the 33-year-old decision.

Planned Parenthood, which operates the only clinic in the state that provides abortions, vowed to sue. But even before the bill has a signature, money to defend it poured in. Lawmakers were told during the debate that an anonymous donor pledged \$1 million to defend the ban.

"We've had people stopping in our office trying to drop off checks to promote the defense of this legislation already," Rounds said.

Many opponents and supporters of abortion

rights believe the U.S. Supreme Court is more likely to overturn its 1973 Roe v. Wade decision legalizing abortion now that conservatives John Roberts and Samuel Alito are on the bench. Lawmakers said growing support among South Dakotans for abortion restrictions gave the bill momentum.

"I think the stars are aligned," said Matthew Michels, a Republican.

The legislation was decried by opponents who said it would particularly impact rape victims and poor women. Currently, a clinic in Sioux Falls is the only place where abortions are provided in South Dakota. The closest alternative is a Planned Parenthood location in Sioux City, Iowa, about 90 miles away.

"It's a sad state of affairs that we have only one choice (for abortion) right now," said Charon Asetoyer of the Native American Women's

Health Care Education Resource Center in Lake Andes. "But if you have to go out of state, the cost of making that trip will be prohibitive."

If a rape victim becomes pregnant and bears a child, the rapist could have the same parental rights as the mother, said Krista Heeren-Graber, executive director of the South Dakota Network Against Family Violence and Sexual Assault.

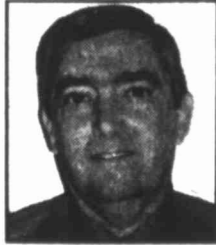
"The idea the rapist could be in the child's life ... makes the woman very, very fearful. Sometimes they need to have choice," Heeren-Graber said.

About 800 abortions are performed in South Dakota each year. Leslee Unruh, president of the Alpha Center, a Sioux Falls pregnancy counseling agency that tries to steer women away from abortion, said most of them do not stem from rape or even failed contraception, but are simply "conveniences."

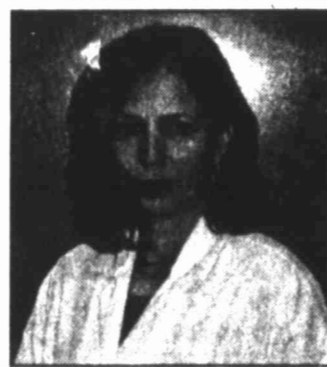

# Slaying of teen after 5 calls to police raises questions

ODESSA — The dying body of 19-year-old Diana Ponce lie sprawled across a pool of blood on the kitchen floor, her face blasted by a shotgun, her womb still holding an 8-month-old baby girl.

The teenager's mother was found in a nearby hallway of the small home they shared, moaning and clinging to life after being shot several times.

An empty shotgun owned by Ponce's common-law husband, Leo Angel Luna, lie beneath the kitchen table where the family ate Christmas dinner just days earlier. Spent shells were strewn on the floor.

That was the disturbing scene police found on their fifth domestic disturbance call to the home in less than 24 hours — a fact that prompted relatives and domestic abuse experts to wonder if officers could have done more to prevent the killings. But police and other abuse experts say the case is a snapshot of a system that can only do so much.

"I wish the police would have put Leo in jail where he belonged and none of this would have ever happened," said Socorro Pando, the older brother of Blanca Ponce, Diana's mother.

Police said they were powerless to arrest Luna the first four times because there was no probable cause or evidence of

violence. An internal police investigation found no wrongdoing by officers.

"There's no specific authority for police in the law that just because you go somewhere four times you take any action," Police Chief Christopher Pipes said. "It is a little unusual to go somewhere four times in one day, but it's not unheard of."

Diana died at a hospital after she told paramedics that Luna shot her, according to a police affidavit. Her baby, Lydia, died after an emergency Caesarean delivery. Her 49-year-old mother died at the house.

The death toll could have been higher.

Diana's 21-year-old brother escaped the house and is recovering from a gunshot wound to his face. Her 3-year-old son was home at the time of the shootings, court records indicate.

Luna, 21, is jailed on bail of \$1.6 million, charged with capital murder and aggravated assault. A grand jury is scheduled to hear his case Monday.

He said in a recent jailhouse interview that he's innocent, that the shootings were accidental.

Diana met Leo in 2000. She was sad that day because her parents weren't celebrating her 14th birthday, so Leo's brother arranged a celebration and introduced the couple, said Lisa Luna, Leo's sister.

They hit it off quickly. Within months Diana was pregnant

and the couple moved into a duplex with Lisa.

Diana and Leo, who both dropped out of school before ninth grade, worked in restaurants and stores, Lisa said. She said her brother also did some odd jobs and sold some marijuana.

They had fights like "any normal couple," but it never got violent, she said.

Police reports indicate otherwise.

On Oct. 6, Diana told police that Leo threw her to the floor, kicked and punched her, and whipped her back with a metal coat hanger. She said he then aimed a 12-gauge shotgun at her.

"She stated he's always threatens to kill her with the shotgun," according to an officer's report. "Tonight she stated he pointed the gun at her and said 'tonight is the night you die.'"

Diana was taken to a shelter for abused women, but four days later she decided not to press charges. She told police she had lied about the shotgun and refused to have photos taken of alleged injuries.

Taking back accusations is common in abusive relationships, experts said.

"They come back with a lot of promises, say they didn't mean it," said Carol Wayland, executive director of a local shelter called Safe House. "People kind of buy into it and think that

maybe they provoked it or caused it, didn't do the things they were expected to do right."

Whatever her reasons, Diana reunited with Leo, and the two moved to her mother's house, relatives said.

Less than two months later, the domestic disturbance calls started. Each began with allegations of Leo assaulting Diana or her mother. The calls generated no reports or arrests, but the internal investigation included the following descriptions:

— Dec. 27, 12:59 p.m.: After 12 minutes at the house, "the officer found no evidence of any violation of the law."

— 1:56 p.m.: A caller said Leo was refusing to leave. After an officer learned Blanca wanted Leo's rifle out of her house, he drove Leo — with his shotgun in a white trash bag — to a nearby house. Leo agreed not to return. Officers were at the house for 16 minutes.

— 3:31 p.m.: Blanca alleged Leo pushed and punched her. Police observed no injuries, determined there was no offense and left after 24 minutes.

— 6:52 p.m.: A caller said Leo was causing problems and refused to leave. After initially disagreeing on whether Leo could stay, Blanca and her husband decided he should leave. Officers were at the house for 26 minutes.

— Dec. 28, 11:41 a.m.: On the

way to the final disturbance call, officers heard a report of shots fired.

About that time, according to court records, neighbor Monica Saldana reported seeing a man pull a shotgun from a white bag and enter the home.

"I came inside right away," said Saldana, who reported hearing gunshots and then seeing the man walk from the house without a shotgun. Alongside him was a young boy, court records show.

After his arrest, Leo told The Associated Press that he is innocent, and the shots were fired as he scuffled with William Ponce, Diana's brother.

Leo, appearing subdued during the interview, cried as he pulled from a chest pocket in his jail jumpsuit a crumpled picture of Diana from her newspaper obituary, saying the picture meant the world to him.

If the shootings did stem from abuse as relatives allege, they were in spite of strong laws and numerous resources for battered women.

"We have come a great long way to develop services, but we do have a long way to go to make sure those services are available at the right time when the women need them," said Barbara Paradiso, director of the Center on Domestic Violence at the University of Colorado at Denver.

## ODDS AND ENDS

RIVERSIDE, Calif. (AP) — School officials have put a chill on two students' plans to wage a "snow day" at their high school.

Two Ramona High School students were suspended for bringing snow to school after officials declared snowballs dangerous.

"Anything that disturbs that or disrupts that is inappropriate on a school campus," said Principal Mike Nece.

"Anything that could cause injury, or could cause a student to get upset and instigate a fight, or damage students' personal property is just inappropriate behavior."

Seniors Michael Sepulveda and Daniel Zavala made a pre-dawn run to a resort area of the San Bernardino Mountains to fill their pickup trucks with snow

and bring it to school for what they hoped would turn into an annual "bring Big Bear to Riverside" ritual.

They were suspended after a school parking lot snowball fight before the start of classes Thursday.

Zavala and Sepulveda were stunned.


"The school overdid it. In the handbook it does not say 'do not bring snow to school,'" Zavala commented Thursday afternoon.

"It's snow," Sepulveda said.

Savala's mother Martha Valdez called the boys' actions "harmless" but said she supported the decision by school officials.

"They're still there to mandate the rules, and they have to draw the line somewhere."



# Officials suspend search for trapped Mexican miners

SAN JUAN DE SABINAS, Mexico — Rescuers suspended the search for 65 trapped Mexican coal miners for up to three days because of toxic gas levels, enraging relatives of the missing men who accused the government of abandoning them.

The announcement Friday followed five days of backbreaking digging. Officials said the levels of toxic gas were increasing as rescuers advanced deeper into the mine and it looked increasingly unlikely that anyone survived.

"We can't risk more lives," said Xavier Garcia, president of Industrial Minera Mexico, a subsidiary of mining company Grupo Mexico SA de CV. "We can't risk another explosion with people inside. We are making our best effort with our

heart in our hand to resolve this problem."

Mine operators said the search will be halted while machines pump out methane gas and improve the air quality in the Pasta de Conchos mine, where a pre-dawn explosion on Feb. 19 brought down thousands of tons of rubble and filled tunnels with toxic gas.

"This decision was made carefully in the interest of protecting the rescue crews," said Arturo Bermea, director general of mine owner Industrial Minera Mexico. He said U.S. mine experts also recommended rescue efforts be halted until gas levels were lowered.

Crews were expected to return in two to three days, he said.

The news angered families and friends who yelled "you're abandoning us" from their makeshift camp outside the

mine's gates.

A group of women attacked company executives and government officials, pulling on their clothing and shouting. Two women were taken away on stretchers, kicking and screaming, while the executives and officials were escorted away by police.

"Only a miracle could save them," Mexican Labor Secretary Francisco Salazar told reporters and relatives who have camped out for five winter nights outside the gates of the mine, 85 miles southwest of Eagle Pass, Texas.

Hundreds of rescue workers, most of whom are miners themselves, had advanced 875 yards inside the 1.75-mile-long mine, to an area where as many as 26 of the 65 missing miners were believed to be trapped.

But mine administrator Ruben Escudero said there was

no sign of them, which he said meant they either had been buried under debris or were in a different part of the mine.

Mexican scientists working with 10 visiting experts from the U.S. Mine Safety and Health Administration said that because of high levels of toxic gas, no one working in that section could have survived.

Laura Silva, the wife of a trapped miner, said the company should have lowered the gas levels from the first day.

"The company doesn't care about our husbands," she said. Teresa Contreras, 30, another wife of a trapped miner, however, said she didn't want more tragedies.


"I want to see my husband," she said. "I know he's alive. But my pain is not reason enough to endanger more human beings who have children at home."

The Vatican sent a message to Bishop Alonso Gerardo Garza Trevino of the nearby community of Piedras Negras, saying Pope Benedict XVI was praying for the miners.

Many of the relatives prayed and sang together around campfires, or attended Catholic Masses and Protestant services celebrated outside the mine's gates.

In a statement issued Friday, mine owner Grupo Mexico said it will give the 65 miners — if they are found alive — the equivalent of 10 years of their annual salary, or about \$75,000. A company spokesman said if the miners are found dead, the families would receive the payment.

For more than five days, rescuers have dug with picks, shovels, and their hands to avoid explosions that could be sparked by machinery.



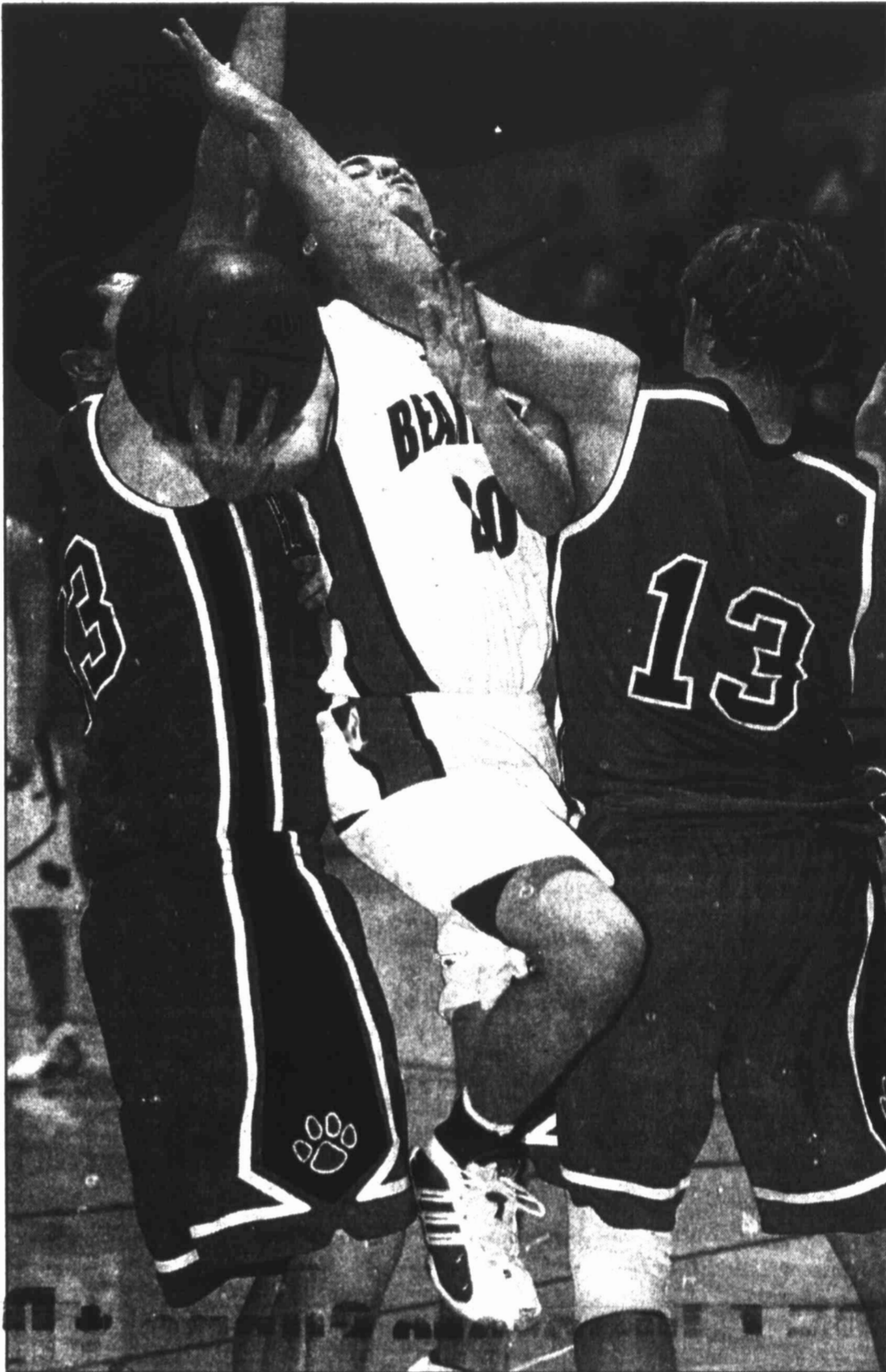

With the Buffs' big men on the bench, Kurt Kerns took over and upended any hopes of the comeback bid.

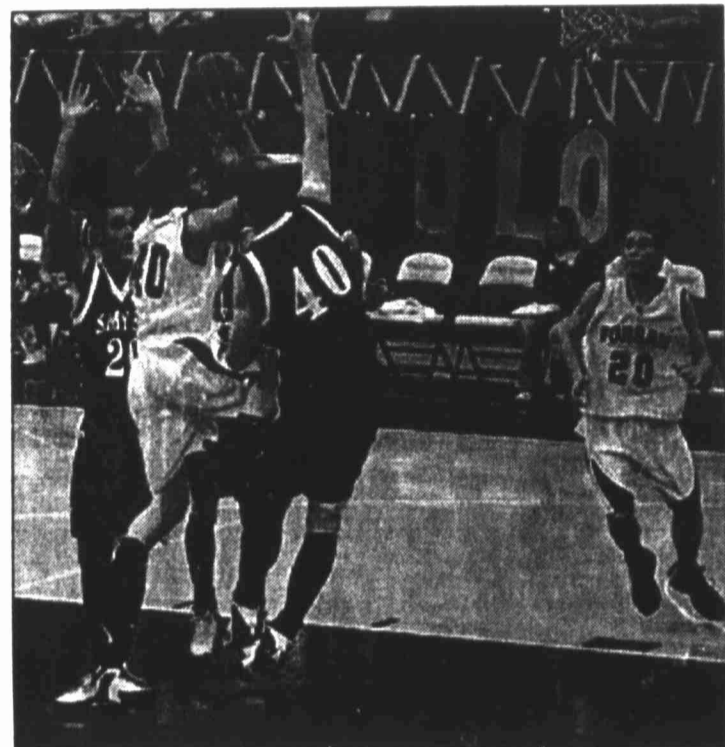

Bailey led the Buffalo scorers on the night with seven points and five rebounds. Baker and Seth Johnson scored six and five, respectively.

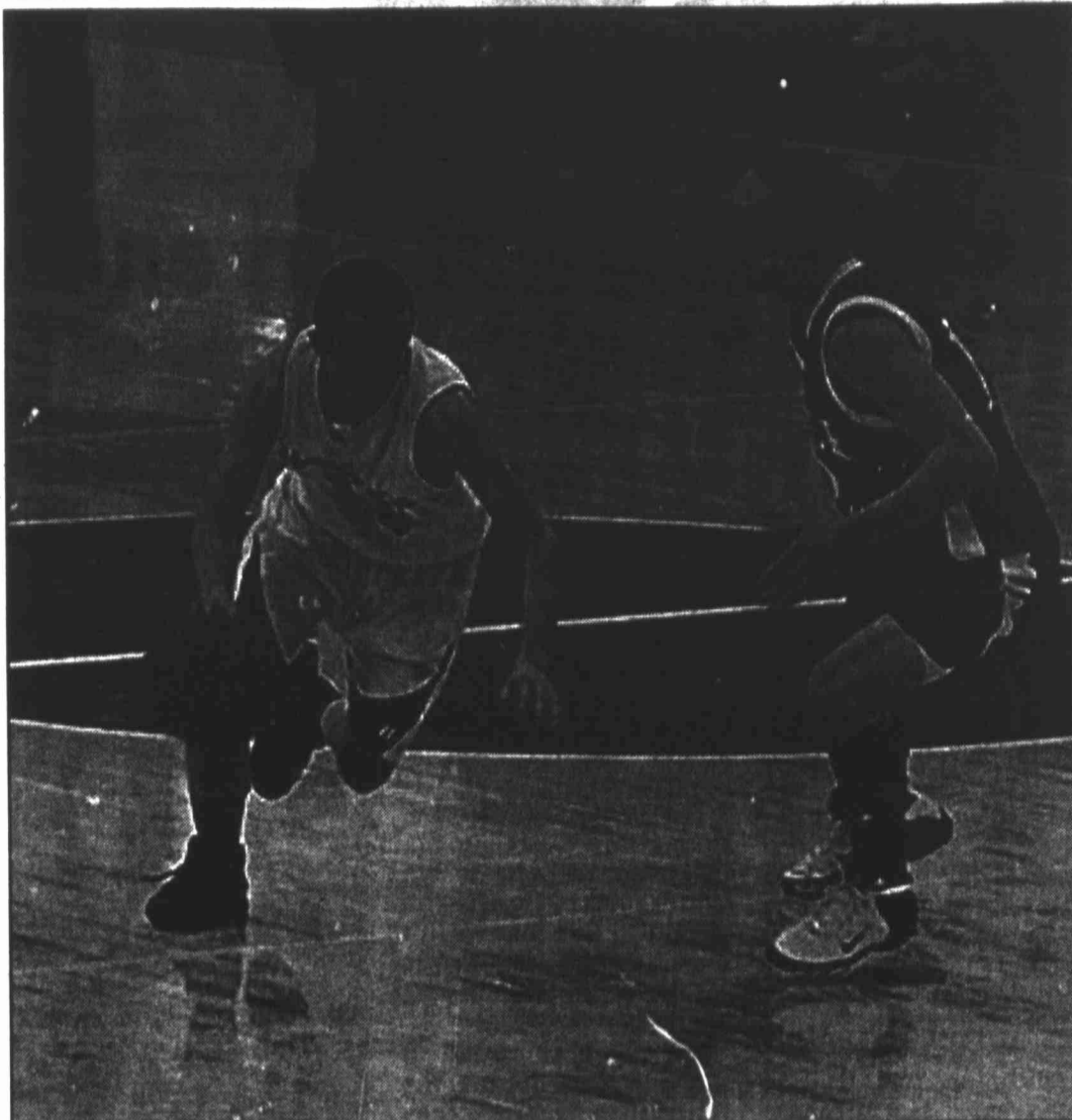
Kurt Kerns led all scorers with 18 points.

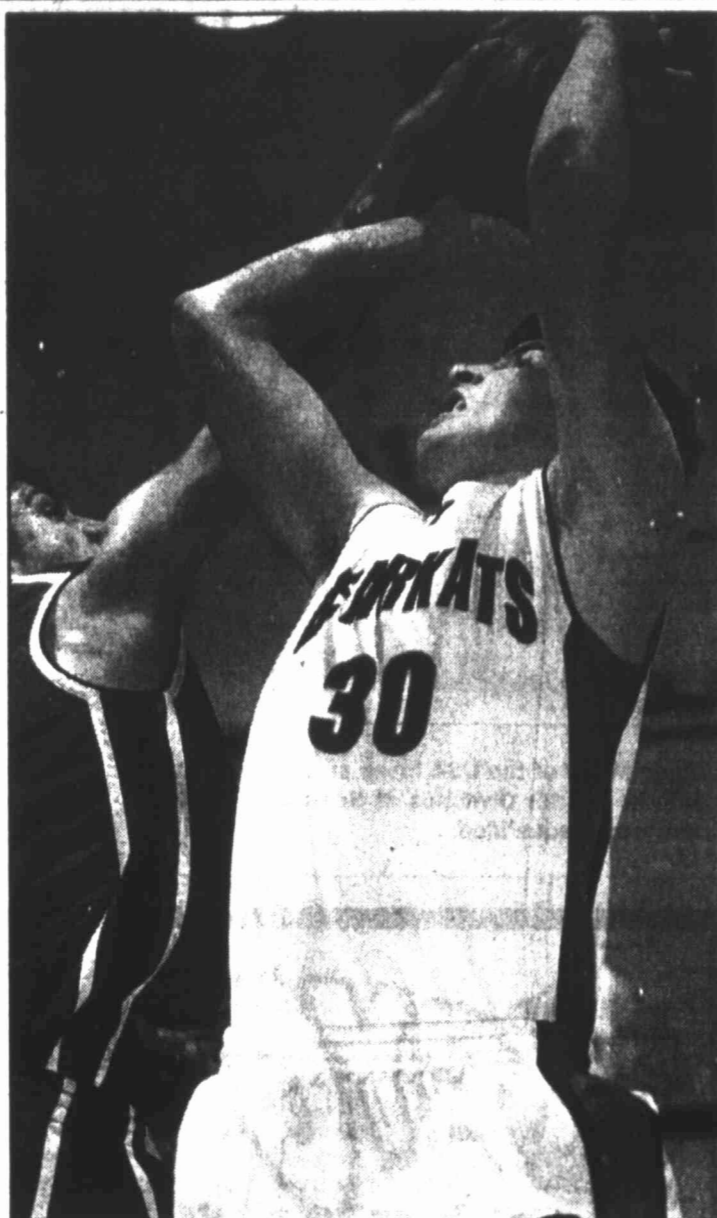

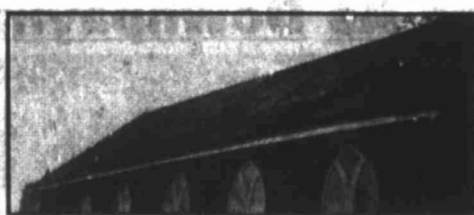

nine of the team's 12 hits. Seniors David Hughes, Kacee Coberly and Cody Griffith each recorded two hits. Hughes added two RBIs, while Griffith scored twice and had one RBI.

Two freshman had impressive varsity debuts for Coahoma. P.J. Daylong went two-for-three with a triple and scored twice, while Donnie Garcia had one hit, one RBI and scored one run.

Things did not go as well Friday for Coahoma as 12 errors resulted in two losses. The Bulldogs lost to Seminole, 12-0, in the first game Friday and dropped the second game to Denver City, 10-6.

Coberly started against Seminole and took the loss as he gave up 10 runs — five of which were earned — and seven hits. He struck out seven. Junior Ryan Walker pitched one inning of relief and gave up one earned run. The game ended in the fifth due to 10-run mercy rule.

The story of the game was Coahoma's six errors, said Harman.

"We had three errors alone in the third inning and that's when the wheels came off as Seminole scored five runs in the inning," said Harman. "We just didn't make plays on some routine ground balls."

The Bulldogs got only two hits in the game and they were recorded by Griffith and Hughes.

"We played back-to-back without any rest and you can tell the guys are not in midseason form yet," said Harman. "We just got tired."

Six more errors in the second game against Denver City led to another loss. Denver City scored five runs off three errors in the first inning and held on to win by four runs.

Coahoma did not score in the first inning, but got one run in each of the next four innings and crossed the plate twice in the sixth, but it wasn't enough.

"The errors in this game were crucial because it kept them in the game," said Harman.

The Bulldogs also had

trouble at the plate as they left 11 runners on base.

"We just didn't come through at the plate when we had runners in scoring position," said Harman. "But I thought we hit the ball well overall."

Garcia and Walker split time on the mound. Garcia started and took the loss as he gave up eight runs — three earned runs — and seven hits and struck out four. Walker threw three innings and gave up one earned run and three hits and struck out three.

Hughes had three hits and two RBIs to lead the Bulldogs at the plate. Griffith had two hits, including a triple, and had two RBIs. Coberly went one-for-one and had three walks with two runs and his hit was a triple.

Coahoma (1-2) finished up action at the Brownfield Tournament Saturday with another game against Shallowater, but results were unavailable at press time.

The Bulldogs play their home opener Tuesday at 6 p.m. against Kermit.

Hall of Famer Sharp to resign as Texas Tech's head coach

Associated Press Writer LUBBOCK — Texas Tech coach Marsha Sharp has known for the past couple of years that she was close to calling it quits.

On Friday, the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame coach who won an NCAA

title at Tech and turned the school into a perennial national power, made it official — she'll resign at the end of the season.

"It's not something that you do very easily, obviously," the 53-year-old Sharp said. "When you do something for 24 years, you have to be sure that it's time to take the next

step."

During 24 seasons in Lubbock, Sharp has taken Tech to 16 straight NCAA appearances, reaching the Elite Eight four times and the Sweet 16 seven times. The Lady Raiders won the national title in 1993 when Sheryl Swoopes led them to a 31-3 record.

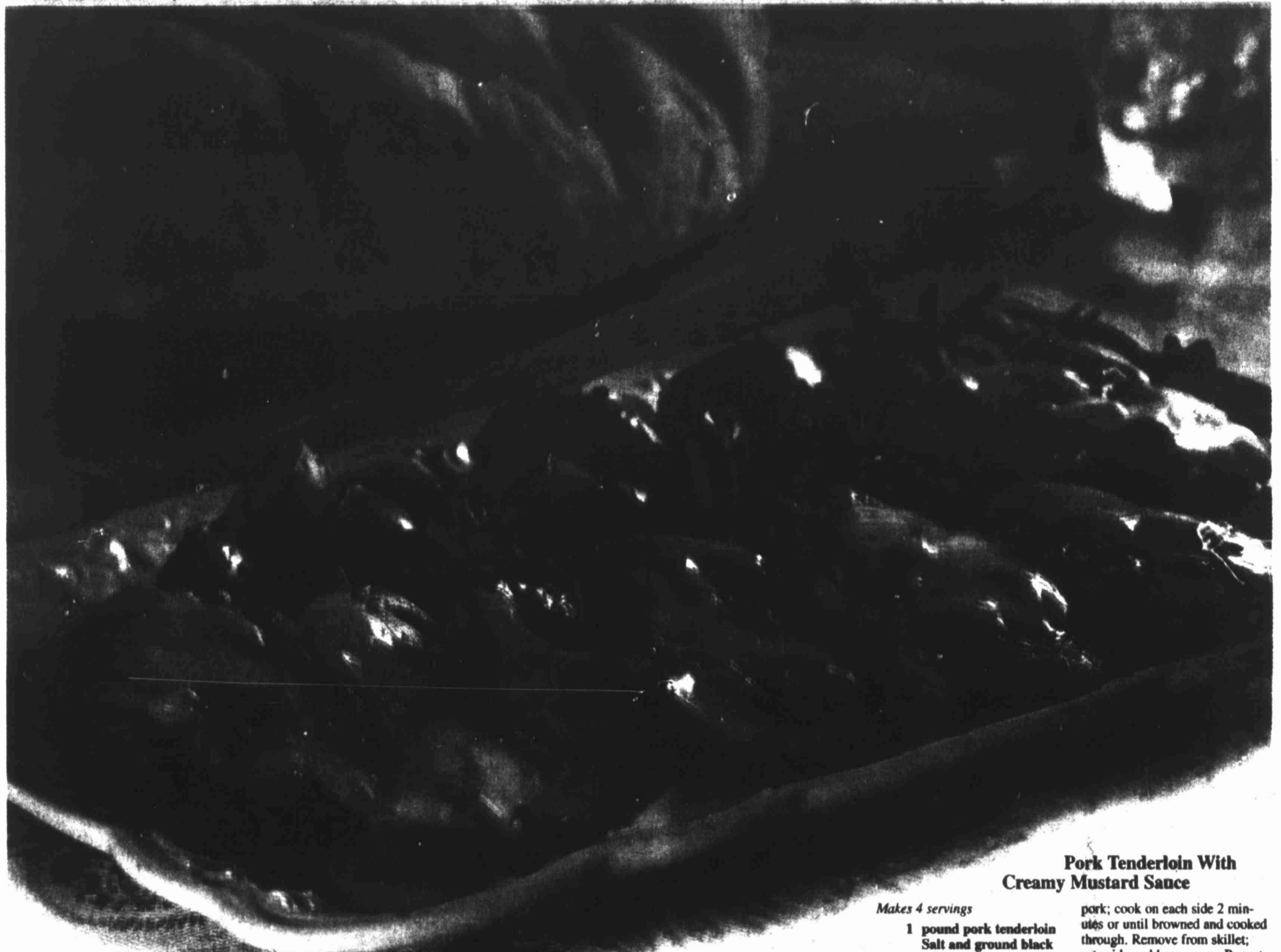

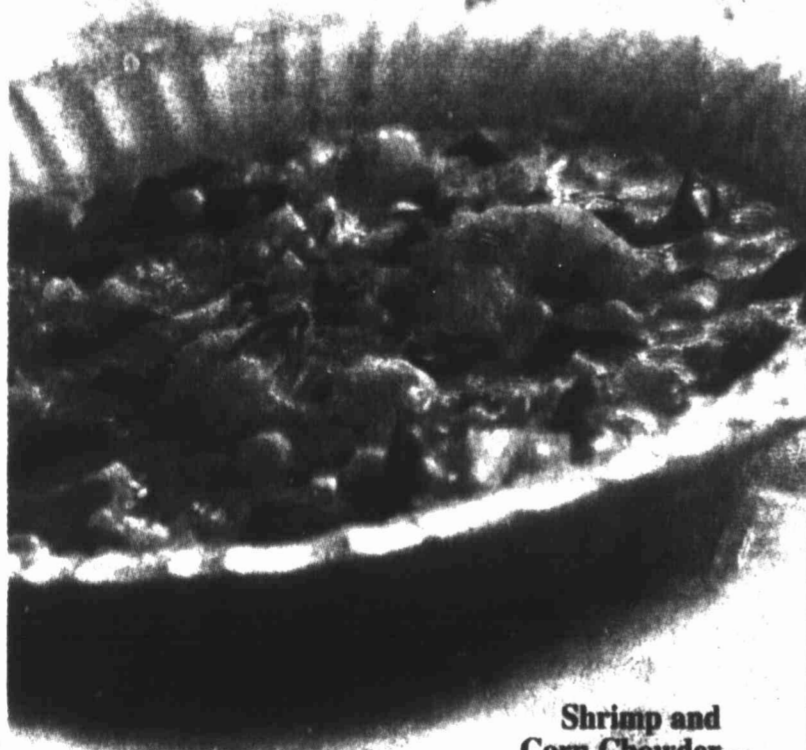

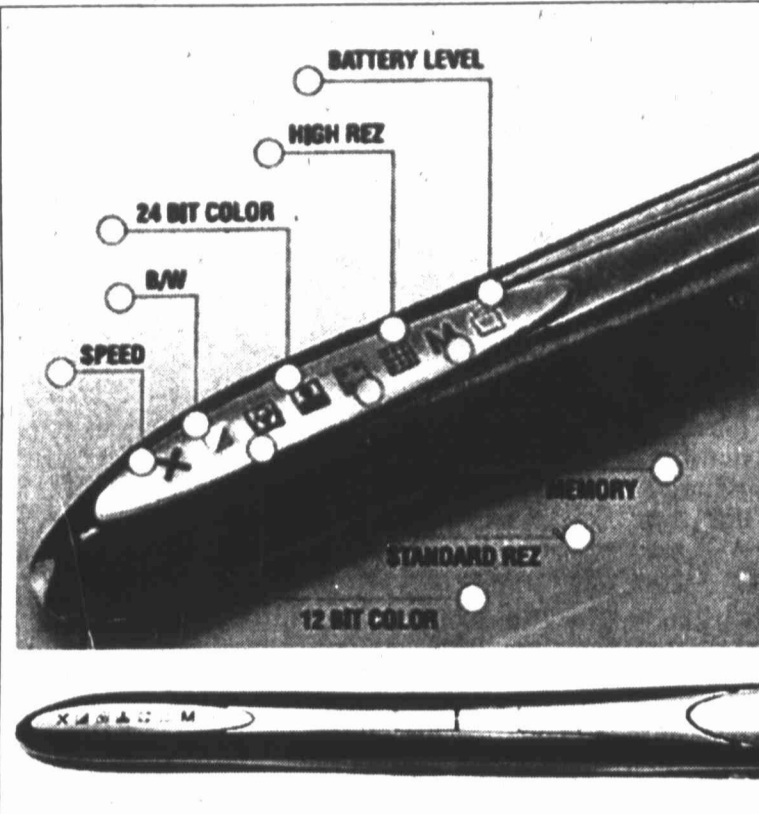

## Can't blog your way out of this one

Few companies have established blogging rules but posters be warned

The number of bloggers continues to grow, but the number of workplace policies explaining the company's rules on blogging remains anemic. And that can cause a lot of workplace angst for both management and workers.

Although there are no real statistics on how many people have been fired for something they wrote on their personal Web logs, the stories keep com-

ing:

A reporter in Dover, Del., was fired earlier this month for offensive postings on his personal blog.

He was just added to the list. Remember "Washingtonienne,"

the intern who embarrassed her bosses on Capitol Hill when she described sexcapades with unnamed staffers? There was also "QueenofSky," a Delta flight attendant who was fired after she posed provocatively

(she meant for it to be funny, she said) in her uniform. A Microsoft employee was canned after he posted a picture that included Macs the company had purchased. And of course there is blogger Heather Armstrong, who was fired in 2002 from her Web design job for writing about work and colleagues on her site, Dooce.com. That's where bloggers get the now-popular term, to be "dooiced": to be fired because of one's blog.

According to a survey done by

the Society for Human Resource Management in July, 85 percent of companies do not have a written policy that provides employees with guidelines on what is acceptable to write about in a personal blog, while 8 percent do.

But do companies really have to write a policy to explain something that might seem a no-brainer?

Quite possibly: Another survey conducted by the Society

## GM to put the brakes on GTO production

Little GTO, you're really lookin' fine. Three deuces and a four-speed and a 389....

Ronny & the Daytonas had it right back in 1964 when Pontiac's GTO was king of the muscle cars.

But far from lookin' fine, today's GTO is lookin' pretty dead.

General Motors Corp. reintroduced the GTO in December 2003 after a 30-year hiatus, but the struggling automaker said Tuesday that it would stop building the car in June.

Company executives say the \$32,000 GTO is going away because redesigning it to meet federal air bag rules for 2007 is too expensive.

Pontiac's classic muscle car was affectionately known as "the goat" when it was launched.

With the GTO's three deuces—a reference to the trio of

two-barrel carburetors—the original 389-cubic-inch, 360-horsepower model immortalized in song delivered just 10 miles per gallon around town and 17 mpg on the highway. That mileage dropped precipitously when a driver would, as the song urged, "turn it on, wind it up, blow it out GTO."

The GTO's high performance and rugged looks inspired other muscle cars. The vehicle lasted a decade before being dropped from GM's roster in 1973 amid

But instead of the eye-catching muscular design that made the original GTO stand out, today's version has the bland styling of a standard passenger car. And the latest GTO isn't even made in the U.S.—it's a modified Australian car made by GM's Holden subsidiary.



slumping sales. By then, federal emissions controls had sapped the GTO's power, and the first OPEC crisis was spurring a national U-turn toward fuel-efficient, four-cylinder compacts from Japan.

Today's GTO delivers more punch, 400-horsepower, and better fuel economy at 16 mpg city and 21 on the highway.

performance, but not the look, and in today's market you need all three," said Rebecca Lindland, auto industry analyst at Global Insight in Lexington, Mass. Last year Pontiac sold 11,590 GTOs. The pace slowed in January to 594 cars. So the real reason GM is ending production is that this GTO, unlike its predecessor, never scored a hit—in showrooms or on Billboard's top 10.

## Venezuela bars two U.S. airlines

CARACAS, Venezuela (AP) — Venezuela plans to prohibit Continental Airlines and Delta Air Lines from flying into this South American nation and is restricting flights by a third major U.S. carrier, American Airlines, the head of the nation's federal aviation agency said.

Francisco Paz, president of the National Aviation Institute, said Thursday the

action was taken because the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration had established a similar ban on some Venezuelan carriers serving routes to the United States 10 years ago due to safety violations. Venezuela said the U.S. has failed to recognize improvements since then.

The orders would take effect on March 1, Paz told the local Globovision television channel.

Atlanta-based Delta Air Lines currently operates a daily route from Simon Bolivar international Airport to Atlanta while Continental Airlines has daily flights from the airport to its base in Houston and weekly flights to New York.

"We are very disappointed by this unilateral action by the Venezuelan government and we are working closely with the U.S. departments of State and Transportation, as well as the airlines who received similar notice, to resolve the issue as quickly as possible," said Gina Laughlin, a spokeswoman for Delta Air Lines Inc.

Continental Airlines Inc. spokesman Martin DeLeon says the carrier is declining any comment on the matter.

Venezuela would eliminate some daily flights by AMR Corp.'s American Airlines between Venezuela and the U.S., but it wasn't immediately clear which ones. The airline operates flights to

## Prenup pact roadmap to dollars, sense

Put yourself in Anna Nicole Smith's stilettoes.

At 26, you marry a Texas oil tycoon more than 60 years your senior. He dies a short time later. A decade goes by, and you're still wrangling with your stepson over the multimillion-dollar estate, all the way to the Supreme Court this month. It could have been avoided if you and your octogenarian fiancé had drawn up a prenuptial agreement.

Maybe it's a stretch to imagine yourself in the former Playboy playmate's situation. But with the start of the wedding season just a few months away, it's a good time for engaged couples to consider whether a prenuptial contract is for them.

Basically, a prenup is a legal agreement signed before the marriage that details how assets will be divided in the event of a divorce or if one partner dies.

Lawyers and financial advisers say a "prenup" can spur financial discussions among couples and help them avoid dis-

putes when married. Or, at least, it can make things smoother in a divorce. But a prenup is difficult for partners to bring up, and friction can ignite if both sides aren't on board.

Nevertheless, lawyers and financial planners say couples increasingly are entering into such pacts.

"More people are getting married older and wealthier. And they have more to protect today than ever before," says John Mayoue, an Atlanta divorce lawyer who represented Jane Fonda and Marianne Gingrich.

Business owners, for instance, want to make sure their enterprise remains viable even if the marriage doesn't. Those on their second or so marriage often want to preserve assets for children from a previous union. And even first-timers will get a prenup if one partner has far more assets—or far more debt—than the other, lawyers say.

Eric Brotman, a financial planner in Timonium, Md., is drawing up a prenup with his fiancée. It's his second marriage; her first. Brotman said the prenup will

exclude his business from the marital pot. That way his business won't be at risk of being liquidated if the marriage collapses.

"My clients and employees and all their families could suffer by my having marital problems," the 34-year-old says. "I can't let that happen."

State law governs marriage, so the rules on prenups vary across the United States. But lawyers say there are certain characteristics prenups generally must have to avoid being successfully challenged if a divorce occurs.

— First of all, both sides must fully disclose assets and liabilities.

"You want to know what you are getting into and what you are missing out on," says John Readey, a lawyer in Kansas City, Mo.

— Each person must be represented by independent legal counsel.

The agreement must be fair and reasonable. "It can't be over-reaching," says Richard Jacobs, a family lawyer in

from time to time something comes along that is so cool it makes us sit up and take notice. One such device is the DocuPen RC800 from Planon.

Looking much like a quality pen, the RC800 is actually a 24-bit color scanner. With resolutions from 100 to 400 dots per inch, this incredible little 1.75-ounce piece of technology lets you take a full-sized page and scan its

entire contents into the pen in about 4 seconds. Unlike previous pen scanner models that only scanned in one or a few lines at a time via the tip of the pen, the RC800 uses its entire body length to scan in the complete page. Just move the pen from top to bottom, or left to right if it's a bound book.

As you move the RC800, little multicolored indicator lights tell you if you are moving the pen at the correct speed during the scan as well as indicating

battery level, scanning resolution and available memory. The pen's dual roller guiding system insures you move the pen in a steady direction. The RC800 comes with 8 megabytes of flash memory that can store up to 100 pages of text. Images such as color photographs can take up more room. If 8 megabytes is not enough for your needs, you can insert an optional Micro SD Flash memory card into the pen. These tiny memory wafers are available in 128- and 256-

megabyte sizes.

Once the page is captured, you can offload the data into your computer by connecting the RC800 to a computer via its USB port. The DocuPen RC800 is an incredible piece of technology that even I find a bit difficult to believe possible. But it is, it's here now and you can have it for \$299.99. The DocuPen RC800 is available in seven different colors including Blue Streak and Crimson Pearl. Currently it works with Windows only.

for Human Resource Management said that 3 percent of 278 human resource professionals in early 2005 said they had disciplined workers for blogs.

With more than 8 million blogs — and growing — in the United States, employers will find themselves dealing with issues related to personal blogs, just as they scratched their heads a decade ago when they tried to decide how to deal with employee e-mail and Internet usage. (More than likely, your company has a policy regarding those tools.)

Meanwhile, according to the Society for Human Resource Management, 7 percent of human resource professionals read job candidates' blogs to gather information on them before the company decided whether to hire them.

Anything people write in a blog is public information — that is, after all, the whole point. Even

if they write under a pseudonym or if they write a blog on their personal time, their bosses or co-workers can easily find their online musings. And many employers and potential employers do spend time trolling the Internet for mentions of their company or their own names, particularly in blogs.

Then, if something unseemly comes up, that person might not get a job. Is that legal? Absolutely. For the most part, unless a company is practicing discrimination based on race, sex, gender or national origin, that company can pretty much fire — or not hire — anyone for any reason.

But, of course, not all blogging is a problem. This is evidenced by the fact a growing number of companies host space on the company Web site for company bloggers. The thought is these people are interested in the company and its products, and unless they reveal secrets, their blogs can be great marketing tools.

Towson.

A millionaire, for instance, can't insist that a long-time spouse be penniless after a divorce.

— One partner can't coerce the other to sign a prenup.

Jacobs says he successfully challenged a prenup on grounds it was signed under duress. The lawyer groom had whipped out the contract for the bride to sign on the way to the ceremony, he says.

Timing is often an issue to avoid

claims of duress. Partners need time to negotiate and understand what they're signing. Mayouad advises broaching the subject six months before the wedding and finishing the prenup a month prior to the trip to the altar.

# 'Running Scared' is a movie you endure

"Running Scared" isn't a movie you watch. You endure it, like a brutal beat-down.

It's an opera of excess, an orgy of blood, bullets, abuse, and really, really bad language. It's the director of "The Cooler" trying to out-Tony Tony Scott, purveyor of "True Romance" and "Domino."

Couldn't stand "True Romance." Couldn't bear "Domino."

But something about this way-HAY over the top dum-dum bullet of a movie hits. Call its boundary-busting badness a Tarantino parody or a "message" or, as is most likely, an instant cult film, but you can't say it doesn't hit you like a big-bore slug at close range.

Paul Walker is Joey Gazelle, a low-level Jersey mob functionary whose job is disposing of guns used in crimes. Only he doesn't. He stashes them, "insurance," he tells his thonged mob moll of a wife (Vera Farmiga, very good).

But his lousy neighborhood means he has lowlife neighbors, such as an abusive, meth-making Russian scumbag named Anzor (Karel Roden). Anzor's stepson spies Joey hiding a gun and swipes it. And darned if he doesn't shoot the old man in the middle of an epic, stoned "Vy can't John Wayne not get kilt in 'The Cowboys' dis time?" rant.

Bad news. That gun was used in a bloody shootout with dirty cops in the film's opening scene.

You don't want your own mob figuring out you have weapons that can tie them to crimes. You don't want the Russian mob all over you, either.

You don't want crooked cop Chazz Palminteri coming down on you.

"I got the toughest mob in the world. I'm the law."

And you don't want little asthmatic Oleg, played by Cameron Bright ("Birth"), the creepiest kid in the movies, trotting around Jersey, pulling that gun and dispensing rough Mighty Mouse justice on anybody who crosses his tracks.

"Here I come to save the day!"

Kramer turns one long night, played in whiplash flashback, into a nightmarish descent into Hell, N.J.

Oleg crosses paths with murderous crackheads, brutal pimps, gangsters, cops and a married couple who top them all.

Jerry sprints from one dead end to the next, maniacally hunting down the evidence that would end him, his family, and his family's family, often bringing his own 10-year-old along for the ride.

"You just killed me," he screams at the kid, after one bad lead too many.

Walker takes what is certainly his best role by the teeth and holds his own with every movie wiseguy under the Jersey sun. But Farmiga, a veteran of TV and bit movie parts, chews it up and delivers the movie's best and funniest lines.

"Joey," she tells her mobster husband, "I have never seen evil before tonight. I did not marry an evil man. Shady, maybe. Sleazy, sure ..."

Yeah well, "in sickness and in health," yadda yadda. If you're not laughing with this, you're laughing at it. In between gasps.

The mobsters are stereotypes, something veteran baddie Palminteri acknowledges when he calls them "goombahs." The action is so frenetically shot that you're thrown right into the middle of the mayhem - confused, frightened, shocked at what you've just seen, looking to wipe the blood off your popcorn.

It's borderline irresponsible, a virtual horror movie of a gangster thriller.

It's incredibly violent, but therein lies some of the message of "Running Scared." This is what it takes to jolt us these days. This is what can happen with just one loose gun bouncing down the wrong streets.

And this is what happens when you channel Quentin Tarantino, and you sleep in Tony Scott's bed. Somebody's gonna need to change the sheets.

# Tyler Perry anticipates his 'Family Reunion'

LOS ANGELES — When "Diary of a Mad Black Woman" opened last February, more articles were written about a Wes Craven werewolf flick and a supposed comedy pairing Tommy Lee Jones with cheerleaders.

After "Diary" scooped up nearly \$22 million, Hollywood was stunned. The media was stunned. Film critics, who mostly panned the movie, were stunned. The film's writer, Tyler Perry? Not so stunned.

"I wasn't surprised, I was thankful," says Perry. "Again, being on tour all over the country, you see all of these people and they say, 'We're going, Tyler. We're going to support you. We're going to support you.' And then they go. So I was grateful. I knew they were there, but to have them go was a whole 'nother thing."

"Madea's Family Reunion," Perry's "Diary" follow-up, won't be sneak up on anybody. The film, which features Perry as smack-talking, pistol-pack-

ing, audience-friendly Madea, has a slightly higher budget and a few familiar faces (including Blair Underwood, Lynn Whitfield, and Cicely Tyson), but the same difficult-to-describe style.

"It's schizophrenic — that's how I describe it," Perry explains with a laugh. "It's all over the place, man. It's joy, it's happy, it's sad, it's everything. It's just an emotional roller coaster, you know? Even the plays themselves, you come to see them and it's like a stand-up comedic routine. I'm breaking the wall. I'm talking to the audience. It's theater. It's some of everything. It's concert."

One thing Perry, who still tours the country playing Madea to sell-out crowds, doesn't expect is complete acceptance.

"I don't know if it's necessarily about critics or just people in general," he admits. "There's such a disconnect in this country. There's such a just, everybody has their own life and their own world and everybody's in their own com-

partment and nobody's crossing or peaking to see what's over on the other side or in the other areas. I think the main reason that people don't get it is because they don't understand what this character

represents, this Madea character represents, what these movies or shows or plays of mine represent."

He adds, "I'm so used to the mediocre reviews or the terrible reviews, when I see a good one — which I don't read or pay attention to — when I hear about it, I'm really surprised, because I expect people not to get it, I really do."

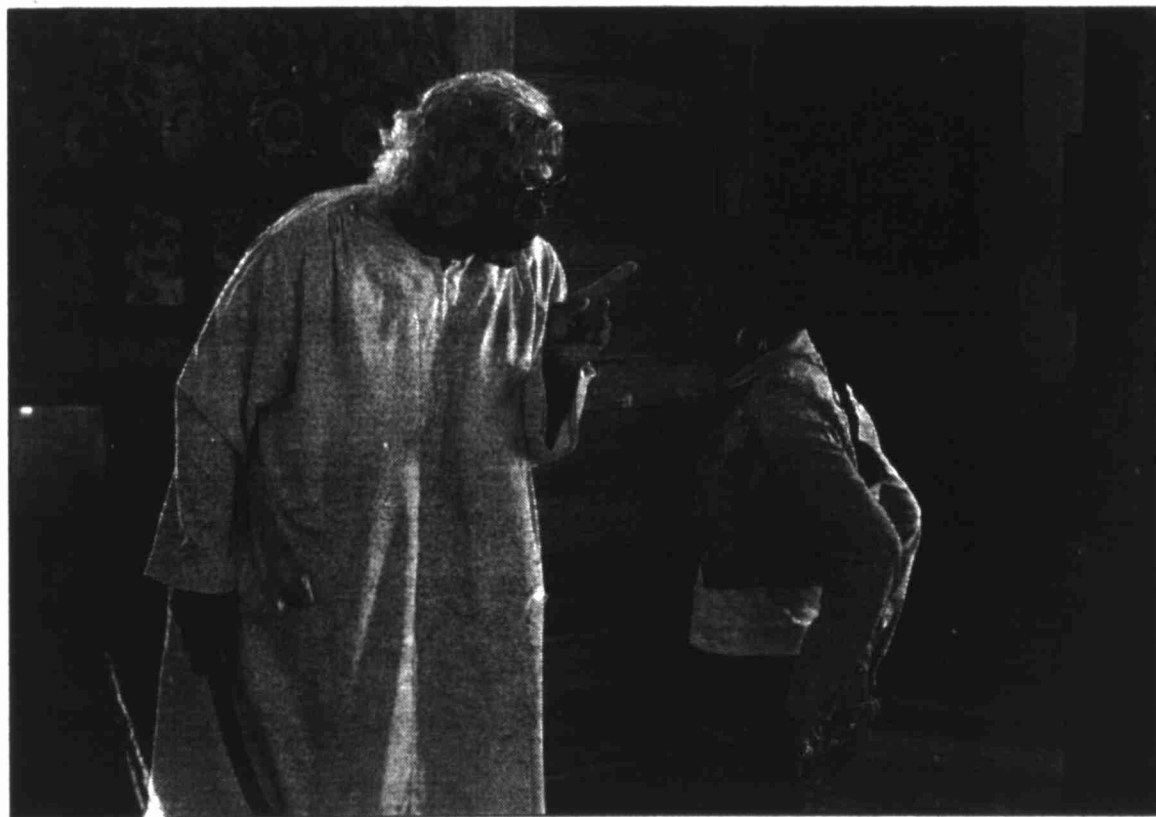
Even if reviewers don't get him, Perry sees his message getting through post-"Diary."

"I'm seeing more non-black people represented in

the audience," he says of his shows.

"I can see it from the stage. It's really amazing, since the movie's been out I can look out in the audience and see 30 percent of people who are not black and that's pretty amazing, especially in a lot of Southern cities."

He notes, "I've always said, even from Day One, I said, 'This is universal. Everyone can relate to love, hurt, pain, learning how to forgive, needing to get over, needing the power of God in their life.'

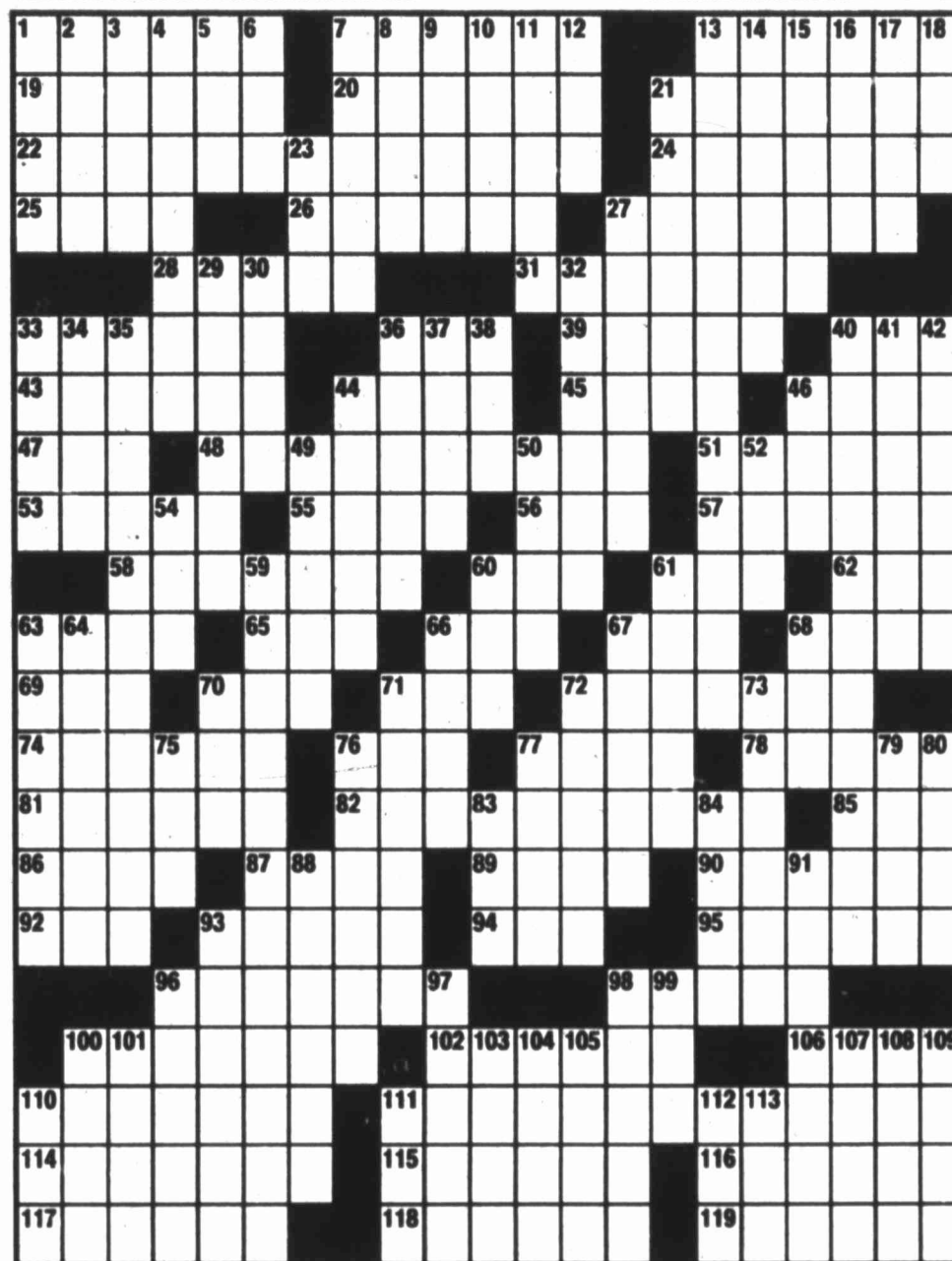

# Youth doesn't benefit a remake of 'The Fog'

I can just see the development meeting in my mind's eye... A bunch of stuffed-shirt studio executives are sitting around a table, drinking Perrier water and eating organically processed cheese (doesn't that just sound nasty). One says to the other, "Let's remake 'The Fog.'" But instead of making and retaining what made the original movie semi-marketable, they decided to do it the Hollywood way.

Of course, this meant they had to reject the idea of using seasoned actors and demanded the use of "young, hot actors" that will appeal to the ever-coveted PG-13 audience.

This meant they had to turn to television — Wednesday nights, to be exact — plucking Tom Welling from his role as Superboy from "Smallville" and Maggie Grace from her role as the rich pain-in-the-rear castaway from "Lost." They thought they had great replacements for Jamie Lee Curtis and Tom Adkins from the original film.

And to play Stevie Wayne, the independent disc jockey atop the lighthouse broadcast station, they chose Selma Blair.

This actually wasn't a bad casting choice, considering that Blair has the same off-center allure that Adrienne Barbeau had twenty five years ago. Unfortunately for Blair, they never really developed her character as they did with Barbeau.

OK, so I'm a John Carpenter nut. Ever since he gave birth to (and resurrected numerous times) Michael Meyers from the deep, dark recesses of every baby-sitter's fears, I've been hooked. He's even managed to make one of the best vampire flicks I've ever come across in "John Carpenter's Vampires."



"The Fog," in its earlier incarnation, was tolerable. It's certainly not Jamie Lee Curtis' best film, but it's watchable. The remake? Oh man, where do I start?!

Much like the first version, the remake is set in picturesque coastal Antonio Island, Ore. The small, quiet town is honoring its four founding fathers — Malone, Williams, Wayne and Castle — with a statue for their courageous discovery of the island in 1874.

Nick Castle (Welling), whose ancestor was a founding father, is the hunky charter boat skipper of the Seagrass. While out on a fishing-excursion with clients, Nick's first mate Spooner (DeRay Davis, providing stereotyped comic relief) extricates the wreckage of a clipper ship and unbeknownst to them unleashes the fog-bound spirits of the schooner that went down more than a hundred years ago.

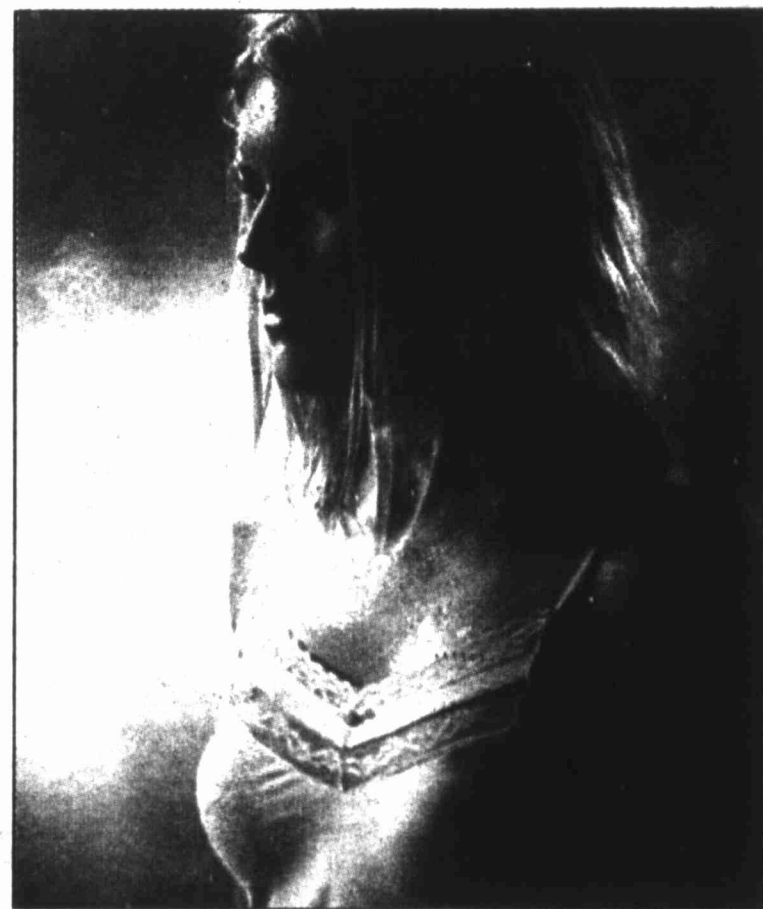
Back on shore, Nick's rebel girlfriend Elizabeth Williams (Grace), also related to a founding father, surprises by returning after doing her thing in the Big Apple. The next morning, they discover Spooner borrowed the Seagrass but

didn't return it. When they go out to sea, they find three party people dead aboard the love boat and Spooner barely alive because he hid in the freezer from the supernatural fog that attacked them.

The fog also threatens the testy alcoholic Father Malone (Adrian Hough), a descendant of a founding father, who becomes aware that bad stuff is about to go down when at the local cemetery he found scribbled on the wall something from the Bible that's written in the ancient language, "You have been weighed in the balances and found wanting," but doesn't have much of a personality to do anything about it except shout out that one must get off the island.

The remake follows a similar path as the original, but can't resist the temptation to finally show us the ghosts in all their CGI glory towards the end of the movie.

This is a mistake since the ghosts themselves seem like something out of "The Frighteners," or worse, "Ghostbusters"; and aren't that scary at all. In the first half of the film — which is heavy on scary atmospher-

ics — the ghosts remain a shadowy yet unseen presence. These scenes also don't quite work either, maybe because the supernatural element in this movie seems so arbitrary.

There are no ground rules: Sometimes the fog causes cars to stall and die, except for those scenes in which the screenplay requires our heroes to make a narrow escape. As mentioned, early on, Spooner escapes the fog by hiding in a fridge, claiming that the cold saved him. Think this would be a plot point later on? Nope. The plot point is raised once and never mentioned again.

Some kind of ground rules like one usually finds in horror movies (example: vampires can't stand daylight) would have made it easier for the audience, but there are none.

And while I don't do spoilers, I will tell you this: The ending of this film makes you feel like you took an ill-timed bathroom break and missed something important. Bad movie makers! Shame on you!

The acting is sub-par, but

the young cast is attractive and good-looking. Some 1980s-style nudity would have helped though (ever notice how there just isn't as much nudity in modern movies as opposed to those made in the early 80s?).

The cast of this film doesn't hold a candle to the original. Making the cast younger is a blatant grab at the teenage audience, which isn't bad per se, but Welling and Grace just don't carry the film.

And as I've said before, Selma Blair was completely misused throughout the film. Welling at least has a good big-screen appeal, but Maggie Grace better hope that her character survives on her Wednesday night television island because she's nothing special on the big screen.
