### Council to hear results of detailed energy audit during Monday meeting

City could see \$5 million savings

Meeting Monday, Big Spring City Council members are expected to hear the results of the detailed energy audit performed by corporate giant Siemens Building Technologies, part of a program that could spawn a savings of more than \$5 million for the city.

The council gave the go-ahead for the audit — phase-one in the See CITY, Page 3A

include design, of the facility, construction and financing.

The design presented by Tribble & Stephens comes less than a month after presented Furqueron commissioners with a similar one-story design utilizing the northeast corner of Scurry and Third Street.

Sheriff Dale Walker said the smaller, more compact design being considered in order to place the jail nextdoor to the district court

Walker offers up a number of problems he had hoped to see a new facility address.

"With the podular design, like we looked at with the larger facility, you can have one person directly supervising a large number of inmates. It's the most common, modern design there is," said Walker. "With this design, there is no way to monitor more than one cell at a time, which is going to make it necessary to have more jailers. There isn't a single room in the jail plan ... that can be monitored by any stationed guard, which means more people on the floor."

Consideration of a new jail facility began more than a year ago when Howard County commissioners identified jail overcrowding and noncompliance with state jail laws as an ongoing and long-term problem.

Commissioners tabled the jail issue in July 2005 — following several meetings with Furgueron and consultant Edward Spooner, justice director for the HOK Group — to concentrate on the county's budget and tax rate.

Discussions remained having reopened following a recent meeting between commissioners and TCJS officials that left the county 90 days to present the commission with a detailed plan for correcting the items currently out of compliance.

Also on Monday's agenda, County Auditor Jackie Olson will present the commissioners with invoices and purchase requests, as well as discussion concerning collections made by the justice of the peace offices.

County Treasurer Teresa Thomas is expected to present commission-

ers with personnel considerations, as well as a payroll report.

County Road and Bridge Administrator Jameson will present the court with pipeline crossings and a report on county road maintenance. Jameson is also expected to ask for permission to go out on bid for aggregate and asphalt, as well as buy-back on motor graders.

Attorney Drew Mouton is expected to present commissioners with a resolution extending time to hold property deeded in lieu of tax foreclosure, while County Extension Agent Tommy Yeater is expected to ask commissioners to approve personnel changes in his

Commissioners are also expected to hear a presentation from Anthony Mechanical Services.

The meeting is expected to get under way at 10 a.m. in the commissioners' courtroom, located on the second floor of the County Courthouse.

# **Optimism** flows over investor plan

here's a wave of excitement rippling throughout our community with the news that a group of investors has committed to spending \$8 million or more to renovate a segment of downtown Big Spring. Coming on the tailgate of the largest cotton harvest this area has ever seen, it seems we have indeed been blessed.

From our understanding, "Heritage Square" will include a two-block section between Runnels and Scurry. The developer who is bringing the plan together, Big Spring native Ralph Mahoney, says renovation will begin quickly after the closing on the properties takes place — presumably in late May.

Moore III in helping to nurture this project into something feasible and to Main Street Inc. for opening the doors and diligently working on Big Spring's behalf.



SAN FRANCISCO (AP) -Emptying one's bladder in a public place is a crime, even if there is no specific law prohibiting the prac-

tice, a state appeals court ruled. Ruling on an appeal brought by a Berkeley man who was charged with cocaine possession after an officer stopped him mid-pitstop, the Court of the Appeal for the Second District said Wednesday that public urination is a crime that justified the officer's search of the man's pockets.

"Urination on or near a busy commercial street interferes with the comfortable enjoyment of both life and property," Presiding Justice J. Anthony Kline wrote in an opinion that concluded public peeing qualified as "a public nuisance.

The case involved David McDonald, who was detained after an Oakland police officer allegedly spotted him urinating in a Berkeley parking lot three years ago. The officer arrested McDonald and while searching him allegedly found cocaine in the suspect's pock-

McDonald tried to have the cocaine evidence suppressed by arguing that because there was no law that specifically prohibited heeding nature's call, the officer did not have a reason to search

The motion was denied after prosecutors argued that public urination would violate both littering and public nuisance laws. McDonald was convicted and sentenced to drug treatment and probation.

Consider the above-mentioned bad actor: He's walking around Berkeley, which we can safely assume is an urban area, he's carrying cocaine — an illegal drug, even in California — and he decides to, uh, conduct his private business in public.

Now, maybe cocaine makes deductive reasoning difficult, but what in the world possessed this dud to do what he did?

And how much more cocaine did he ingest before he got the bright idea to appeal his conviction?

# Bill creates issues for Hillary

rsn't it great that Bill and Hillary Clinton have such a great marriage — that they can agree to disagree on important issues, even national security issues? OK, that's enough faux political correctness for now.

So let me tell you what I really think: It stinks that the ex-president husband and his wife, the junior senator from New York, have had such divergent positions in an important homeland-defense debate. Indeed, Hillary's foreignaffairs fecklessness, most recently on the Dubai Ports World deal, calls into question her fitness to be president, as long as Bill, too, is in the picture. If she can't lead him, how can she lead the rest of

On Feb. 17, Hillary denounced the Dubai deal, declaring, "Our port security is too important to place in the hands of foreign governments." But on March 2, the Financial Times reported that Bill was called in to advise the United Arab Emirates about securing the deal for its company.

Indeed, Hillary's own financial disclosure forms showed that Bill received \$450,000 for giving speeches in Dubai in 2002, and that UAE officials had donated up to \$1 million to the Clinton presidential library in Little Rock. Did Hillary really not know about that? Didn't she get curious about any possible conflict of interest that those Arab monies might have posed?

Hillary stoutly insisted that she knew nothing — nothing. And she hastened to add that the two of them had reached the same position; they were both for an additional probe of the deal.

But just a few more questions, please, for this fast-track dualcareer couple.

After all, Dubai has been a source of difference between them in the past. In November 2005, Bill happened to be in, of all places, Dubai when he told an Arab student audience that the U.S. invasion of Iraq had been a "big mistake." Hillary, of course, voted for the Iraq war resolution and has never expressed any regret over that vote. So one wonders: Do the Clintons just agree to disagree on such a wrenchingly divisive issue? Or could they figure that it's shrewder to work both sides of the

street — that is, her the hawk side, him the dove side?

Other golden duos are confronting similar instances of career-cross-purposeness. British Prime Minister Tony Blair, for example, has been trying to crack down on Muslim extremism in his country. Yet his wife, Cherie, is a human-rights lawyer who took up the case of a Muslim student wishing to wear a head-to-toe jilbab, when school regulations permitted only a head scarf. Last year, Cherie won the case for her client. That's great for her legal career, but does such a victory help his effort to build a more orderly United Kingdom?

Back here in the United States. Sen. Elizabeth Dole, R-N.C., finds that her position on the port deal has been undercut, too, by her husband, Bob, the senator-turnedlobbyist, who is on the UAE payroll.

Of course, neither Elizabeth nor Bob is running for president. But most likely, Hillary will be running as soon as she gets her Senate re-election out of the way. In which case, it's not unreasonable to ask: Will Hillary be able to control her husband and his urge to dabble in messy entanglements? The stakes are higher this time. This isn't about the liberated condition of their marriage; it's about the security of the American homeland.

## Shirts celebrate Girl Scouting

If you plan on celebrating Girl Scout week starting March 12, you probably know that Juliette Gordon Low founded the movement in 1912. But perhaps you don't know that Low sold a valuable pearl necklace to finance it. Low longed to see girls develop their potential and realized they couldn't do that if they didn't leave their homes.

By 1915, a few scattered troops merged into a national organization with bylaws and annual conventions. An executive board was established, a national director was hired and training was offered for leaders.

During World War I, Girl Scouts worked in hospitals, grew food and defense sold bonds. During the Great Depression, Girl Scouts numbered more than 200,000 nationally and made contributions in worthy relief efforts. While the country was engaged in World War II, Girl Scouts helped the war effort by growing Victory Gardens and collecting scrap metal.

Today's Girl Scouts don't need to sell family heirlooms to finance their

troops. In 1936, the organization began looking for a commercial baker to produce the cookies girls still sell today. The longtime favorites have been the shortbread Trefoil and the Thin Mint.

Today, there are 3.6 million Girl Scouts — 2.7 million girl members and 928,000 adult members working primarily as volunteers. They live in 90 countries and are united in their mission to produce girls of courage, confidence and character who make the world a better place.

People come from across the nation and from other counties to take in the event. Hotel rooms are booked about a year ahead of the roundup, which is always the second weekend in March.

"It's what we're known for," said Lynn Adams, executive director of the Sweetwater Chamber of Commerce. "Nobody badmouths the roundup."

The roundup is organized by the Sweetwater Jaycees, and the money funds events the group





# Pocketing dollars from some change

SANTA ANA, Calif. -Three years ago, Steve Contursi of Laguna Beach, Calif., bought a 1794 silver dollar, believed to be the first minted in the United States.

In case it's stolen or lost, he insured the coin for \$10 million. Last year, Contursi paid \$3 million for the Brasher Doubloon, the first gold coin minted in the United States, and, in a separate purchase, \$8.5 million for a 10-coin President that Jackson gave to the king

His newest deal is selling a stash of rare cash: 3.600 U.S. \$1 bills and Italian 1,000-lire notes salvaged from the safe in the Andrea Doria, a cruise ship that sank in the Atlantic 50 years ago.

"My success in life was created by having a passion," said Contursi, 53, owner of Rare Coin Wholesalers in Dana Point, Calif., which traded \$50 million in coins and currency last year. "As a kid, I had a passion for collecting coins. I learned early that I could also use my passion to create wealth.

Contursi's passion and blockbuster deals have made him one of the bestknown figures America's \$15 billion industry in collectible coins and currency. What's lesser-known is that Contursi is part of a network of traders, graders and collectors who have helped turn Orange County, Calif., and Los Angeles into America's coin-industry capital.

Integral to the marketplace is Professional Coin Grading Services in Newport Beach, Calif., one of the biggest coin appraisers and authenticators. Last year, the company put its seal of approval on 1.6 million rare coins worth about \$1 billion.

Jeff Howard, 27, authenticates up to 1,200 rare coins a day. He handles each piece by its edges, peering under a lamplight above a black velvet mat. examining the surfaces like a crime-scene investigator for wear, nicks and chemical damage. "This hasn't been cleaned or tampered with, but it appears to have bumped with other coins," he said of a gold dollar coin.

Founded in Professional Coin was the nation's first systematic grader, using a scale of 1

# Yates nixes plea offer

**Associated Press Writer** HOUSTON — A deadline for Andrea Yates to accept a plea offer and avoid being retried in the drowning deaths of her children passed Friday without an agreement.

"It appears that this case is going to be headed for a jury trial, but my offer will always remain open," Yates' attorney George Parnham said.

Last month, prosecutors asked Yates to plead guilty or no contest to a murder charge in exchange for a 35year sentence and set a March 10 deadline to accept it.

Parnham wanted prosecutors to allow Yates, who drowned her five children in her family's bathtub in 2001, to plead no contest to one capital murder charge, give her credit for her time served in prison and place her in a mental hospital.

If she were ever released, his deal would allow prosecutors to try her on another capital murder charge.

Prosecutors Owmby and Kaylynn Williford said they could not negotiate where Yates, 41, would be housed because she would be in Texas Department of Criminal Justice's custody.

"There certainly has to be some acknowledgment that this was wrong, that other people in society should not do things like this,' Owmby said of conditions for a plea deal.

Parnham says Yates doesn't relish another

"She doesn't want to go back through having the memory of her children paraded around a courtroom and how they died," he said.

"That is something no mother would want. But was she the same person on June the 20th (2001) she is today? Absolutely not."

Yates' capital murder retrial is set to begin March 20. She has again pleaded innocent by reason of insanity. Prosecutors contend Yates, who is presumed sane, knew it was wrong to drown her children.

A jury in 2002 rejected her insanity defense and convicted her of two capital murder charges for the drownings of three of the five children, who ranged in age from 6 months to 7 years.

An appeals court last year overturned Yates convictions because of testimony from an expert witness about a nonexistent episode on television's "Law & Order" series.

"I just love Sam Houston," said state Carole Comptroller Keeton Strayhorn, also an independent candidate who routinely quotes Houston from when he defeated the Mexican army and cemented Texas' independence.

# News industry groups to press for shield law

Associated Press Writer AUSTIN — Texas media organizations are planning to again work for passage of a law protecting news reporters from having to disclose secret sources and other information in court.

That legislation, known as a shield law, failed in the state's 2005 legislative session amid opposition from district attorneys. But news industry groups will push a similar measure in the 2007 session.

"We plan to pursue it as hard as we can," said Ken Whalen, executive vice president of the Texas Daily Newspaper Association.





nesses in the past three decades, the news sounds almost too good to be true. But local officials say

the risk to the community is minimal. Mayor Russ McEwen was quick to note that the project is funded entirely by private investment, meaning that no local money is at risk.

In other words: The worst-case scenario for Big Spring in this project is that it will be in no worse shape than it is now.

And the best-case seenario? Well, that's almost more than people can comfortably contemplate.

District Judge Robert H. Moore III, whose friendship with Lubbock-based developer Ralph Mahoney was the catalyst to getting the project started, said this could be the most positive economic news for Big Spring since the closing of Webb Air Force Base in the late 1970s kick-started the community's steady decline.



### Friendly fire deaths rare in current wars

WASHINGTON (AP) — The rate of friendly fire deaths for soldiers in Iraq and Afghanistan is substantially lower than in other major military conflicts, a decline that Army officials attribute to better training and high-tech equipment.

Over the past four years, 17 soldiers have died in friendly fire incidents such as the one that killed former professional football player Pat Tillman, according to Army data.

The 17 soldiers felled by friendly fire incidents are about 1 percent of the 1,575 soldiers who have died overall. More than 2,500 troops from all services have died in the two conflicts.

The 1 percent rate is well below that of Operation Desert Storm when 17 percent of all service members who died were killed by friendly fire. Rates for World War II, Vietnam and the invasions of Grenada and Panama were also higher than the Iraq and Afghanistan conflicts.

So far, the 2004 death of Tillman, an Army Ranger and corporal, during a firefight near the Pakistan-Afghanistan border has been the only one in the war to trigger a formal criminal investigation. Army officials said its Criminal Investigation Command has reviewed other incidents, and there have been some reprimands or administrative punishments handed

### Slain American hostage was bound, shot

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — The body of American Tom Fox, who was among four Christian peace activists kidnapped last year, was found near a west Baghdad railway line with gunshot wounds to his head and chest, the Iraqi Interior Ministry said

A U.S. military official in Baghdad confirmed that American forces picked up Fox's remains on Thursday evening but had no condition on the body.

A police patrol was also on the scene, said Falah al-Mohammedawi, an official with the Interior Ministry, which oversees police. He said Fox was found with his hands tied and gunshots to his head and chest. There were also cuts on his body and bruises on his head, al-Mohammedawi said.

There was no immediate word on the whereabouts of Fox's fellow hostages: Canadians James Loney, 41; Harmeet Singh Sooden, 32; and Briton Norman Kember, 74. They were last seen in a video dated Feb. 28 that was broadcast Tuesday on Arab television. Fox did not appear in the brief footage.

The previously unknown Swords of Righteousness Brigades claimed responsibility for kidnapping the four workers, who disappeared Nov. 26.

### Suspected insurgents detained in Iraq

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) - U.S. and Iraqi forces detained 20 suspected insurgents early Saturday, four at a west Baghdad mosque identified by the U.S. military as a possible haven for al-Qaida in Iraq.

The soldiers surrounded the Sunni al-Khayr mosque complex in the violence-plagued Khadhra neighborhood late Friday, said police 1st Lt. Thayer Mahmoud.

A witness said the troops burst in just after evening prayers. He and other worshippers were searched, questioned and photographed, and four of them were detained, he said on condition of anonymity for fear of reprisal.

Iraqi forces led the joint operation and discovered several rooftop fighting positions, assault rifles and firebombs, the U.S. military said in a statement.

Four other suspects were detained at other sites raided during the operation, the military said.

### Bush: Ports deal collapse could hurt U.S.

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Bush said the collapse of the Dubai ports deal could hurt U.S. efforts to recruit Mideast governments as partners in the worldwide war on terror.

Separately, in what may have been an aftershock to the failed transaction, a new round of trade talks between the U.S. and the United Arab Emirates was postponed.

On Thursday, Dubai-based DP World backed away in the face of unrelenting criticism and promised it would "transfer fully" its U.S. operations to an American entity. But the company's announcement was unusually vague, and the Financial Times reported late Friday that DP World is considering retaining a 49 percent share in U.S. port operations. The London newspaper attributed the information to a person involve/d in the deal.

### DOJ faults FBI for fingerprinting error

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — An FBI mistake linking an Oregon lawyer, a Muslim convert, to the 2004 Madrid train bombings was a "watershed event" that led to improved fingerprint identification but more needs to be done, according to a federal report.

The 330-page Department of Justice report released Friday, the day before the second anniversary of the bombings, expanded on its January report that faulted the FBI for sloppy work but concluded the government did not misuse the anti-terror Patriot Act against Portland attorney Brandon Mayfield.

# Dean criticizes GOP on security

WASHINGTON — The chairman of the Democratic National Committee sought to capitalize Saturday on the recent divide between President Bush and congressional Republicans over ports security, arguing that the GOP has a "pre-9/11 mind-set" on ensuring safety at U.S. entries.

In his party's weekly radio address, Howard Dean trumpeted the Democrats' success in helping to derail a plan for a Dubai-owned company to manage some operations at six U.S. ports.

### Milosevic, the 'Butcher of the Balkans,' dies in his prison cell

AMSTERDAM. Netherlands — Slobodan Milosevic, the former Yugoslav leader, who was branded "the butcher of the Balkans" and was on trial for war crimes after orchestrating a decade of bloodshed during the breakup of his country, was found dead Saturday in his prison cell. He was

Milosevic, who suffered chronic heart ailments and high blood pressure, apparently died of natural causes and was found in his bed, the U.N. tribunal said, without giving an exact time of death.

He had been examined by doctors following his frequent complaints of fatigue or ill health that delayed his trial, but the tribunal could not immediately say when he lastunderwent a medical checkup. All detainees at center the Scheveningen are checked by a guard every

half hour. The tribunal said Milosevic's family had been informed of his death, which came nearly five years after he was arrested, then extradited to The Hague.







# Knight goes down with fight, moves on after bad year

DALLAS — With seven seconds left in one Bob Knight's worst seasons. his best player made the kind of mistake "The General" doesn't tolerate. Ever.

Though the game and season were all but over, you wouldn't have known it by Knight's reaction. He scowled, clenched his fists and groaned with the ferocity of someone coaching for the national championship, not a spot in the semifinals of the Big 12 tournament.

Soon enough, anguish was done. Texas Tech lost to No. 8 Texas 77-70 Friday, ending a season filled with disappointments and a lengthy list of dubious accomplishments carved into the Hall of Fame coach's resume.

- At 15-17, Knight had only the second losing record of his 40-year coaching career and the first since 1970-71 when his last Army club went 11-13.

— The wins are his fewest since that same season.

 The losses are his most, three more than his previous worst. Until winning an openinground game Thursday, the Red Raiders had lost four in a row, their worst skid in five seasons under

only the third time Knight has failed to reach a postseason tournament, and his earliest summer vacation since 1977.

At least then he was rebuilding from losing several players from a club that had gone undefeated and won the national title the previous year. This time, Knight was left with seven freshmen and one junior college transfer after reaching the regional semifi-

Knight also said several times that he's never had a team hurt more by the departure of one player than this club was by losing Ronald Ross, a walkon who blossomed into a team captain as a senior.

Knight's players deflected the blame from their coach.

"He did his job. He prepared us," said junior Jarrius Jackson, who led the Big 12 in scoring this season. "He did a lot more teaching this year because we were a young team. We have to listen more and do our job."

Because of the inexperienced roster, Knight knew this was going to be a tough season. Still, he expected better than this.

"The whole season was frustrating," freshman Alan Voskuil said. "We had the talent, we just didn't do what Coach taught us. This was our fault. Every loss was frustrating for him. He's the This is likely to be most competitive person

### A mother's plea

Big Spring Herald To Whom It May Concern:

My son, Jeffrey Matthies, has cystic fibrosis disease and is in critical need of a double lung transplant. Jeff's lung function is deteriorating rapidly and he

needs this transplant this year.

Jeff moved to Big Spring in 1981. He went to Marcy School, Goliad Middle School and one year at Big Spring High School until moving to Coahoma. My husband, Alan Matthies was born and raised in the Big Spring/Coahoma area, graduating from Coahoma High School. Our other son, Jimmy, continues to reside in Big Spring, working as a Texas State Trooper.

Jeff owned and operated a barbecue restaurant in Colorado City for approximately three years and had to sell out due to his health. Alan is a former pastor from First Baptist Church in Tarzan and is now a chaplain in Dallas. I worked at Malone & Hogan Clinic while living in Big Spring.

We desperately need your help in letting people out there know about Jeff and the need for this lung transplant.

He is on disability and has no health coverage. The cost of this transplant is \$508,000 dollars, and he must have \$100,000 just to get an appointment to be seen initially. Please help us. This is an emergency. His lung function has deteriorated down to 17 percent.

# Cystic fibrosis victim needs double lung transplant

Editor's note: I received a telephone call this week from a woman in Loraine, Debbie Chambliss. She told me of her cousin, 33-year-old Jeff Matthies, former Big Spring resident, who is suffering from cystic fibrosis and in need of a double-lung transplant. The need for the transplant is imminent. To save his life, the family has put together several methods to solicit donations, including a Web site and a news story in the Dallas Morning News. The material the family sent to me seemed complete in its entirety, poignant and heart felt and needs little editing from me.

effrey Matthies is one family member that you can always expect to see with a smile on his face no matter what the situation.

He has that ability to light up a room when he enters it and that keen ability to not let things get him down.

Including his illness A lot of you remember Jeff from the Matthies Family Reunion where, for

several years, his barbecue business catered our Sunday meal. (Sure was good, too) None of us would of guessed that that

wide grin had spent a lifetime visiting doctors and receiving treatment for Cystic Fibrosis.

Now at the young age of 33 the disease

is really taking its toil and our family member could use our help. Jeff is one of those people that has

gotten 'lost in the cracks,' so to speak. Since Jeff has always tried to work for a living and live life as normal as possible, he was able to stay off of state

and federal programs. While living in Colorado City, he purchased and operated Nix Barbeque. (Later renaming it Po' Boys)

With the help of his family and employees, he was able to take the time needed for his numerous out of town medical treatments and hospital visits.

For 10 and a half years, Jeff had the luxury of affordable health insurance through his employment.

However the marriage dissolved a year ago and Jeff lost his much needed health insurance.

(In a recent Dallas newspaper article, Jeff cites the strain of his illness as the reason the marriage

He had always "paid his own way" in life, but now getting or affording health

insurance was impossible. So now comes the downfall

Jeff's medical condition has deteriorated greatly in this past year and continues to do so at a rapid rate. He now is on complete disability, with

only 17 percent lung capacity. His future is only visible through the window of receiving a double lung

transplant, his only hope at life. Jeff would never ask for charity or help, even and especially from family.

He's always been a giver, not a taker. He is a proud young man that has

always paid his own way. His parents, Pam and Alan Matthies, are searching for ways to help their son. I know as a mother myself that no matter how old our child is, they are

mother on the warpath to save her child. You can imagine how hard this is on a family As Pam stated the following in a e-

mail to me; "The thing that really gripes me is that if he would have been a 'bum' and not worked up until disability, he would have Medicare and Medicaid right now and all would be well and he would already be recuperating.

"However, because he worked so that he would have a reason to get up in the mornings, he is punished for it now.

That is why his doctor has said that is 'lost in our medical/political system and tied up in the red tape.' It is so sad."

Very well said, Pam!

Under Medicaid rules Jeff's earnings were \$40 too much to receive their help. Medicare cannot offer their help until August of this year due to a 'preexisting condition' clause. Even then, Medicare can turn Jeff down due the severity of his CF.

Jeff cannot wait that long.

The illness is moving too fast. The family needs to raise \$100,000 just to get Jeff on the 'top' of the list for the

surgery.

(Note: according to Jeff's Physician he would be placed right at the top to get his surgery set up. I looked up information on the Internet about his doctor and found one thing for sure. Jeff has been blessed with one of the best Cystic Fibrosis doctors in the U.S.)

Other greater expenses will follow with an estimate of \$400,000 more or less to cover the surgical procedure and the anti-rejection medications needed for the first year following surgery.

But let's take one step at a time...Lets get him on that list and get the surgery



### U.S. image may take hit from failed ports deal, economists say

U.S. holdings may have defused a potentially explosive clash between President Bush and members of his own party. But it is also likely to

keep the heat on a simmering belief abroad that U.S. markets can sometimes be more trouble than they're worth, economists and experts on foreign trade said.

"People are making decisions to invest elsewhere than in the U.S.," said Rachel Bronson, a Mideast expert at the Council on Foreign Relations. "Gulf money is being invested in Europe and Asia. This furthers that trend.'

In the wake of last uproar over Chinese interest in Unocal and Maytag, companies from controversial countries may be inclined to search for less complicated investments when deciding where to park their assets. And in a global economy, there are plenty of options to choose from.

To some that may be a reasonable tradeoff if scrutiny of such deals enhances national security. But economists said if too much money drifts away from U.S. investments, economic security could be at stake.

### Texas unemployment rate falls to 5.0 percent

AUSTIN (AP) — Texas' unemployment rate fell to 5.0 percent in January as the state added 13,200 jobs, the 16th consecutive month of job growth, the Texas Workforce Commission said.

The state, which had an unemployment rate of 5.2 percent in December, added 269,600 jobs over the year. an annual growth rate of 2.8 percent.

"The addition of jobs by Texas employers, as well as the declining unemployment rate, is great news for the labor market," said Diane Rath, chairwoman of the commission.

An estimated 569,900 Texans remained actively looking for work in January, down 20,000 from December and a drop of 42,000 from the year-ago period. The national unemployment rate is 4.7 percent.

The figures were adjusted for seasonal trends in hir-

ing and firing, which most economists believe gives a worker status to immigrants. better picture of the job market.

Professional and business services saw the biggest gain in January with an increase of 4,200 jobs. Trade, transportation and utilities added 4,000 jobs.

Education and health services added 2,800 jobs, and financial activities saw an increase of 1,900, more than double its December gain of 800.

### Agency says it'll be ready for guest worker program

DALLAS (AP) — The new director of the nation's immigration service said the agency should get through a backlog of immigrant petitions in time to handle a guest worker program if it is approved.

"We hope to have, quite frankly, the backlog taken care of before we inherit another program," said U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Director Emilio Gonzalez said during a teleconference.

The Senate Judiciary Committee has been debating a guest worker program that would give temporary

But that would greatly increase the workload of the agency already facing a backlog that has left some immigrants waiting up to 2 1/2 years for citizenship or

'green cards' providing permanent residence status. The Bush administration has set an Oct. 1 deadline for the backlog to be eliminated by the agency, which processes applications for citizenship, permanent residence, work permits and other immigration docu-

To prepare for the possibility of a guest worker program, officials have been looking at facilities, staffing, and outsourcing, something the agency currently does with immigrant fingerprinting and photographing.

"We are as prepared as we can be now, considering there is no bill," Gonzalez said.

A wide range of companies offer advice, including: Homestead, which specializes in Web design; domain name seller GoDaddy.com; search directory Yahoo; and Internet service provider Earthlink.

While professional Web designers stress their greater design skill and Web marketing abilities, it is clear that anyone who can use Microsoft Word can create a Web site without knowing HTML code or CGI scripts. However, smallbusiness owners should weigh their needs, tolerance for tinkering, eye for design and budget when deciding whether to do it themselves.

If you opt for DIY route, Safkow recommends that you test it first.

"There were a lot of free trials out there; I tried a half-dozen before I settled on Homestead," Safkow said of his first Web site, www.promoideation.com, for his core business. "I use a lot of online tools.

If I don't get it in five minutes, I move on. With other Web-site builders, I might hit a problem in 10 minutes or in a couple of days. I haven't had a problem with Homestead." DIY Web site design services tend to have several features in common, such as free tures to her site ( trials, toll-free phone help www.weddingtennies.co and pricing as low as \$3.99 a month.

Watch out for those who

retain ownership of your domain name or have unreliable servers.

Homestead Inc. Menlo Park started in 1998 as free Web sites, making its money from companies offering addons like stock tickers and news, says co-founder Justin Kitch. Some 12million Web sites have been built with Homestead tools.

After the dot-com crash. it started charging (\$9.99 a month and up). The teen-agers and nonprofits left and the core business was small business.

One of the early users of the free service was Yorba Linda resident Cindy Lieber, who wanted to test the market for her decorative wedding tennis shoes.

"I was very conservative; I didn't know if this business would work, so I didn't want to put money into it," she says.

billion deal with Londonbased Peninsular Oriental Navigation Co. to purchase assets that included control of commercial operations at five U.S. ports.

In response to a congressional measure to block the deal — and despite a veto threat from the Bush administration the government-owned company agreed Thursday to divest of the U.S. assets to a "United States entity."

Economists pointed out that this is a small deal when compared to the current flood of foreign investment in U.S. assets. But it is symbolic of what Marshall Bouton, president of the Chicago Council on Foreign Relations, calls "a sense of withdrawing" by the U.S. electorate.

Bouton disputes that this withdrawal is xenophobic or bigoted. Rather, he said, it reflects a sense of "disillusionment with the efforts to deal with the terrorist threats."

Surveys by his organization and others show that soon after the September terrorist attacks Americans were in the mood to go out into the world and fix problems proactively. But gradually, as the war in Iraq drags on, surveys have shown people turning inward and trying to protect themselves. They are also confused by the message coming from the Bush administration that we need both open markets and closed borders.

"It's hard to have it both ways," Bouton said

The brouhaha over Dubai Ports World might also be disruptive to U.S. efforts to bolster free trade abroad, experts said.

"They will not stop doing business with us, but on the margins, they will be less likely to do things that are not in their interests," said David Mack, a former U.S. ambassador to the United Arab Emirates.

Arab oil producers, for example, might not pump up oil production as a way to stabilize prices and ease the already heavy economic burden on the U.S. economy. The UAE might also slow down free trade talks with the United States.

"They don't need (an agreement)," Mack said. "Everybody in the world is beating a path to their door."

Ned Walker, another former U.S. ambassador to the UAE, also said the situation may add to the increasing slowdown in dealings business Arab between and American companies.

"As countries start to have questions about whether we can be counted in a business deal, they will go elsewhere," he

Not everybody was so glum about the prospects for Mideast trade. Catherine Novelli, a former Bush administration trade official for Europe and the Middle East, predicted the conflict might offer "an excuse" to countries bent on keeping

their markets closed. But she insisted it would be easy to argue against such a stance since the U.S. market remains a beacon of free trade. Likewise, she doubted Arab nations

would back off from doing business given free trade agreements with Morocco, Jordan, and Bahrain. An agreement with Oman is pending.

"These trade agreements have been popular because there is a desire to trade with the U.S.," she said.

Nevertheless,

National U.S.-Arab Chamber of Commerce, said Arabs firms are likely to think twice about doing business in the United States.

"There is a double standard being applied here,' he said.

"Danish, Chinese and David Japanese and others who

not subject to the same scrutiny. Samer Khanachet, head

United Gulf Management Inc., the Boston-based arm of a large Kuwaiti investment holding company, said Arab businesses are likely to see the incident as "just another milestone"

and the Arab and Muslim worlds.

Describing the incident as a "slap in the face," he said Arab businesses might be more inclined to keep their money in the Middle East where real estate and the stock man kets are booming.

 New Mexico Dear New Mexico: Your husband may not have changed his accounts or insurance information since he remarried, in which case, it's quite likely that his children are the beneficiaries of everything. This is not uncom-

First, check your home to see if your husband has stored financial papers there. Do you know what bank handles your accounts and investments? Pay a visit and explain the problem. They will at least let you know if your name is on any of those accounts. If it isn't, you will know that your husband has not protected you, intentionally or otherwise. At that point, you should insist that he take care of this promptly. Make an appointment for the two of you to see his banker, or else it's time to see a lawyer.

Dear Annie: This is in response to "Apart in New Mexico," whose husband traveled frequently. My husband worked for a professional sports team for 15 years and often traveled with them. Here are our suggestions:

1. Find a friend in a similar boat (doctor's wife, single parent) who has kids the same ages as yours. Spend some of those late-afternoon hours with them.

Dear Annie: My 15-yearold daughter recently confided that she is a victim of acquaintance rape. The rape happened over a year ago, so there is no evidence.

My first reaction was to call the rape crisis center listed in the phone book, but they explained that because the victim is a minor, they, along with all doctors, counselors, school personnel, etc., are mandated to report the incident.

My daughter does not wish to go through the legalities of this situation. The pain she has borne alone for the past year has been overwhelming. She does not want to relive it. She has put a lot of stress on herself for not immediately reporting the rape, and the idea that she might be to blame for others experiencing the same thing is creating a lot of guilt. Yet she could go through all the pain of taking legal action, and it still may have no effect on

perpetrator. the Counseling might help her change her mind, but to be forced to go through this when she isn't ready would make her feel victimized all over again.

"We have purchased selfhelp books that we are going through together to begin the healing process. However, I am not a professional and don't feel qualified. How can I get my daughter help if all counselors are mandated to report? - We Need Help

Help:

According to the Rape, Abuse and Incest **National** Network (rainn.org), your state apparently requires mandatory reporting (not all states do). If your daughter were to receive counseling, however, the therapist would be able to support her through this process, although the likelihood that the case would go to court is very slim. You can call the confidential National Sexual Assault Hotline at 1-800-656-HOPE (1-800-656-4673), and they can connect you to available local services. Meanwhile, Mom, it helps more than you know that she can discuss this openly with you.

Dear Annie: My wife, "Claudia," and I have been married for two years, and I love her completely.

Claudia does not work. She stays home with our two young children. All I ask is to come home to a clean house and a homecooked meal. Instead, the house is a mess, and Claudia is waiting for me





### Black Market Radio: 'The sounds of old'

There's been a void in rock 'n' roll since the mid-1990s, punctuated by a lack of meaningful lyrics and an industry that increasingly demands albums with mass appeal.

So say the members of the rock band Black Market Radio, but it's hardly an original complaint. Still, their goal is to reintroduce listeners to the sounds of old.

Peter Cornell and Keith Mannino created Black Market Radio in 2000. Singer/songwriter Cornell came of age in Seattle during the grunge movement and, like his brother, Chris Cornell (formerly of Soundgarden, now with Audioslave), carries a love of thoughtful, often pain-stricken lyrics.

Mannino grew up listening to Neil Young and Pink Floyd, often in the kitchen of his Warren, N.J., home. His admiration for Motley Crue bassist Nikki Sixx helped lead him to the same instrument.

The two met when Mannino

booked acts at a New Jersey club. Peter Cornell was in the middle of a cross-country acoustic solo tour. The sultry singer instantly floored Mannino.

"I was blown away. I had a recording studio in the city and told him if he ever needed to do a project ..." says Mannino.

Not much later, Cornell took him up on that offer.

It's been a several-year process getting the debut album, "Suicide Parlour," together. Originally scheduled for a Jan. 15 release, the two expect it to be released within a few weeks.

The pair spent from 2002 to 2004 nailing down tracks before auditioning other band members. A guitar player didn't pan out, and there was some re-tooling of various songs, but by New Year's Eve the band was in place with John Hummel on drums and Topher Mohr on guitar. All are in their

hope to fill a gap in the rock scene.
"There's not a lot of quality anymore. I don't think people take

pride in the music they're putting

out," says Mannino.

"It's like we're involved in a renaissance of that sound," adds Cornell. "It needs a resurgence. There's a lot of fans online that have felt neglected over the last three or four years." Indeed, online is how the young New York City-based band has gotten early attention. ### Getting schooled in rock takes it on the road

David Hooper and Emmett Butler already knew how to play musical instruments. Then they learned how to rock!

It's all about the attitude, the look and the energy.

"Being a rock musician is being able to play very well, but also making a show of it," said David, a 12-year-old keyboard and saxophone player.

"Rock is more about feelings," added Emmett, a 13-year-old keyboardist. "I'm trying to be energetic on stage, moving more, jumping higher."

The two Pennsylvania kids are students at the Paul Green School of Rock. As members of the school's East Coast all-star band, they are accompanying famous rock guitarist Adrian Belew on a four-city tour.

The band played Thursday in Baltimore, then Friday outside Washington and this weekend in Philadelphia and New York City.

The School of Rock (on which the 2003 Jack Black movie is loosely based) is an after-school program with a dozen branches in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York, Utah, California and Texas. (Green hopes to expand soon to Washington.)

For about \$200 per month, students get weekly lessons and spend as much as six hours per week in group rehearsals. The school also teaches kids about the business side of music and the history and significance of rock legends including Pink Floyd, Led Zeppelin and Van Halen.

School of Rock students have to audition to be in an all-star band and go on tour



like David and Emmett. About 40 of the 650 students on the East Coast are chosen for one of two allstar bands. On this tour, the 9- to 17-year-old kids are playing songs by Frank Zappa, Radiohead, the Beatles and King Crimson.

Green believes in challenging the students, musically and emotionally. "I think kids are capable of incredible things. But fear

and laziness get in the way," he said. "If I get them over their laziness, the only thing anyone is afraid of is me. We start every kid with the same goal: Find your voice on your instrument."

David taught himself to play sax. He has been taking classical piano lessons for five years in addition to a year of rock keyboard. (He also takes fencing lessons!)

David belongs to a musical family: His grandmother was a piano teacher; his father occasionally plays keyboard in a blues band; and his 15-year-old sister, Rosalie, also studies at the School of Rock, singing and playing bass, keyboard and sax.

Still, David figures he is more likely to be a pediatrician than a professional musician.

Emmett studied classical

piano for seven years and has been at the School of Rock since 2003. He wants to be a professional musician and likes getting a taste of what it's like to be on the road, even if it's just for a few days.

The concerts seem to pass quickly. Most of the time is spent traveling, setting up and then packing for the next show. "It's hard for some people, but personally I love it," Emmett said.

In addition to improving their musical skills, the kids credit the School of Rock for sharpening their onstage look. David is letting his hair grow long. Inspired by a trip to a thrift store to look for vintage musical clothing, Emmett has replaced his T-shirts with button-down, petalprint shirts.

"They make me feel like a rock star," he said.

### On Jessi Colter's 'Ashes' are embers of hope

For more than three decades, Jessi Colter was to Waylon Jennings as June Carter was to Johnny Cash: an artist who subordinated her own career to that of a legendary spouse, who raised a child (only son Shooter Jennings), who nursed her partner through drug and health problems, and who re-

mained a part of husthe band's stage show but a l s o seemed at peace with the low profile all of those other responsibilities entailed.

Colter was exactly what Jennings described in the hit song he wrote about her: a "Good Hearted Woman.'

'Out of the Ashes,' Colter's first solo album since 1985, comes three years after Jennings, her husband of 32 years, died of complications from diabetes. It's a Saturday-night, Sunday-morning kind of record, a meeting of barroom blues, country-rock and gospel regret. 

### 'Goblet of Fire' shines in Harry Potter series

When it comes to films based upon popular literary events and let's be honest, the Harry Potter books have become events in and of themselves - it's often hard to separate the one from the

Even though film is a completely different medium when a movie has been extracted from a hugely popular book, the fans of the latter are going to enter the

theaters with a certain amount of expectation. Rabid fans aside, the best way to approach a film based on another medium is to look at it as a singular event removed from the source material. At least in theory, that

All of which brings us to "Harry Potter and the Goblet of

Fire," the fourth film in the ongoing series. To get the obvious out of the way first, in terms of how it stacks up against the book, sadly I lost interest in the series after Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone (sacrilege to J.K. Rowling fanatics the world over, I know, but truth be known I'm more of a John Grisham man myself), so I have attended each subsequent episode of the Potter films with a clean slate of a mind and have viewed each installment solely on how the most current. adventures of Harry, Ron, and Hermione rank when placed in context with any of the previous endeavors.

From a purely entertainment standpoint the fourth installment of the Harry Potter film franchise may just be the best one yet.

How does it stack up with the last Harry Potter movie? "Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban" is a dark, stylish motion picture. Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire is not as stylish, but is darker.

Unlike the previous installment, this movie focuses primarily on the students, allowing many of the adults little more than walkon cameos. Alan Rickman's Professor Snape, for example, has only a handful of lines and is largely MIA. The PG-13 rating is warranted. This is the movie in

which the series transitions from something for kids to something for teenagers and young adults.

Removing it from the auspices of the book from which it is based upon and viewing it as a film in its own right, Mike Newell and Steve Klove's collaboration is a brisk, darkly-tinged adventure yarn that boosts the action quota considerably and as such becomes a whirlwind blast of post-summer escapism.


This is a film that comes out of the gates with a snort and a bull rush and rarely lets up on the reigns for a second. Unlike the previous two entries, which had me groping at my watch after about an hour into each, Newell's take virtually never stops for air.

The "regulars" are all back — a year older and a little wiser. Harry Potter (Daniel Radcliffe) is having strange dreams and he worries that his arch-enemy, Voldemort (Ralph Fiennes), may be planning a corporeal return. His friend Hermione (Emma Watson) is turning into a beautiful young woman and attracting a fair amount of male attention — a fact that has not escaped the greeneyed notice of Harry's other buddy, Ron (Rupert Grint).

This year, the trio's fourth at Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry, there is to be a "Tri Wizard Tournament." in which champion wizards, one representing each of three different schools, compete against each other for victory.

The champions are Cedric Diggory (Robert Pattinson), Fleur Delacour (Clémence Poésy), and Viktor Krum (Stanislav Ianevski). Unexpectedly, a "wild card" is added: Harry Potter.

The tournament challenges prove to be as potentially deadly as they are difficult, and Harry wonders if there are forces aligned against him in a conspiracy. The sides appear to be clearly defined: Those who stand with Harry - Dumbledore (Michael Gambon), Prof. McGonagall (Maggie Smith), Hagrid (Robbie Coltrane), and the new Defense Against the Dark Arts Teacher. Prof. Moody (Brendan Gleeson) and those who stand against him Prof. Snape (Rickman), Draco and Lucius Malfoy (Tom Felton and Jason Issacs), Wormtail (Tim-



othy Spall), and Barry Crouch Jr. (David Tennant). Yet all may not be as it initially seems.

On the surface Newell seemed like an odd choice to direct one of the Potter projects considering that his two best known — and received - films have been "Donnie Brasco" and "Four Weddings and a Funeral."

Yet if you think about it for a minute you'll realize that choosing Newell was something of a coup. Why? Well, for starters, "Donnie Brasco" is perhaps one of the best modern crime films of the past two decades. And "Four Weddings and a Funeral" is one of the best romantic dramas of the past two decades (I can't believe I just said that).

Both films are worlds apart, but together they touch upon all the same aspects of plot, action, drama, and tension that fill up the storyline to "Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire." Newell seems to have a strong grasp of the characters and the changes they undergo in this installment, which basically showcases the young trio entering puberty and becoming privy to the magical urges of love

and longing.

Poor kids. They have no idea what they're in for.

Surprising, however, is how Newell grasped tightly around the darker thematics of the film's storyline. While he has proven himself in the past to be a deft director in terms of capturing the various nuances of the human emotions, here he tackles evil and dread with a sense of righteous

The movie opens on a brooding note, and while there are moments of light-hearted reprieve sprinkled throughout, for the most part it retains its brooding, malevolent tone and injects a fair amount of creepiness, to boot.

As much as it pains me to admit it, I actually enjoyed this installment in the series. Kudos, Harry.
